

Abstract

In a concerning development, OPEC+ ignored the calls for increasing the crude production, to prevent spike in the oil prices. The Indian Minister for Petroleum's request for easing the production cuts as rising crude prices were hurting post Covid economic recovery went unheeded. Saudi Arabia advised India to use its crude reserves bought last year when the oil prices were low, to tide over the situation. "India had purchased 16.71 million barrels of crude in Apr-May 2020 to fill its strategic petroleum reserves located at Visakhapatnam, Mangalore and Padur". The escalation of war in Yemen is also playing its part in the rise of oil prices, as Houthi rebels have been targeting the Saudi Aramco facilities.

The Indian External Affairs Minister Dr S. Jaishankar addressing the 'India Maritime Summit' reiterated the strategic importance of 'Chabahar Port' as a "safe, secure, and reliable route to Afghanistan and Central Asia to enhance India's trade and connectivity. Further, the Indian Shipping Minister urged for the inclusion of Chabahar in the 'International North South Transport Corridor project' (INSTC), a 7,200-km-long multi-mode network of ship, rail, and road route for moving freight between 13 Eurasian countries. "India is likely to start full operations at Chabahar Port by May-end", shipping minister added. In a related development, Iran's Minister for Roads has "sought increased Line of Credit from India to complete first phase of the Chabahar port". In an address to Israeli heads of missions in Asia-Pacific region, EAM Dr. Jaishankar urged the Israeli diplomats to "utilise the deep comfort enjoyed by the two-sides to further the 'forward and upward trajectory' in bilateral relations".

On the arms procurement front, the Chinese drone sales are on an upward trajectory in West Asia (Middle East). UAE army plans to purchase Chinese Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV's). These include 10 to 15 Golden Eagle CR500 drones fitted with Red Arrow 12 missiles, and 20 MR40 unmanned aircraft fitted with BBE-2 bombs. These two deals are worth USD9 million and USD7 million respectively.

On the counter-terrorism front, Indian intelligence agencies are keeping an eye on Al-Qaeda linked charity group from Turkey – 'The Foundation for Human Rights and Freedoms and Humanitarian Relief' (IHH) that has reportedly been colluding with 'Islami Sangh Nepal' for providing sanctuary to expand logistical hub for "jihadist networks". "IHH has been named in the UN Security Council documents, for supporting armed terrorist groups in Syria". Meanwhile India has



urged the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) to "objectively investigate the alleged use of 'Chemical Weapons' in Syria, while urging UNSC to remain aware about the potential dangers of weapons of mass destruction (WMD's) falling into the hands of terrorist organizations".

In a historic development, Head of the Catholic Church – 'Pope Francis' visited war-torn Iraq (Ancient City of Ur), the birthplace of Prophet Abraham, the father of Jews, Christians, and Muslims. Pope Francis in his remarks declared, "From this place, where faith was born, from the land of our Father Abraham, let us affirm that God is merciful and that the greatest blasphemy is to profane his name by hating our brothers and sisters. Hostility, extremism and violence are not born of a religious heart: they are betrayals of religion". In the holy city of Najaf, Pope Francis met Iraq's top Shiite cleric Ayatollah Ali al-Sistani, spiritual leader of most of the world's Shiite Muslims to urge Iraqis to embrace countries beleaguered Christians.

On the US-Iran relations, Washington reiterated its strong interest in re-engaging Iran over Tehran's nuclear program after European countries dropped plans to censure Iran at the IAEA, maintaining that "Iran has accepted to discuss the impending issues including the presence of uranium particles, the status of nuclear sites and the 2015 nuclear deal restrictions with the IAEA". IAEA Director General expects to get a better understanding on the status of Iranian nuclear sites by April. Further, Iran's Foreign Minister Zarif reiterated his countries commitment to take steps to live up to measures in the 2015 'JCPoA' as soon as the US lifts sanctions on Iran. Meanwhile rocket attacks on the US troops continued in Iraq with the latest attack targeting the 'Ayn Al Asad Air Base' in country's western Anbar Province.

In a related development, Prime Minister Netanyahu of Israel, spoke with US Vice President Kamala Harris stressing that, "Israel will not allow Iran to obtain nuclear weapons". While the Israeli Defence Minister claimed that, "Israel has drawn up a list of Iranian targets to strike if Tehran shows signs of nuclear escalation". In another development concerning Israel, with far reaching consequences, the International Criminal Court (ICC) has launched war crimes probe into alleged Israeli crimes in the Palestinian territories including the West Bank, Gaza strip, and East Jerusalem. Biden administration has opposed the ICC's decision, while reiterating strong commitment to Israel's security.
