

## India

'Disengagement process along LAC not yet complete': India rebuts China

The report has warned that the terror organisation — al-Qaida in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS), which reportedly has between 150 and 200 militants from India, Pakistan, Bangladesh and Myanmar, is planning attacks in the region to avenge the death of their leader Asim Umar.

#### Pakistan

100 books banned in Punjab for profane, anti-Pakistan content

Punjab Curriculum & Textbook Board (PCTB) banned 100 books being taught in private schools for carrying blasphemous and anti-Pakistan content. PCTB had started critical review of 10,000 books being taught by private schools across the province and in the first phase had banned 100 books of 31 publishers including Oxford and Cambridge for blasphemous, immoral and anti-Pakistan content.

Widespread criticism over rationale for new law to 'protect' Islam

#### July 27, 2020, Dawn

Various sections of society, including a federal minister, have criticised the passage of the Punjab Tahaffuz-i-Bunyad-i-Islam (protecting the foundation of Islam) Bill 2020 by the Punjab Assembly, warning that such trends would fan extremism. The law passed on July 22 makes "desecration" of any prophet, any of the four divine books, family and companions of Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him), as well as abetting or glorification of terrorists, and promoting sectarianism in any book punishable with a maximum of five-year jail terms and up to Rs500,000 fine. It makes the use of the words "Khatam-un-Nabiyyeen" mandatory whenever the name of Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) is mentioned.

Be more like Pakistan, China tells Afghanistan and Nepal at four-country meet

China urged Afghanistan, Nepal and Pakistan to forge "four-party cooperation" to overcome the Covid-19 crisis and continue work on projects under the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI), including the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). Presiding over a virtual meeting with his counterparts from the three countries, China's foreign minister Wang Yi said the four states should work together to extend CPEC to Afghanistan.

#### Afghan transit trade via Gwadar Port begins

July 28, 2020, The Express Tribune

Transit trade to Afghanistan through Pakistan's strategic Gwadar seaport began with a consignment of bulk cargo from the United Arab Emirates (UAE). "The first transit consignment of bulk cargo through Gwadar to Afghanistan has started. Several consignments are lined up for coming days," said Mohammad Sadiq, Pakistan's Special Envoy for Afghanistan.

SAPMs Tania Aidrus, Dr Zafar Mirza quit amid flak

Special Assistant to the PM on Digital Pakistan Tania Aidrus and Special Assistant to the PM on Health Dr Zafar Mirza announced that they were stepping down from their posts. Their decision to resign has come amid the government facing stiff criticism for appointing individuals with a dual nationality or holding another country's permanent residency as SAPMs.

#### Al Khalid-I tank inducted in Armoured Corps Regiment

The Pakistan Army inducted Al Khalid-I main battle tank in Armoured Corps Regiment. The handing over ceremony of the tank, which is an upgraded version of Al Khalid tank, was held at Heavy Industries Taxila (HIT). It is equipped with enhanced protection against smart ammunition and other forms of top attacks. The tank has improved Muzzle Reference System, Solid State Auto Loader, Improved Radiation Detector and independent and effective command and control system for deeper and long-distance operations.

Taliban accuse Afghan govt of re-arresting insurgents

July 27, 2020, Dawn

The Taliban accused Afghan security forces of re-arresting insurgents who had been released as part of a crucial prisoner swap meant to kick-start peace talks. They said the National Directorate of Security (NDS) had detained an unspecified number of insurgents released under the exchange programme, warning Kabul would "bear responsibility for the consequences".

Afghan Govt Prepares for Intl Fund-Pledging in Geneva

The Afghan government is expecting a "sufficient" amount of assistance from international donors to be pledged at the Geneva conference, which is scheduled to be held in November. Economy Minister Mustafa Mastoor said the second document of the Afghanistan National Peace and Development Framework, or ANPDF II, for 2021 to 2025 has been finalized and the international community is expected to announce its support to Afghanistan within the framework of this document.

Pakistan receives \$505m from World Bank

Pakistan has received around \$500 million in soft loan from the World Bank. The global lender has provided the loan at a concessional rate to support Islamabad in bridging the shortfall in budgeted expenditures, mainly on healthcare and socio-economic fronts, to better fight the coronavirus pandemic.

#### <u>US urges Pakistan to act after American blasphemy accused shot dead in</u> <u>Peshawar court</u>

July 30, 2020, Dawn

The United States urged Pakistan to take action over the killing of an American national in a crowded courtroom in Peshawar as he faced trial for blasphemy. Tahir Ahmad Naseem, 57, was seated in the court of an additional sessions judge after arguments in his case, awaiting to be shifted to prison, when he was shot multiple times at close range. "We extend our condolences to the family of Tahir Naseem, the American citizen who was killed today inside a courtroom in Pakistan," the US State Department said in a tweet.

Anti-terrorism, UNSC bills sail through amid rumpus by opposition

The National Assembly of Pakistan passed "The Anti-terrorism (Amendment) Bill, 2020" and "The United Nations (Security Council) (Amendment) Bill, 2020" with a majority vote amid sloganeering and strong protest from the opposition members. This legislation is related to fulfil certain requirements of the Financial Action Task Force in order to bring Pakistan out of FATF's grey list. The legislation is aimed at empowering the federal government to direct authorities in Pakistan to implement various measures in the Security Council resolutions including the freezing and seizure of assets, travel ban and arms embargo on the entities and individuals, who are designated on the sanctions list of the United Nations.

## Afghanistan

#### Rise of Foreign Fighters in Afghanistan's East: ANA General

The number of foreign fighters has increased on the battlefields in the eastern parts of Afghanistan, with most of them Pakistani nationals who are fighting alongside the Taliban in areas along the Durand Line, an Afghan Army general said. UN report submitted to the United Nations Security Council indicated that the total number of "Pakistani foreign terrorist fighters" in Afghanistan is estimated at "between 6,000 and 6,500, most of them with Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP)."

#### Taliban to Release All 1,000 Prisoners by Eid

Suhail Shaheen, a spokesman for the Taliban's Qatar office said that the Taliban will release the remaining government prisoners of the 1,000 pledged by Eid to show "goodwill." "The other side must also complete the process of releasing the pledged 5,000 detainees in accordance with the Doha Agreement, and the list, in order to facilitate the start of intra-Afghan talks after Eid," Shaheen said.

As Intra-Afghan Talks Loom, Taliban Hark To 1990s Regime

Talks between the Afghan government and the hard-line Islamist Taliban movement finally appear to be on the horizon after the two sides announced a brief cease-fire during the Muslim festival of Eid al-Adha this week. But it is unclear whether they can overcome the immediate problems of reconciling differences over prisoner releases, extending the cease-fire, and resentment over relentless violence since the Taliban signed an initial peace agreement with the United States in February.

Khalizad Arrives in Kabul, Meets With Afghan Leaders

The US Special Representative for Afghanistan Reconciliation Zalmay Khalilzad visited Kabul where he met Afghan leaders ahead of the Eid-al-Adha ceasefire, which has started . In his meeting with President Ghani, the two discussed an extension of the ceasefire and a reduction in violence, the start of direct talks, and also the prisoner exchange. Abdullah Abdullah, head of the High Council for National Reconciliation, and former president Hamid Karzai were also present in Khalilzad's meeting with Ghani.

#### Bangladesh

Flood engulfs over a third of Bangladesh

Around 37 percent of the country's total area has been flooded, said Prof AKM Saiful Islam, of Buet's Institute of Water and Flood Management, after analysing satellite images.

#### Focus on Bangladesh

The India-Bangladesh relationship, over the past decade, has been the brightest spot in Indian foreign policy. After a tense 1990s and 2000s, when power alternated between the moderate Awami League, led by Sheikh Hasina, and the extremist Bangladesh Nationalist Party, led by Begun Khaleda Zia, and a short period of indirect army rule, the Awami League returned to power in 2009. Sheikh Hasina, the daughter of Bangladesh's iconic freedom fighter and first president, Mujibur Rahman, was clear that having good relations with India, externally, was essential for Bangladesh's progress and cracking down on Islamists, internally, was essential for maintaining democracy and peace.

Bangladesh too on the Chinese radar

## Nepal

Nepal is walking a tightrope between India and China

New fighter jets fuel nationalism in India

#### Southeast Asia

South Korea's New Southern Policy and ASEAN-ROK Relations
