

Abstract

Over the past few months, India has urged the OPEC (Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries) to ease global output cuts to rein in the surging oil prices. In reply to Indian concerns, Saudi Arabia's Ambassador to India stressed "Riyadh's commitment to meet India's requirements of petroleum products". He also highlighted that, "Saudi Arabia in 2020 made investments worth USD2.81 billion in India and is looking at a greater momentum in bilateral economic ties in areas like petroleum, renewable energy, IT, and artificial intelligence". Further, India continues to receive medical equipment and supplies from West Asia in its fight against the second wave of COVID-19. Saudi Arabia sent 60 tonnes of liquid medical oxygen (LMO), while Turkey delivered 50 tonnes of relief material, including five oxygen generators. Iran delivered 300 ventilators to India.

In the backdrop of the recent Israel-Palestine conflict, the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) adopted a resolution to set up a commission of enquiry into the latest violence in Gaza, and also of abuses in the Palestinian territories and inside Israel. India abstained on this resolution while New Delhi dropped the often used phrase "just Palestinian cause" in its statement at UNHRC.

The war-torn Syria concluded its Presidential election with incumbent President 'Bashar al-Assad' securing a fourth term in office with 95.1 percent votes. In a joint statement, the US, UK, France, Germany, and Italy stressed that, Syrian election was neither "free nor fair". Further, they "denounced the Assad regime's decision to hold an election outside of the framework described in UN Security Council Resolution 2254 and supported the voices of all Syrians, including civil society organisations and the Syrian opposition, who have condemned the electoral process as illegitimate". Meanwhile Iran's Ministry of Interior has confirmed names of seven candidates for the upcoming Presidential election scheduled to be held on June 18. Reportedly, 'Ebrahim Raisi' – the head of Iranian judiciary is most likely to succeed Hassan Rouhani as Iran's next President. The other candidates contesting include Mohsen Rezaei (former head of IRGC), Saeed Jalili (former chief nuclear negotiator), Abdolnaser Hemmati (Central Bank governor), Amirhossein Ghazizadeh-Hashemi (Member of Parliament), Alireza Zakani (Member of Parliament), and Mohsen Mehralizadeh (Former Vice President).

On US-Iran relations, fifth round of talks began in Vienna with the goal of bringing United States back into the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA). To buttress Iranian position, Chinese President Xi Jinping re-iterated Beijing's



support for Iran's "reasonable demands" regarding the nuclear deal. Further, in a boost to Vienna talks, Iran and International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) have agreed to extend the agreement for monitoring Iran's nuclear activities by one month. However, the IAEA has confirmed that, Iran's uranium enrichment is now at the level of "countries making bombs" and Tehran's nuclear programme can no longer be returned to where it stood when the landmark 2015 deal (JCPOA) was signed with P5+1.

In a major development, the US intelligence agencies are showing a growing concern at the sale of F-35 aircrafts to the UAE amid deepening of relations between Abu Dhabi and Beijing. The Biden administration's decision to sell F-35 to the UAE is likely to be influenced by three parameters – maintaining Israel's qualitative military edge, ensuring the non-transfer of F-35 and drone technology to China, and restrictions on the equipment's use in the on-going conflicts in Yemen and Libya.

US Secretary of State Blinken visited the Middle East to shore up the ceasefire between Israel and HAMAS that ended 11 days of bloody violence. Secretary Blinken acknowledged that "any resumption of peace talks between the Israelis and Palestinians remained far off". The US pledged new aid to rebuild the Gaza strip including USD5.5m in disaster relief and nearly USD33m for the UN Palestinian aid agency. "Qatar has also announced USD500 million in support for the reconstruction of Gaza". Meanwhile reports have revealed that, Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), Hamas and Hezbollah set up a joint military operations center in Beirut during 11 days of conflict between HAMAS and Israel.

In a significant development, a diverse group of Israeli political parties opposed to Benjamin Netanyahu forming government have claimed to have the votes to form a unity government in Israel. Reportedly Naftali Bennett and Yair Lapid would share power in a rotation agreement. PM Netanyahu warned that, "the proposed unity government aimed at replacing him would be a danger to the country's security".
