

Abstract

Continuing the deepening India-United Arab Emirates (UAE) economic partnership, Indian Minister for Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal met UAE's Minister of State for Foreign Trade, Thani bin Ahmed Al Zeyoudi in New Delhi to "formally launch negotiations on the India-UAE Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA)". The two sides aim to conclude 'CEPA' negotiations by December 2021 and sign a formal agreement in March 2022". It is expected that CEPA will "increase bilateral trade in goods to USD 100 billion and in services to USD 15 billion" within five years. In another development, India has emerged as Dubai's second biggest trade partner in the first half of 2021.

Saudi Arabia celebrated its 91st National Day on September 23. Riyadh's Ambassador in New Delhi shed light on Saudi Arabia's 'Vision 2030' creating business opportunities for Kingdom's strategic partners including India in areas consultancy services, such as "management, construction telecommunications, information technology, software development, pharmaceuticals and more". Saudi Arabia "issued 44 new licenses for Indian investments" in 2020; while, it "invested USD 2.81 billion in areas of renewable energy, petrochemicals, agriculture, health, and technology" in India.

At the 76th session of the UN General Assembly (UNGA), Turkish President Erdogan reiterated Ankara's stance in "favour of resolving the Kashmir issue through dialogue between the parties and within the framework of relevant UN resolutions". In an apparent rebuke to President Erdogan's assertions, Indian External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar emphasised the importance of "adhering to the relevant UN Security Council resolutions in respect of Cyprus in a meeting with his Cypriot counterpart".

On the sidelines of UNGA, Foreign Ministers of Iran and India held discussions on the necessity of an inclusive government in Taliban led Afghanistan; without naming Pakistan, New Delhi and Tehran chided foreign interference in Afghanistan. In a move aimed at getting international recognition, the Taliban is eyeing right to represent Afghanistan at the UN and has written a letter to the UNGA seeking to address world leaders in the on-going session. In line with this, Qatar's Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani urged the international community [UNGA] "not to boycott the Taliban" and stressed on the "necessity of continuing dialogue, as boycott only leads to polarisation... whereas dialogue could bring in positive results", he added.



Continuing India's growing defence outreach in West Asia, Indian Navy Chief Admiral Karambir Singh arrived in Oman for a three-day visit beginning September 27. The visit aims to "consolidate bilateral defence relations with Oman and explore new avenues for defence cooperation".

On the US-Iran relations, President Biden reiterated Washington's willingness to return to full compliance with the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPoA) only if Iran does the same. US and the European Union (EU) have voiced their frustration over the new Iranian government showing no indication of returning to Vienna talks. Meanwhile, Saudi Arabia's King Salman voiced Riyadh's support to efforts preventing Iran from obtaining nuclear weapons. On his part, Iranian President Raisi "called for an end to US sanctions against his country, describing them as method of waging war". Importantly, President Raisi declared that "nukes have no place in our [Iranian] defence doctrine and deterrence policy". Amidst this, Iran denied International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) inspectors access to 'Karaj' centrifuge assembly site, a move violating September 12 agreement to allow inspectors to service the surveillance equipment.

In a resounding statement of support for Israel, US House of Representatives passed a bill to provide USD 1 billion to replenish Israel's 'Iron Dome Missile Defence System' with 420 votes in favour and 9 opposed. A small section of the Democratic Party opposed this bill. Israeli Prime Minister Bennett described passing of the bill as an "important moment of truth, where the representatives of the American People overwhelmingly supported Israel", he added.

Continuing efforts to expand the 'Abraham Accords' and normalisation of relations with Israel, New York-based Center for Peace Communications (CPC) had organized a conference in Iraq's Kurdistan region attended by 300 leaders. In sharp opposition of this, Baghdad issued arrest warrants against those who attended the conference.

In a sign of Moscow's deepening defence relationship with the Gulf countries, Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov held discussions with the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC). The two sides discussed "topical Middle Eastern issues" and "Russia's updated concept of collective security in the Persian Gulf zone". On the arms procurement, despite US sanctions, Turkey could buy more Russian S-400 missile defence systems.

In another development, reportedly Russia has asked Israel to push US on holding trilateral talks on the on-going conflict in Syria. Jordanian Foreign Minister has

also urged "US and Russia to hold dialogue as that is the only way through which the Syrian issue can be resolved". Meanwhile, UN Human Rights Office revealed that "at least 350,209 people have been killed in Syria's 10-year war".
