Abstract

In a major boost to the Indian Air Force's (IAF) surveillance capabilities, India is likely to sign a deal to acquire two additional Israeli-made 'PHALCON' airborne early warning and control system (AWACS) aircrafts. In other developments on the security front, the Pentagon slammed Russian military for "provocative and aggressive behaviour" that injured U.S. troops in Eastern Syria following collusion between armoured vehicles.

In a historic milestone in the Arab-Israeli relations, on August 29, UAE's President abolished the federal law boycotting Israel. Following the Abraham Accord, UAE will also host Senior U.S. Presidential Advisor, Jared Kushner on August 31. U.S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo visited West Asia in a bid to push more Arab countries normalise diplomatic relations with Israel. Commenting on Israel-UAE peace deal, India's External Affairs Minister Dr. S Jaishankar said, "It has opened lots of opportunities at a time when ties between Delhi and Abu Dhabi are also growing".

In terms of energy security, Iraq delivered on its pledge to cut oil supply under the OPEC+ agreement. However, low oil prices and COVID-19 pandemic has led to ten percent increase in Iraq's poverty, while three million people can't buy enough food in the country. In another major development, China reportedly is still buying Iranian crude oil, circumventing U.S. sanctions. Saudi Aramco discovered two new oil and gas fields in the northern region of the Kingdom. In a sign of growing Chinese influence on the region, Chinese firm signed an engineering contract with Oman for the construction of Sultanate's first bitumen refinery with an investment of over USD400 million. However, Saudi Arabia suspended a project to build USD10 billion refinery and petrochemicals complex in China. On the regional economic front, on August 30, Qatar increased minimum wage of its workers by 25 percent to 1,000 Riyals (USD275) a month.

The geopolitical conflict in East Mediterranean shows no signs of abating. On August 26, Greece launched naval exercises with France, Cyprus and Italy amid row with Turkey over exploration of natural gas. Syria witnessed a major countrywide blackout as a result of "terrorist attack on Arab Gas Pipeline". While, Lebanon's President Michel Aoun called for the proclamation of "secular state" in the country; diplomat Mustapha Adib is likely to be Lebanon's next Prime Minister.
