During his <u>visit to Qatar</u> from October 31 to November 1, Prime Minister Shabaz Sharif met with Qatari emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, and Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani. On October 29-30, Prime Minister Sharif was <u>in Riyadh</u> to participate in the Future Investment Initiative (FII). Following visits, Prime Minister Sharif announced to cabinet members on October 4 that Qatar and Azerbaijan have committed to <u>investing \$5 billion in Pakistan</u>. A Qatari business delegation is scheduled to arrive shortly. The Minister for Investment of Saudi Arabia, Sheikh Khalid Bin Abdul Aziz Al Faleh, stated that the <u>27 MoUs</u> signed during his visit to Pakistan in October have increased to 34, with five of them currently operational.

The government led by PMLN in Pakistan is persistently pushing bills through the National Assembly regarding judicial reforms and other matters. The government approved six bills on November 4, which aimed to prolong the terms of the heads of the nation's three armed forces and boost the quantity of judges in higher courts. These bills were swiftly passed by the National Assembly in under 24 minutes and subsequently by the Senate in a mere 16 minutes.

According to a Taliban government minister, Afghan women are <u>prohibited</u> <u>from reciting</u> the Quran or praying loudly in the presence of other women. Women are now facing a new restriction under morality laws that forbid them from speaking loudly or uncovering their faces outside of their homes. They are already excluded from education after sixth grade, many public spaces and most jobs.

A formal invitation has been sent by China to Prime Minister KP Sharma Oli for an <u>official visit</u> set to take place from December 2 to 6. The invitation from Chinese Premier Li Qiang was given by Chinese Ambassador to Nepal Chen Song on October 5. During the visit, the primary focus could be on converting the loan for the Pokhara International Airport into a grant, signing the implementation plan for the Belt and Road Initiative, initiating new projects under the BRI framework, and accelerating the implementation of prior agreements between the two countries.

The Foreign Minister of Thailand, Maris Sangiampongsa, made an <u>official visit</u> to <u>New Delhi</u>, India from October 31- November 3, 2024. During his visit, he held a bilateral meeting with Dr. S Jaishankar, Minister of External Affairs of India, and discussed <u>enhancing cooperation</u> in areas like the defence industry. The two ministers also emphasised the roles of Thailand and India in driving forward multilateral frameworks, particularly BIMSTEC and Mekong-Ganga Cooperation (MGC). They agreed to work together to tackle issues such as transnational crime, human trafficking, natural disasters, and enhancing connectivity within the region.

Indonesia and Russia commenced their <u>first joint military training drills</u> in the Java Sea on November 4. The drills will end on November 8 and will be participated by four Russian warships. The Indonesian navy commander Denih Hendrata stated that "Russian warships came from afar to Indonesia and conducted joint exercises for the first time that seek to improve diplomatic relations between Indonesia and Russia, especially the navies".

Myanmar junta chief <u>Min Aung Hlaing commenced his visit to China</u> on November 5, his first reported visit to the country since 2021. During <u>his visit</u>, he will be participating in the Greater Mekong Subregion Summit of Leaders, a meeting held every three years involving China, Laos, Cambodia, Thailand and Vietnam, in the city of Kunming on November 6. He will also be attending the Ayeyawady-Chao Phraya-Mekong Economic Co-operation Strategy (ACMECS) and join a meeting with Cambodia, Laos and Vietnam on November 6 and 7 in Kunming, the state media reported. The statement further added that "he will have meetings and discussions with authorities from China and will work on enhancing the bilateral relationship, economic and development in several sectors".

On <u>November 4</u>, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi and Takeo Akiba, Secretary General of Japan's National Security Secretariat, held consultations under the China-Japan high-level political dialogue mechanism in Beijing. The two sides reiterated that they would abide by the principles and consensus set out in the four political documents between China and Japan and commit to comprehensively advancing the strategic relationship of mutual benefit between the two sides, reaching agreement to maintain high-level intercourse, dialogue and exchanges in various fields, and send more positive signals to the outside world. They also discussed a <u>possible summit</u> between Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba and Chinese President Xi Jinping.

On <u>November 1</u>, Japan and the European Union announced a security and defence partnership, as they seek to step up military ties amid growing tensions with China, North Korea and Russia. The agreement is the first that the EU has concluded with an Asia Pacific country. Their talks came <u>a day after North Korea test-fired</u> what is believed to be a new type of ICBM-class ballistic missile. Borrell and Iwaya also shared "grave concern" about Russia's deepening military cooperation with North Korea, including the North's troop deployment to Russia and arms transfers between the two countries, according to an EU statement.

During his visit to Saudi Arabia, India's Minister of Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal co-chaired the 2nd Ministerial <u>Meeting of the Economy and</u> <u>Investment Committee</u> under Saudi Arabia-India Strategic Partnership Council (SPC) alongside Saudi Energy Minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman on October 30. The two sides noted deepening of the bilateral economic partnership and deliberated on ways to enhance trade and investment. India and Saudi Arabia are exploring emerging sectors for collaboration, including fintech, new technologies, energy efficiency, clean hydrogen, textiles, and mining. Minister Goyal, speaking at the 'Future Investment Initiative' (FII) in Riyadh, <u>encouraged global investors to invest in India</u>.

On October 5, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu <u>removed Yoav</u> <u>Gallant as Defence Minister</u> citing disagreements and lack of mutual trust. Israel Katz will replace Gallant as Defence Minister, while Gideon Sa'ar will become the new Foreign Minister of Israel. Meanwhile, the Supreme Leader of Iran, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei warned Israel and the US of a <u>"crushing response"</u> to the recent attack on Iran or its allies. The US Central Command (CENTCOM) deployed <u>B-52 Stratofortress Strategic Bombers</u> to the Middle East in response to the Iranian threat.

Russia's Soyuz rocket successfully launched two Iranian satellites (Kowsar and Hodhod) into orbit on October 5, continuing the deepening of the <u>strategic</u> <u>partnership between Russia and Iran</u>. Earlier, the US-led West had accused Iran of supplying Russia with drones for use in Ukraine.

On November 5, Kazakhstan President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev and French President Emmanuel Macron adopted a joint declaration to strengthen their strategic partnership at a joint media briefing. During an expanded-format meeting, <u>Tokayev expressed confidence</u> that the discussions and the Joint Statement being adopted would elevate bilateral relations to a strengthened strategic partnership. The Presidents also discussed areas for further collaboration, including mechanical engineering, transport, logistics, agriculture, energy, industrial cooperation, climate, digital development and healthcare, with a focus on enhancing cultural and humanitarian ties.

On November 4, during a <u>working visit to China</u>, Prime Minister of the Republic of Kazakhstan Olzhas Bektenov attended the Kazakh-Chinese investment roundtable and met the Premier of the State Council of the PRC Li Qiang. Bektenov oversaw the signing of eight commercial agreements between Kazkah and Chinese companies worth \$2.5 billion. Five of the agreements involved a company named Qarmet JSC. Although the deals were branded as commercial, there's considerable <u>state involvement</u> given that Qarmet JSC is owned by a state-owned private equity fund, the Qazaqstan Investment Corporation (QIC).

On <u>November 1</u>, Tajikistan's Ministry of Finance <u>signed a grant</u> agreement worth \$86.6 million with the Asian Development Bank (ADB) for a "Green Corridor Demonstration Project". This project aims to reconstruct 49 kilometres of Tajikistan's Dangara-Gulistan highway, expand it to four lanes with a "Green Road" element, add 48.8 kilometres of bicycle lanes, and build two charging roads. The AIIB <u>has approved</u> a \$75.5 million loan for Tajikistan to build a 920meter bridge, connecting 350,000 people in the northeast to Dushanbe and regional towns and the border of Kyrgyzstan.

Indian Ocean Region

On October 31, 2024, the Indian Navy's frontline stealth frigate, INS Talwar <u>conducted</u> a Maritime Partnership Exercise with the French Navy's ship FS Floreal. This exercise took place in the Indian Ocean and included various manoeuvres as well as helicopter flying exercises to enhance interoperability between the two naval forces. INS Talwar <u>arrived</u> at La Réunion on October 27, 2024, as part of its ongoing deployment in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR).

The 3rd edition of MAHASAGAR, a high-level <u>virtual interaction</u> hosted by the Indian Navy, was held on November 5, 2024. Admiral Dinesh K. Tripathi, the Chief of Naval Staff (CNS), engaged with leaders from various navies and maritime agencies across the Indian Ocean Region (IOR), including representatives from Bangladesh, Comoros, Kenya, Madagascar, Maldives, Mauritius, Mozambique, Seychelles, Sri Lanka, and Tanzania. The discussions were aligned with the Government of India's vision of SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region), focusing on enhancing maritime security through potential avenues for training cooperation.

Saudi Arabian telecommunications company Mobily has <u>collaborated</u> with Telecom Egypt to launch the first submarine cable connecting Saudi Arabia and Egypt through the Red Sea. Fully owned by Mobily, this cable is intended to improve internet connectivity and address the rising demand for digital services in both nations. It will land at two key sites—Sharm El Sheikh in Egypt and Duba in Saudi Arabia—enhancing connectivity between the Arabian Gulf and surrounding regions while providing access to various international networks. This announcement comes at a time of increased tensions in the Red Sea, where recent activities have raised concerns regarding the security of undersea cables.
