

Abstract

In a major success for India's vaccine diplomacy, 360,000 Made-in-India coronavirus vaccines have arrived in Yemen, hailed as a "game changer" and "milestone" in the fight against the pandemic by the UN official. In another development, India and Bahrain reviewed their bilateral cooperation in oil and gas, trade and investment, defence, healthcare and renewables ahead of the visit of Bahraini Foreign Minister to New Delhi on April 07 for the 'High Joint Commission' meeting.

On the energy front, India has reportedly asked its oil refiners to review their contracts with Saudi Arabia that are "loaded against the buyer". This comes amid New Delhi's frustration with the OPEC+ decision to keep the production cuts steady even as the rising crude prices were undermining post-Covid economic recovery in countries like India. In a related development, the United States has asked OPEC to "keep oil prices affordable for consumers" ahead of the next OPEC+ meeting scheduled to be held on April 08.

The Suez Canal reopened after a weeklong blockage caused by a stranded container on March 23. The blockage caused an estimated cumulative loss of USD54 billion causing serious disruption to the global maritime trade. Concerned with the incident, Egypt is considering widening the Suez Canal to prevent future disruptions to this all important navigation channel.

On the security front, world powers are planning to launch talks in Vienna on reviving the 2015 nuclear deal (JCPOA). Iran has however ruled out any direct or indirect talks with the United States and has rejected the US proposal to halt Uranium enrichment to 20 percent to create conditions for gradually lifting sanctions imposed by the Trump administration. In an important development, the Biden administration has lifted sanctions imposed on ICC prosecutor by the Trump administration, imposed last year after the ICC prosecutors launched an investigation into alleged war crimes by the US military personnel in Afghanistan. Further, the US Department of State in its human rights report described the 'West Bank' and 'Gaza' as "occupied" by Israel. Importantly, this report noted 2019 US recognition of the 'Golan Heights' (Syrian territory till the 1967 Arab-Israeli War) as Israeli territory, as well as the 2017 US recognition of 'Jerusalem' as Israel's capital. It must be noted that, "this report is not meant to convey a position on any final status issues, including on borders".



In a security related development, the United States has shifted some of its major military assets from Saudi Arabia including at least one Patriot anti-missile system, an aircraft carrier, and surveillance systems. "The Pentagon in February had announced that it would conduct a global force posture review of the US military's footprint, resources, strategy, and missions at the directive of President Joe Biden". Meanwhile Saudi Arabia's Foreign Minister stated that, normalising relations with Israel would bring "tremendous benefits" to the Middle East, but this depends on peace between the Israelis and Palestinians.

In a major development, Jordan has placed former Crown Prince Hamzah bin Al Hussein and several other high-profile leaders under house arrest amid links to an alleged coup plot against the Kingdom. In light of this, the United States and GCC have shown their full support to Jordan's King Abdullah to preserve the security and stability of the Kingdom.

Israel
