

Afghanistan

Taliban agree on partial presence of US forces in Afghanistan: former general

Afghan Taliban have agreed on partial presence of American Forces in Afghanistan however, the power sharing formula between the Afghan stakeholders is yet to be decided which is expected to be finalized by January next year, claims Pakistan's former secretary defence Lt Gen (retd) Asif Yasin Malik.

Eight killed in blast near Kabul University

Eight people were killed and dozens more wounded on July 19 when a bomb detonated near a major university in Kabul while students were waiting to take an examination.

No change in US commitment, Pompeo tells Ghani

Bangladesh to receive five surplus UK C-130J airlifters by end of year

The 'short-bodied' C-130Js (designated C5 in Royal Air Force [RAF] service) were ordered in two batches of two and three aircraft in 2018 and earlier in 2019. The deals were initially revealed via maintenance contracts announced by Marshall Aerospace and Defence Group (ADG).

Bangladesh Home Minister to visit India on August 7

Bangladesh Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan will visit India on August 7 during which he will hold bilateral talks with Home Minister Amit Shah, who is expected to flag issues like illegal immigration and anti-terror cooperation, officials said.

New Bangladesh sub base could revive India tensions

PM to Bangladeshi envoys: Pursue political, economic diplomacy together

Nissan to slash 10% of global workforce after worse-than-expected 99% profit plunge

A Russian military aircraft intruded into South Korea's airspace above the East Sea twice on July 23, prompting Air Force fighter jets to fire warning shots in response. Later South Korea and Russia held a working-level meeting in Seoul to solve the matter.

Defense ministry dismisses Japan's claim over Dokdo, vows stern response

South Korea's defense ministry dismissed Japan's renewed territorial claim to Dokdo amid military tensions over a Russian warplane's violation of its airspace near the easternmost islets in the East Sea.

North Korea fires 2 short-range missiles into East Sea

North Korea launched two short-range missiles on July 25 while North Korean military was conducting summer training.

Kim warns S. Korea: 'No more weapons development, military drills'

North Korea announced On July 26 that it had tested a "new-type tactical guided weapon" that was meant to be a "solemn warning" about South Korean weapons development and its rival's plans to hold military exercises.

Southeast Asia

Work resumes on Malaysia's East Coast Rail Link

Malaysia relaunched its East Coast Rail Link (ECRL), after a year-long suspension and following a deal to slash costs. A supplementary agreement on the financing for the ECRL will be signed (with China's Exim Bank) soon to finance 85 per cent of the project. As the cost of the project has been trimmed to RM44 billion (S\$14.6 billion), the government will pay less on interest.

<u>Vietnam demands 'immediate withdrawal' of China ship in disputed sea</u>

Vietnam on July 25 called for the "immediate withdrawal" of a Chinese ship in the South China Sea, as the stand-off over the disputed waters intensified. Beijing last week issued a new call for Hanoi to respect its claims to the resource-rich region - which have historically been contested by Vietnam as well as Taiwan, the Philippines, Malaysia and Brunei.

Cambodia denies 'secret deal' allowing Chinese forces to be stationed at naval base on Gulf of Thailand

China will be able to place armed forces at a Cambodian naval base under a secret agreement the two nations have reached, The Wall Street Journal reported on July 21, although Cambodian officials denied such a deal had been struck. The agreement which gives China exclusive access to part of Cambodia's Ream Naval Base on the Gulf of Thailand is not made public yet.

<u>Duterte says he allows Chinese vessels to fish in Philippine waters to prevent war</u> July 22, 2019, SCMP

Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte on July 22 insisted the West Philippine Sea belonged to his country, but defended his agreement with Chinese President Xi Jinping to allow Chinese fishermen to operate in the area, saying it was not a constitutional violation. Further he said this agreement would ensure there would be no war in the disputed South China Sea, where Manila and Beijing have overlapping claims.

Four dead in rebel attack on Thai army base

Four people were killed in attack by Muslim insurgents on a military outpost in Thailand on July 24. The attack comes as anger snowballs over the case of a Muslim rebel suspect who was left in a critical condition after spending several hours in army interrogation unit.

Kyrgyzstan: Embattled ex-president flies to Russia

Kyrgyzstan's former president Almazbek Atambayev left the country for Russia, and has, by doing so, put a mounting political crisis on hold for now. Police had summoned Atambayev for questioning in connection with the case of a crime boss who was released from prison in 2013 before serving his full sentence. Lawmakers contended that the release was effected at his request.

Heads of Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan mull topical political issues

Uzbek President Shavkat Mirziyoyev and Turkmen President Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov exchanged views on issues of the bilateral agenda, international and regional policy, with reference to the press service of the president of Uzbekistan. They noted the consistent strengthening of strategic partnership and multi-faceted cooperation between the two fraternal countries.

<u>Police, Residents Clash In Kyrgyzstan Following Deadly Incident On Tajik Border</u> July 24, 2019, RFE/RL

Police in Kyrgyzstan's southern Batken region on the border with Tajikistan say three officers have been injured in clashes with local residents as officials meet to ease tensions after a deadly incident in the area between Kyrgyz and Tajik nationals. The clashes erupted after police tried to stop local efforts to block a road connecting the Kyrgyz village of Ak-Sai with the Tajik exclave of Vorukh.

West Asia

Iraq seeks Iranian assistance to curb militias' reign

July 24, 2019, Al Monitor

Iraqi Prime Minister Adel Abdul Mahdi visited Tehran with a high-ranking delegation including the head of the Popular Mobilization Units. He met with President Hassan Rouhani and discussed the PMU dossier and the impact of Iran-US tensions on Iraq. Rouhani reassured Abdul Mahdi that Iraq would be kept at a distance from the current tension, and that Iran would assist Iraq in bringing all PMU factions under state control.

Iran warns against international naval coalition in the Gulf

Senior Iranian officials have warned against any attempt to form an international coalition to protect Gulf shipping, with Iran's first vice president saying the move will only bring insecurity to the region. This comes after Italy, Denmark, the Netherlands and France backed the UK's proposal for a European naval force after Iran seized a British-flagged tanker in the Strait of Hormuz.

Syria state media says possible Israeli attack in country's south

July 24, 2019, Al Jazeera

Syria's state media said an Israeli missile attack had targeted the country's southern province of Daraa, but reported no casualties. State news agency SANA said that the "Israeli aggression" struck Tal al-Hara hill, home to Syrian army posts, adding that it only caused material damage. No details were shared about the attack which occurred a month after Israel had targeted the same area.

Iran Offers to Return to Nuclear Deal Even if U.S. Doesn't

July 25, 2019, The Jerusalem Post

Hassan Rouhani told Emmanuel Macron that Iran is ready to return to its commitments of the 2015 nuclear deal if the US dials back sanctions, even without returning to the JCPOA. Iran's Deputy Foreign Minister conveyed the offer to Macron as an alternative to the "freeze-for-freeze" plan proposed by him. In Macron's plan, Iran would stop increasing its nuclear activities and the US would hold sanctions at the current level to allow for dialogue to resume.

Kuwaiti, Saudi officials discuss resuming Neutral Zone oil production - KUNA

July 24, 2019, Reuters

Saudi Arabia and Kuwait have discussed resuming oil production in jointly operated fields in the Saudi–Kuwaiti Neutral Zone. Saudi minister of state for energy affairs visited Kuwait to continue to discuss and cooperate on the resumption of oil production in the southern [Neutral Zone] after settling required technical issues from both sides. The Neutral Zone is an area of 5770km² between the two countries' borders that was left undefined when the border was established in 1922.

<u>Istanbul gives Syrians one month to return to provinces in which they are</u> registered

Authorities in Istanbul set a four-week deadline on Monday for Syrians living without approval in Turkey's largest city to return to provinces where they are registered or face forced removal to those regions. Istanbul's new mayor has said that a total of 1 million Syrians live in the city compared with Interior Ministry figures showing 500,000 are registered.

UAE: Arab coalition is preparing for 'next phase in Yemen'

The Saudi-led coalition fighting the Houthi group is preparing for the next phase in the war in Yemen, the UAE's Minister of State for Foreign Affairs announced. He said that the Arab coalition is preparing for the next phase with its political and military tools and is determined to achieve its strategic objectives, adding that the coalition was "repelling attempts to change the balance of power in the region."

Israel: Netanyahu ally accused of filling justice ministry with loyalists

Israel's Justice Minister has been accused of attempting to stack the country's Justice Ministry in favour of Prime Minister Netanyahu, after he fired the ministry's long-time director general in order to install a Netanyahu loyalist. His appointment was seen as politically motivated, given his long-time support of Netanyahu and the fact that, unlike many others, he supports legal changes that would grant acting prime ministers immunity from indictment.

<u>UAE calls on global community to end suffering of Palestinian people</u>

On hard road to reform, Lebanon may need old friends

Heavily indebted Lebanon has passed a budget seen as a "first step" towards fixing its public finances, but still has much to do to steer the country away from crisis. Investors are waiting to see if Gulf Arabs will offer a lifeline and provide some breathing space. Lebanon has one of the world's heaviest public debt burdens, after years of big budget deficits rooted in waste, corruption, and sectarian politics.

Saudi Arabia urges UN to halt 'flagrant Israeli violations'

Saudi Arabia has called on the UN and the global community to halt what it described as continuing flagrant Israeli violations against the Palestinian people. The Kingdom's permanent representative to the UN, told a UN administrative meeting that there could be no justification for continued conflict in light of the willingness of Arab countries to achieve a comprehensive peace with Israel based on the Arab peace initiative and international legitimacy resolutions.

'Rogue state': Bahrain dissidents seek action against government

Leaders of Bahrain's opposition in exile have branded the nation a "rogue state" following revelations that the government may have hired al-Qaeda operatives to murder dissidents. Several opposition figures gathered outside Bahrain's embassy in London following a documentary broadcast on the country's attempts to stifle anti-government organising among its Shia majority.

Turkey's removal from F-35 program not finalised; refund unclear: officials

Turkey's removal from the F-35 jet program is not finalised and Ankara only remains suspended for now, Turkish military officials said, adding that it was

unclear whether Turkey would be refunded for its investments in the project. The U.S. said that it was removing Turkey from the F-35 program, a move long threatened and expected after Ankara began accepting delivery of the advanced Russian S-400 missile defense system.

Yemen accuses UNICEF of funding Houthi summer camps

Yemeni government sources have accused the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) of funding summer sectarian camps for the Houthi movement. The Yemeni National Army's website quoted private sources saying that the UN organisation is behind the funding of summer camps held by the Houthi militias in Sanaa, and the rest of the areas under the movement's control.

President Trump vetoes bills that would have blocked Saudi weapons deal

President Donald Trump vetoed three bills aimed at blocking his administration from selling American-made weapons to Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates. The measures, if undertaken, would have stopped an imminent shipment of 124,000 precision-guided missiles and the fuses to detonate them, among other items.

Sixteen U.S. Marines arrested on suspicion of human trafficking

Sixteen U.S. Marines from the 1st Marine Division at Camp Pendleton, one of the largest Marine Corps bases in the United States, were arrested at their base in Southern California on suspicion of drug-related offenses and the smuggling of undocumented migrants along the U.S.-Mexico border.

US government death penalty move draws sharp criticism

The US federal government's move to resume executions after a 16-year hiatus has drawn sharp criticism from rights groups and leading Democrats. Attorney General William Barr directed the Bureau of Prisons to schedule the execution of five inmates after adopting an updated execution protocol.

Pompeo: Turkey should not make Russian missile defense system 'operational'

Secretary of State Mike Pompeo indicated a softening in US' position on its sanctions for Turkey over its purchase of the S-400 Russian missile defense system, stressing that the country should not make the missile defense system "operational."

FBI Chief Says China Is Trying to 'Steal Their Way' to Dominance

FBI Director Christopher Wray told senators that China is engaging in a sweeping effort to steal its way to economic dominance, with more than 1,000 investigations underway on intellectual property theft "almost all leading back to China." Trump Says He Could Win Afghanistan 'In a Week' But For Deaths

President Donald Trump said he could end America's longest-running war "in a week," except that it would cost too many lives. The U.S. opened a new round of talks with the Taliban last month aimed at ending the war in Afghanistan, which began after the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks. He claimed that U.S.' could win the 'war' in which it is trying to help Afghanistan's government reclaim control of the country from the Taliban and Islamic State, "in a week," but that 10 million people would die.

Trump Enlists Pentagon on Rare-Earth Magnets Amid Chinese Threat

President Donald Trump invoked the 69-year-old Defense Production Act and ordered the U.S. Defense Department to spur the production of super-strong magnets made with rare-earth minerals neodymium and samarium used in consumer electronics, military hardware and medical research, amid concerns China will restrict exports of the products.

Trump administration starts paying \$14.5 billion to farmers hurt by the trade war

Spanish MPs fail to back Sanchez as prime minister in second vote, raises prospect of new elections

Spanish MPs rejected appointing Sanchez as prime minister in the first and the second poll raising the possibility of fresh elections. The Podemos leader, however, would still like to be part of the government and would like to negotiate further.

<u>Italian PM stands by League over Russia funding scandal amid protest by coalition partners</u>

In a bilateral policy initiative, the Spanish government will add \leq 30 million to the EU's \leq 140 million in funds dispersed to Morocco to curb irregular migration. According to figures released by the Spanish Interior Minister, irregular migration from Morocco to Spain fell by 27% in 2018. Spain will also procure equipment worth \leq 26 million that will be donated to Morocco.

Russian diplomats to hold another meeting with crew of detained vessel in North Korea

Diplomats from the Russian Embassy in North Korea will hold another meeting with the crew of the Russian Xiang Hai Lin 8 fishing vessel, which was detained by North Korea last week. The Russian vessel flying the flag of South Korea was detained on July 17 when it was on its way from the South Korean port of Sokcho to the Sea of Japan for crab fishing. According to North Korean authorities, the Russian ship had been detained for the violation of a "50-mile zone."

Russia files note of protest with US Department of State over Kuznetsova's visa issue

The Russian Embassy in the United States has filed a note of protest with the US Department of State demanding to stop a discriminatory policy regarding an issuance of visas for Russian participants of international sports tournaments. It is seen by the Russians as an instrument to obstruct the participation of Russian athletes in major sports tournaments.

Austria's Interior Ministry puts Russian national on wanted list on suspicion of espionage

Austria's Interior Ministry has put Russian national Igor Zaitsev on the international wanted list on the suspicion of spying for Russia. Zaitsev, 65, is suspected of disclosing state secrets, secret espionage activities against Austria, and intentional divulgence of military secrets.

Trans Arctic expedition's final stage starts from Vladivostok

July 25, 2019, TASS

The Trans Arctic 2019 expedition's fourth and final stage began as the Professor Multanovsky left the port of Vladivostok. Prime Minister Dmitry Medvedev ordered to allocate almost 870 million rubles (\$13 million) in 2019 for scientific studies and monitoring of the Arctic environment during the Trans Arctic 2019 expedition.

<u>Crew of detained tanker are returning home from Ukraine – Russian embassy</u>

July 25, 2019, TASS

On July 25, the Ukrainian Security Service (SBU) stated that it had detained Russia's Nika Spirit tanker at the port of Izmail. According to Ukrainian border guards, the Nika Spirit flying the Russian flag was identified through its IMO number as the Neyma tanker that had been used to shut the Kerch Strait. Ten sailors from the Russian tanker detained in Izmail port will be taken to Moscow but the vessel will remain in Ukraine.

Turkey's First S-400 Shipment Arrives as a Second Is Planned for Ankara

July 25, 2019, The Moscow Times

Russia has completed delivery of the first shipment of its S-400 anti-aircraft missile systems to Turkey and a second shipment is now being planned. Turkey began taking delivery of the advanced Russian air defence system earlier this month, prompting the United States to remove Turkey from the F-35 jet programme over security concerns. Washington has offered to sell Ankara its Patriot defense systems, but Turkey has said that the U.S. offer was not as viable as the Russian

German Investment in Russia Reaches Its Highest Level in a Decade

July 25, 2019, The Moscow Times

German corporates invested more than €3.3 billion (\$3.7 billion) in Russia last year, reaching the highest levels in a decade. Bilateral trade between France and Russia also grew by 11% to \$17 billion last year and French firms currently have \$20 billion invested in Russia. While France and Germany remain committed to keeping Russia in check politically, friendly corporate relations between the countries are also being encouraged.

ISS mission blasts off into space from Baikonur Cosmodrome

July 20, 2019, RT

Russia's Soyuz MS-13 rocket took off from the Baikonur Cosmodrome, carrying the three crew members of the Expedition 60-61 to the International Space Station (ISS). The crew will spend 201 day in orbit and return to Earth in February 2020. During that time, they are expected to conduct experiments ranging from testing a natural disaster forecast and relief system, to studying the cosmic radiation levels on board the space station. They will also welcome the first astronaut from the United Arab Emirates in early September.

Global response to Ebola underfunded: UN

Health officials are struggling to contain an Ebola epidemic in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). The World Health Organization (WHO) has declared the outbreak an international public health emergency. However, no measures have been undertaken by the UN Security Council to address the issue.

Ethiopia's water problem: Excessive fluoride treated with bones

July 22, 2019, Al Jazeera

In Ethiopia, 16 million people are being affected by the excessive addition of fluoride to water and toothpaste making it toxic in nature. High fluoride levels in water cause teeth discolouration and in extreme cases, bone decay.

The puzzling 'mass migration' of Ugandans to India

The latest census data of 2011 on migration to India says the number of people from Uganda living in India has risen rapidly, from 694 in 2001 to 151,363 in 2011. The sudden rise in the number of Ugandans in India can be attributed to either a major mistake in the census data or one of the most remarkable unreported sociological phenomenon of the time.

Ecowas countries agree to fight pirates together

July 25, 2019, BBC

West African regional group Ecowas's member states have agreed to join forces to fight against pirates in the Gulf of Guine after 10 Turkish sailors were kidnapped off the coast of Nigeria earlier this month. The Gulf of Guinea is the most dangerous sea in the world for piracy with a total of 73% of all sea kidnappings and 92% of hostage-takings occur in the Gulf of Guinea off Nigeria, Guinea, Togo, Benin and Cameroon, according to the IMB.

Libya boat mishap 'worst Mediterranean tragedy' of 2019 - UNHCR chief

July 25, 2019, Africa News

At least 116 migrants are missing and another 132 were rescued by Libyan coast guards and local fishermen after a wooden boat capsized off the coast of Komas,

a town east of the capital Tripoli. Deaths in the Mediterranean have been a major result of attempts by migrants to cross into Europe usually aboard unfit and overcrowded boats and other means. Libya has been a main transit point for migrants predominantly from sub-Saharan Africa seeking entry into Europe. About 164 people died on the route between Libya and Europe in the first four months of 2019.

Ethiopia-Eritrea peace: Two gold medals, twin pacts and two regions

July 25, 2019, Africa News

Two decades of hostilities ended in July 2018 when Ethiopia and Eritrea agreed to end a military and diplomatic standoff sparked by a border war. Tow deals have been signed in 2019 between the countries to put an end to the conflict. Both countries have been honoured by major players in the Gulf Region who continue to exert diplomatic, economic and security influence on countries in the Horn of Africa region.

DR Congo ethnic violence stopping refugee returns: UN

July 25, 2019, Al Jazeera

Deteriorating security conditions in Congo are interrupting the return process and causing new displacements. Violence and disease have displaced hundreds of thousands of people in the northeast Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and the threat of new clashes is stopping civilians from going back to their homes.

Tanzania grants Chinese firms licences to build gold refineries

July 25, 2019, Al Jazeera

Tanzania awarded licences for the construction of a mineral smeltery and two gold refineries to Chinese firms, as part of government efforts to generate more revenues from the nation's mining industry.

Mogadishu mayor wounded, officials killed in suicide attack

July 25, 2019, Al Jazeera

At least six people have been killed and the mayor of Somalia's capital, Mogadishu, wounded in a suicide attack inside his office, officials said, only hours after a visit by the newly appointed United Nations envoy to the premises. Al-Shabab, the al-Qaeda-linked armed group fighting to overthrow Somalia's UN-backed government, claimed responsibility for the attack.

Tanzanian maize and flour to help Kenya combat shortages

July 26, 2019, Africa News

Tanzania will sell neighbouring Kenya one million tons of maize and flour within a year to help curb a food shortage. A meeting between Tanzanian President John Magufuli and his Kenyan counterpart Uhuru Kenyatta in Dar es Salaam will take place this month to fight the drought in parts of Kenya which has hit the production of its staple crop, maize.

Latin America

Venezuelan jet 'aggressively shadowed' US military plane: US

July 22, 2019, Al Jazeera

The US military accused a Venezuelan fighter aircraft of "aggressively" shadowing a US Navy EP-3 Aries II plane over international airspace, in yet another sign of the increasing hostility between the two nations. US President Donald Trump's administration has repeatedly used sanctions in an effort to oust Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro, whose 2018 re-election has been deemed illegitimate by the United States and most Western nations.

US immigration: Mexico steps up migrant crackdown

July 23, 2019, Al Jazeera

The Trump administration has been leaning hard on Mexico to stop Central American migrants from making their way to the United States. Mexico hopes it has met conditions of a July 22 deadline on a deal that will remove the threat of tariffs on Mexican exports to the US.

Lima Group seeks global pressure on Venezuela's Maduro

July 24, 2019, Al Jazeera

The Lima Group on July 23 began its 15th meeting in Argentina's capital with a message of support for opposition leader in Venezuela Juan Guaido and a request for democratic elections in the country. Venezuela's political turmoil is threatening regional peace and global security, and thus the international community urged to make a "huge effort to re-establish" democracy in the South American country.

Guatemala president seeks to unblock US migration deal

July 24, 2019, BBC

Guatemalan President Jimmy Morales has filed an appeal against a court ruling blocking a deal to reduce the number of asylum seekers reaching the US border. This comes after US President Donald Trump threatened to impose tariffs on Guatemalan goods. The deal with the US would define Guatemala as a "safe third country", and migrants en route to the US would have to apply for asylum in Guatemala

<u>Japanese Ambassador receives Order of the Liberator General San Martín</u>

July 24, 2019, Buenos Aires Times

Japan's Ambassador to Argentina, Noriteru Fukushima received the Order of the Liberator General San Martín, the nation's highest decoration with the grade of Grand Cross for his work to strengthen bilateral relations between the two nations.

New US sanctions target Venezuelan food subsidy scam

The United States Treasury Department has imposed sanctions on a vast corruption network for importing and distributing food in Venezuela used to fill the pockets of Venezuelan President Nicolas Maduro with overvalued contracts, including the government's food subsidy programme.

Firearms from US used in 7 out of 10 high-impact crimes and rising

Firearms from the United States are used in seven out of every 10 high-impact crimes committed in Mexico. Between fiscal years 2012 and 2017, Mexican authorities seized and sent to the ATF for verification a total of 98,654 weapons, of which 69,140 or 70% – were traced to an origin (manufacture or legal importation) in the United States.

Islamic State claims aid workers' kidnap in northeast Nigeria

Islamic State's West Africa branch claimed responsibility for kidnapping six aid workers in northeast Nigeria. The group has carried out a number of attacks in the northeast over the last few months, including on military bases.

Yemen's Houthis attack Saudi Abha airport with drones, Houthi TV says

Yemen's Iranian-aligned Houthi militia attacked Abha airport in Saudi Arabia on July 25 with drones, the Houthis' Al Masirah TV said.
