He wasn't specific about the tech besides referencing "digital means" similar to those from Taiwan, but Israel's Shin Bet domestic security service confirmed to Reuters that it was looking at wielding its methods.

US-Israeli Group Launches \$21.4 Million Water-energy Initiative

Jordan Bars Entry From Lebanon, West Bank, Israel, Iraq, Egypt Due To <u>Coronavirus</u>

Jordan Tuesday banned travel to Lebanon to protect the kingdom from coronavirus, the health minister said. The government has also banned travel to Syria and from Monday will bar entry to travellers from France, Germany and Spain.
