Event Profile

The Delhi Policy Group (DPG) and the Japan Institute of International Affairs (JIIA), as mandated anchor institutions, will convene the 5th annual India-Japan Indo-Pacific Forum (8th India-Japan Track 1.5 Dialogue) in New Delhi on November 23, 2022. The objective of this Track 1.5 dialogue, bringing together strategic experts from think tanks and academia with government officials from both sides, is to deepen intellectual exchanges, enhance understanding of each other's perceptions of the rapidly evolving global and regional order, and advance their shared interests in the Indo-Pacific.

Since the last edition of the dialogue held virtually on December 21, 2021 the global environment has significantly deteriorated and the world order is now in major distress. In both Asia and Europe, there is resort to unrestrained power for expansionist and coercive pursuits. The conflict and humanitarian crisis in Ukraine continues, despite efforts by the international community. Tensions over Taiwan are at an all time high. At this juncture, it is of utmost importance to uphold, without exception, a global order based on the UN Charter, international law and respect for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of all states.

As great power rivalries escalate, geopolitical and geo-economic divides are emerging among nations, raising the prospects of a fractured world order. The room for effective and reformed multilateralism has shrunk and global institutions stand further marginalized. There are widespread disruptions across the global economy, with devastating consequences for food and energy security among developing countries.





In this troubled scenario, the relevance of the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership has only increased. The two countries are celebrating the 70th anniversary of diplomatic relations. Bilateral summits have been resumed in March 2022. The security situation surrounding India and Japan has become more challenging, and the 2+2 Dialogue held in September 2022 has underlined the determination of both sides to reinforce security and defence cooperation. There is incremental progress in virtually all areas of bilateral relations, with considerable scope for further enhancement of trade, investment and technological ties to propel India's economic rise. Going forward, greater alignment on regional initiatives can buttress their common pursuit of a Free and Open Indo-Pacific.

The 5th Indo-Pacific Forum will seek to forge a broad understanding on convergent interests and the joint contributions of India and Japan to uphold Indo-Pacific stability, security and prosperity amidst disarray in the rules-based order. The first of its closed sessions will evaluate the impact of the fragmenting global order on their respective national, regional and global policies. The second closed session will identify pathways towards more rapid and sustained progress in diverse areas of bilateral relations. The concluding Live/Public session of the Forum will aim to disseminate to the wider national and regional audiences the commitment of both sides to achieve the full potential of economic, technological, defence and security ties, including through diplomatic coordination on Indo-Pacific issues and the Quad agenda.
