Abstract

Continuing the deepening India-Saudi Arabia strategic partnership, External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar met Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman in Jeddah on September 11. Dr. Jaishankar conveyed the greetings of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and appraised the Saudi Crown Prince of the progress made in bilateral ties. Earlier, Dr. Jaishankar co-chaired the Political, Security, Social, and Cultural Committee of the India-Saudi Partnership Council with his counterpart Faisal bin Farhan. The two leaders discussed contemporary global political and economic concerns and agreed to work closely in G20 and other multilateral organisations for "shared growth, prosperity, stability, security, and development". Further, India signed an MoU with the 'Gulf Cooperation Council' (GCC) on the mechanism of consultations between the two sides.

Amidst India's push for free trade agreements (FTA) with like-minded partners, Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal stressed that "New Delhi will not sign an FTA with Israel until it gets a good agreement that is reciprocally beneficial". Meanwhile, even as US-China relations remain strained, Israel is reportedly in the final stages of signing an FTA with China by the end of 2022.

As Iran continues to insist on ending the IAEA probe into uranium traces found at undeclared nuclear sites in the country, Germany, France, and Britain (E3) expressed "serious doubts" about Tehran's intentions in the nuclear talks. Iran rejected the E3 statement as "unconstructive and ill-considered" and called upon them to stop following Israel's lead in JCPOA talks. In the backdrop of these developments, EU's Foreign Policy Chief Josep Borrell is "less optimistic" about the revival of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA). Open-source intelligence reports also point to the US indicating to Israel that a "nuclear deal with Iran is off the table for the time being", at least until after US mid-term elections slated for November. Israel's Knesset (parliamentary) election is also scheduled to be held on November 1.

Adding to the existing US-Iran tensions, Washington has imposed new sanctions on Iran's Ministry of Intelligence and Security for alleged "malign cyber activities" targeting Albania's government websites. In response to these cyberattacks, Albania has cut diplomatic relations with Iran. Meanwhile, IRGC Navy unveiled the 'Shahid Soleimani Warship' that Tehran believes will enable its Navy to establish a strong presence on the high seas.



Highlighting Iran's growing proximity with China and Russia, Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi is scheduled to attend the 'Shanghai Cooperation Organisation's (SCO) Summit in Uzbekistan on September 16-17. SCO is also likely to grant dialogue partner status to Egypt, Qatar, and Saudi Arabia.

Amidst fears of global economic slowdown, with a view to bolstering oil prices, OPEC+ has decided to cut crude production by 100,000 barrels per day from October 2022. Crude prices continue to hover around USD 90 per barrel. In an important development, even as the G7 remains firm on imposing a "price cap" on Russian crude exports, India maintained that it will support the US-proposed price cap only if crude supplies from Iran and Venezuela are assured. Russia, on the other hand, has offered further discounts on its crude to India, provided New Delhi opposes the price cap.

Underscoring the deepening of bonds between China and the Arab countries, the first China-Arab Summit is likely to be held in Saudi Arabia in December 2022.
