

Kulbhushan Jadhav case: India to push for a civilian trial

Taliban wants Japan to serve as a guarantor in US troop pullout

He escaped maximum-security prisons twice in the US and will spend the rest of his life in a U.S. penitentiary.

Mercosur calls for new elections in Venezuela at summit

South American trade bloc Mercosur called for "free, fair and transparent presidential elections, as soon as possible" in Venezuela, at its summit in Argentina. The presidents of the four member countries signed a statement expressing concern "for the grave humanitarian situation and human rights crisis in Venezuela. New presidential elections are a key demand of Venezuela's opposition led by National Assembly leader Juan Guaido.

Accelerating deforestation in Brazil endangers EU trade deal

Threats to Amazon rainforest jeopardise European economic accord with Mercosur, which includes ecological commitments. Deforestation in the Amazon rainforest area of Brazil accelerated with Over 1,000 sq km of the jungle cleared in the first 15 days of July. The parliaments of Ireland and Italy already oppose the deal. Further, EU farmers fear competition from Brazil's powerhouse farm sector - which they argue is subject to less stringent environmental requirements compared to Europe.

<u>Argentina designates Hezbollah as terrorist organisation</u>

Argentina has designated Lebanon's Hezbollah movement as a terrorist organisation and frozen its assets, emerging as the first latin American country to

do so. It accuses the Shia Islamist group of being behind two attacks on its soil. Hezbollah has been engaged in illegal activities between Argentina, Brazil and Paraguay to finance its operations elsewhere.
