Abstract

In a major to boost to the already strong India-United Arab Emirates strategic partnership, Indian External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar met UAE's Foreign Minister Sheikh Abdullah in Abu Dhabi on April 18. The two leaders discussed "bilateral cooperation with emphasis on post-COVID economic recovery". Additionally, the UAE's Ambassador to the United States confirmed that, "the Gulf state is mediating between India and Pakistan to help both countries reach a healthy and functional relationship". Simultaneous presence of Pakistani Foreign Minister in UAE, during Dr Jaishankar's visit raised speculations of further attempts at mediating, but the two ministers did not meet.

In terms of trade, UAE has reached out to New Delhi seeking revival of talks on the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) Free Trade Agreement. In another development, 'Invest in Turkey' hoardings have appeared in Srinagar's (Indian Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir) Lal Chowk; reportedly these hoardings have been placed by New Delhi-based immigration consultancy-Olives & Figs. A senior police official from J&K stated that, "perhaps these hoardings are indications of changing India-Turkey relations, as the hoardings might not have been installed without prior government permission". Srinagar Municipal Corporation did not have any information about these hoardings.

Considering the growing number of Covid-19 cases in India and subsequent demand to ban commercial export of coronavirus vaccines, the Iranian government has requested India to quickly send 3.75 lakh Covaxin vaccines out of the 5 lakh it had purchased. Meanwhile Israel has lifted the requirement to wear a mask in the country and fully reopened all schools. However, the health authorities have warned Israelis to stay vigilant as Israel has not reached herd immunity. The Indian variant of coronavirus still being a concern.

On the energy front, India hosted 'The Hydrogen Economy-New Delhi Dialogue 2021'. India plans to spend USD200 million in the next 5 to 7 years to promote 'Hydrogen' as a source of clean energy. In light of this, New Delhi has "asked its state-owned oil and gas companies to set up seven hydrogen pilot plants by the end of this financial year". UAE's Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) is also set to explore the potential of Hydrogen market in India. ADNOC's CEO stressed that, "granted Hydrogen is still in its infancy, it could be a game changer and a real opportunity to accelerate the broader energy transition, an opportunity that ADNOC and UAE are well placed to capitalize on".

In light of Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi's recent visit to the Middle East, Chinese analysts have raised the possibility of 'Petroyuan' system that could further internationalise the Chinese currency. "The Petroyuan could gain traction as energy exporters like Russia and Iran, which are subject to the US sanctions, look to limit dollar exposure". However, it remains to be seen if the major petroleum exporting countries would be willing to risk the wrath of the US (Petrodollar) by making such a move. Further, China is hesitant over J-10 fighter aircraft barter deal (weapons for oil) with cash-strapped Iran. Chinese military analysts stressed that, "now is not the time to exchange weapons for oil but believe Beijing is considering the move".

On the United States-Iran relations, in a major development after the last week's sabotage at the Natanz nuclear site, Iran has "vowed to ramp up uranium enrichment up to 60 percent purity". This is a clear breach of the 'Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action' (JCPOA) 2015 that had limited Iran's uranium enrichment to 3.67 percent. It is to be noted that, uranium enrichment up to 90 percent is considered weapons grade. The United States described Iran's move as "provocative" while guestioning its seriousness about the talks in Vienna. On the other hand, Biden administration has reportedly "warned Israel to stop chatter about its alleged involvement in the blast at Natanz, as it is dangerous, detrimental and embarrassing particular as Washington attempts to negotiate a return to the nuclear deal with Tehran". Meanwhile Israel and Saudi Arabia re-iterated their strong determination to stop Iran from building a nuclear weapon. In light of this, Gen. Amos Yedlin, former Israeli Air-Force officer who had played a major role in destroying Iraq and Syria's nuclear plants in 1981 and 2007 highlighted the difficulties Israel could face in attacking the Iranian nuclear sites. Gen. Yadlin said, "Saddam Hussein and Bashar al-Assad were surprised [by the Israeli airstrikes]; Iran has been waiting for this attack for 20 years". "Iran's program is much more fortified and dispersed, while Iraq and Syria's nuclear programs were concentrated in one place", he added.

In first such attack, US military base at Erbil airport in Iraq was attacked with the use of drone. The United Nations Secretary-General's Special Representative for Iraq Jeanine Hennis-Plasschaert warned that "the drone attack at the Global Coalition against Daesh's headquarters at Erbil International Airport was aimed to inflame tensions in the region". Meanwhile as the US declared date for the withdrawal of its troops from Afghanistan, Baghdad has also started pressing Washington to do the same in Iraq in an "attempt to pull the rug from under IranVolume III, Issue 16 | April 19, 2021



backed paramilitaries and secure some modicum of calm before October's parliamentary elections".

On the arms procurement front, the Biden administration is likely to approve USD23 billion arms sales to the UAE including F-35 stealth aircrafts and the Reaper Drones, as it nears completion of the review of arms deals signed by the Trump administration. However, the fate of arms sales to Saudi Arabia still remains unclear as the Biden administration is in the process of recalibrating relations with Riyadh. After the on-going review, "Biden administration plans to suspend air-to-ground offensive weapons used by fighter aircrafts and drones to Saudi Arabia".

After Natanz Blast, Iran Vows to Ramp Up Uranium Enrichment

Iran warned it would start enriching uranium up to 60 percent purity, two days after an explosion it blamed on Israel hit its key nuclear facility in Natanz. The announcement cast a shadow over ongoing talks in Vienna aimed at salvaging the tattered 2015 nuclear deal between Iran and world powers.

European Powers Warn Iran over 'Dangerous' Uranium Enrichment Move

The United States and the European countries party to the Iran nuclear deal pushed back against Tehran's decision to enrich uranium at 60% purity, with the top U.S. diplomat calling the move "provocative" and questioning Iran's seriousness about talks.
