

U.S.-Taliban talks inch America closer to withdrawing from Afghanistan

New air routes opened as Pakistan airspace remains closed

This is a first of its kind movement where an Indian inland waterway is used for connecting two landlocked countries Bhutan and Bangladesh.

Sri Lanka

SOFA would not lead to permanent US presence in SL, PM says

Sri Lanka is negotiating a fresh military cooperation deal with the United States, its Prime Minister announced in parliament, even as the country's president vowed to veto any agreement. PM RenilWickremesinghe said the government was discussing a replacement for the 1995 Status of Forces (SOFA) arrangement that would allow the US military easier access to the strategically placed Indian Ocean Island.

Inside story of how Sri Lanka fell into the ACSA-SOFA trap

This was why there was no news release from the US Embassy in Colombo. Keshap signed on behalf of the US Department of Defence. Even for the US, therefore, the matter was one of utmost secrecy.

India alerts Sri Lanka on boats carrying drugs from Karachi

Sri Lanka to revive visa on arrival for 39 countries except India, China
