# **Abstract**

As the Islamist militant group Taliban swept through Afghanistan and entered capital Kabul, President Ashraf Ghani fled the country on August 15. Even as India and several other countries reaffirmed their commitment to not recognize government imposed through the use of force, China, Russia, Turkey, and Pakistan are reportedly preparing to accept Taliban's rule in Afghanistan. A number of countries in the region have already evacuated their diplomatic staff from Kabul including Saudi Arabia. However, Chinese and Russian embassies are reportedly planning to stay put in Afghanistan.

According to Russian media reports, Taliban spokesman Suhail Shaheen has assured Moscow that a "policy to ensure safe conditions for the functioning of the Russian and other embassies [is in place] and Taliban maintains good relations with Russia". Underscoring the importance of international mediators in Afghan peace process, Russian foreign minister stressed Moscow's intent to invite India and Iran for expanded Troika (Russia, China and US) meeting. Turkish President Erdogan reiterated Ankara's resolve to "intensify cooperation with Pakistan to stop a potential refugee influx from Afghanistan". Meanwhile, Washington is working on an agreement with Qatar to host around 8000 Afghan refugees who helped the US military during the 20 year 'war on terror' in Afghanistan.

Even as the Biden administration faces severe criticism for hasty unplanned withdrawal, Secretary of State Blinken stressed that Afghanistan exit is not hasty stressing "this is manifestly not Saigon" [Vietnam withdrawal].

In a major sign of India's deepening defence and security relationship with Saudi Arabia, New Delhi and Riyadh held their maiden naval exercise "Al-Mohed Al-Hindi" in Al-Jubail. Further, Israeli Defence Minister and Indian Ambassador to Israel held discussions about "deepening Israel-India defence and industrial ties". As a result, "Hyderabad-based Premier Explosives has emerged as the first private player in India to export rocket motors to Israel".

As regards trade and economy, India continued its agricultural exports to West Asia that included export of five varieties of apple from Himachal Pradesh to Bahrain. With a view to further boost Indian exports, New Delhi is likely to "fast track free trade agreements (FTAs) with at least six nations — including the UAE, UK, Australia, Canada, and the EU, over next few months". In another



development, India's Tata Group is eyeing cities in the Gulf, Egypt, and Turkey for expansion of iconic Taj hotels.

President Biden reportedly plans to overhaul 'US arms export policy' with increased emphasis on human rights. This is likely to impact countries like Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates. It must be noted that, a section of President Biden's Democratic Party is opposed to the use of American weapons in Saudi-led war in Yemen.

On the US-Iran relations, Washington imposed sanctions on Omani national 'Mahmood Rashid Amur Al Habsi' accused of partnering with Iran's Quds Force to "facilitate shipments of Iranian oil to foreign customers, including buyers in East Asia". In another development, Central Intelligence Agency (CIA) chief William Burns visited Israel. During their discussions, the delegation informed their Israeli counterparts that "they do not believe Iran will return to the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action". Israeli PM Bennett is looking for a joint US-Israel strategy on Iran if Vienna talks fail.

US cyber security firm 'fire eye' asserted that, China has carried out widespread cyber espionage campaign in Israel. "The attacks targeted Israeli government institutions, IT service providers and telecommunications firms in multiple, concurrent operations starting in January of 2019".

Amid rising inflation, Biden administration urged 'Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries' (OPEC) to further increase crude production. OPEC's July agreement to boost oil production by 400,000 barrels/day on a monthly basis beginning August is "simply not enough" during the "critical moment in the global recovery", the White House added.
