Abstract

Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, issued a special video message marking 30 years of diplomatic relations with Israel. Underscoring that the age-old partnership has played a crucial role in the growth stories of the two nations, PM Modi called for setting new goals and achieving new milestones in the coming decades. On his part, Israeli PM, Naftali Bennett, lauded the "Gehri Dosti" (deep friendship) between the two countries while highlighting opportunities for "endless collaboration" in several areas including defence and economic cooperation.

India and Central Asian countries have decided to form a joint working group on Iran's 'Chabahar Port', to enhance the connectivity and free movement of goods and services. To bypass Pakistan, a direct container shipping route has been established between Chabahar and two Western Indian ports of Nhava Sheva and Kandla.

Amidst growing Chinese forays in the Indian Ocean, with a view to bolstering military presence, India will host a series of top security officials from Oman including its Navy Chief, Defence Secretary, and other important military delegates in February 2022.

In a disturbing development, Indian security officials believe Turkey is emerging as the 'New Dubai' for anti-India operations.

In a major boost to the Start-up ecosystem, India and UAE launched USD 150 million Venture Capital (VC) fund aiming to create 10 start-up unicorns by 2025.

As regards Vienna talks on the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPoA) aimed at curbing Iran's nuclear program, "differences have emerged in the US negotiating team over their approach toward Tehran". Richard Nephew, Deputy Envoy for Iran, has resigned after advocating a tougher approach in talks. Underscoring the intense nature of negotiations held, Western diplomats have stressed that "everyone knows that we have reached the final stage of negotiations, what is now required is political decisions". Importantly, Brett McGurk, the White House's National Security Council Middle East Coordinator said that "we're in the ballpark of a possible deal... [but] there's also a very real chance that these talks could collapse very soon". Based on open-source intelligence, it appears that a major sticking point toward reaching an agreement is Iran's insistence on "US guarantees that its next President will not withdraw from the JCPoA, which is supposed to last until the end of 2030".



As the Houthi rebels continue their attacks on UAE, Abu Dhabi has reportedly asked Israel about the possibility of acquiring the 'Iron Dome Missile Defence System' (Rafael) which is effective against short-range rockets. Meanwhile, Israeli President, Isaac Herzog, arrived in UAE on January 30 for a landmark visit further strengthening the bilateral relations.

In a boost to Saudi Arabia-China defence cooperation, the Chinese Defence Minister and Saudi Deputy Defence Minister pledged to push forward "practical cooperation strengthening solidarity" between the two armies. Importantly, without any reference to the US, Beijing called for "joint opposition to hegemonic and bullying practices, to safeguard the interests of developing countries". In another development, China has reportedly "offloaded four million barrels of Iranian crude into the state reserve in the southern port city of Zhanjiang".

With regards to developments in Afghanistan, Qatar, Turkey and the Taliban have agreed on "several key issues" to operate Kabul's Hamid Karzai International Airport.

Iraq

Rockets Hit Baghdad Airport Compound Near US Airbase

At least three rockets have landed in the Baghdad International Airport compound and near an adjacent US airbase, damaging one disused civilian aeroplane, Iraqi police sources said.



Iran

India-Central Asian Region To Form Joint Working Group on Chabahar Port

India and the Central Asian states have put Iran's Chabahar Port as the centrepiece of connectivity between South Asia's biggest market and the landlocked and resource rich region while cautioning against connectivity initiatives which were not transparent in nature.

To Bypass Pak, India, Iran Launch 3rd Shipping Route to Chabahar

A direct container shipping route has been established between Iran's southeastern port of Chabahar and two Western Indian ports of Nhava Sheva and Kandla. The first container service from this route will enter Iran's Shahid Beheshti port on February 16, Deputy Head of Iran's Ports and Maritime Organisation (PMO) Jalil Eslami has said.

China Puts 4m Barrels of Iranian Oil Into State Reserves

China has offloaded nearly four million barrels of Iranian crude oil into state reserve tanks in the southern port city of Zhanjiang over the past few weeks, a trade source and ship tracking specialist Vortexa Analytics said.
