

# **Abstract**

Following disagreements between Saudi Arabia and the UAE and intense negotiations, Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) and their allies have agreed to boost oil production. "OPEC+ alliance will ease its production cuts by 400,000 b/d each month starting August, amounting to a 2 million b/d total increase by the end of 2021". Importantly UAE, Saudi Arabia, Russia, Iraq, and Kuwait's reference oil production level has been boosted beginning May 2022. This is likely to lead to a sizeable jump in OPEC+ crude production in the second half of 2022, with anticipation of full recovery in global oil markets from COVID-19 pandemic. Earlier Indian Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri had spoken with his Saudi counterpart with a view "to bring greater predictability and calm in the global oil markets, as also to see hydrocarbons become more affordable".

Four Kargil-based students arrested in a case related to an explosion near the Israeli embassy in New Delhi were granted bail by a city court. While describing all accused as blemish-free, Metropolitan Magistrate stressed that "nothing incriminating had been put forth by the investigating officer (IO) to suggest that they were linked to any terrorist organisation or constituted a threat to society". In another development, Organisation of the Islamic Cooperation (OIC) "conveyed its desire to dispatch a delegation to Kashmir and called for a possible mediation between India and Pakistan were the countries to request the OIC. In response the Indian Ministry of External Affairs stressed that "OIC should be watchful that their platform is not subverted by... vested interests for comments on internal affairs of India or for anti-India propaganda through biased and one-sided resolutions".

To enhance India's trade engagement in West Asia, New Delhi and UAE have reportedly begun talks on free trade agreement (FTA). In another development of importance, Kuwait has recognized India's Covishield as equivalent of Oxford-AstraZeneca vaccine. Meanwhile, Indians fully vaccinated with Covishield vaccine at least 14 days before their departure would be exempted from mandatory quarantine in Qatar.

As the threat of drone attack increases, Israel Defence Forces (IDF) launched first-of-its-kind international drone exercise 'Blue Guardian' involving Israel, US, UK, France, and Germany. As a part of it, foreign teams will fly Israeli Air Force Hermes-450 unmanned aerial vehicles while "simulating various scenarios, including ground troop support, reconnaissance-intelligence collection missions and cooperation with various forces in the air". Importantly, Israeli Defence Ministry and Elbit Systems demonstrated prototype of "Airborne Laser Interceptor for Drones". A high-power airborne laser system placed on board an aircraft shot



down multiple unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) over the Mediterranean Sea. Israeli Ministry of Defence stressed that "the trial was part of an initial development program that aims to produce a prototype of a solid state, 100-kilowatt laser that can be flown on a Boeing-sized aircraft within three to four years. The system will be able to shoot down large hostile UAVs, smaller drones, rockets, missiles and particularly long-range threats as they travel through the air". Further, it has been revealed that, the "IDF deployed drone swarms (hundreds of drones) in Gaza communicating with each other, to locate targets, direct airstrikes, highlighting advances in artificial intelligence-driven combat (AI War) in Israel's 11-day conflict with Hamas".

An investigation by several media organisation's has concluded that Israeli firm NSO group's military-grade Pegasus spyware was used to track terrorists, criminals, journalists, human rights activists, business executives, and two women close to assassinated Saudi journalist Jamal Khashoggi.

On the US-Iran relations, Iran accused the US and UK of holding prisoner exchange talks "hostage" to the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) after Tehran stressed that Vienna talks should be delayed until after the new Iranian government comes into office in early August. The US State Department Spokesperson described Iranian comments as "an outrageous effort to deflect blame from the current impasse". "We stand ready to return to Vienna to complete work on a mutual return to the JCPOA once Iran has made the necessary decisions", he added.

Further it has come to light, that former Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu had reportedly urged former US President Donald Trump to attack Iran after Trump lost presidential election. General Mark Milley, the then chairman of the US Joint Chiefs of Staff reportedly battled hard to prevent Trump from ordering a strike against Iran as it would have led to an all-out war.

Importance of the Middle East and East Coast of Africa is growing in Chinese strategic calculus. Chinese State Councillor and Foreign Minister Wang Yi visited Syria on July 17 to meet President Bashar al-Assad. Chinese state media described the visit as "underscoring Beijing's independent foreign policy in sharp contrast to the West and sending positive message to the region in countering negative influence of the US". In another important development, Tanzanian government is likely to revive a port project on the East Coast of Africa that was originally planned to be three-way collaboration between China Merchants Holdings, Oman's State General Reserve Fund and the Tanzanian government. This project had stalled due to "Tanzania's frustration over the conditions China had presented,



including a request that Tanzania not question who invests in 'Bagamoyo' once the port was operational".

### IDF Launches First-of-its-kind International Drone Exercise

Private Israeli Spyware Used to Hack Cell Phones of Journalists, Activists Worldwide
