#### India

India and US explore pacts on technology; soft power; defence for 2+2 meet

Pakistan eyes \$1.2b additional debt relief from G-20

Pakistan is expected to get additional temporary debt relief of nearly \$1.2 billion after the world's richest nations agreed to extend debt-relief initiative for the 'poorest' nations by another six months to June 2021. Pakistan's participation in the debt relief initiative of the G-20 has dented its global image, as it has been clubbed with the world's poorest countries despite its better socio-economic indicators than many African nations.

Pakistan, China may ink deal for road project

Pakistan and China may sign a framework agreement for the construction of a western route road project during the upcoming Joint Cooperation Committee (JCC) meeting but chances of finalising a financing agreement for the \$6.8 billion Mainline-I (ML-I) project remain low.

#### 20 security personnel martyred in Ormara, Razmak attacks

Seven soldiers and as many security guards were martyred while fighting off a terrorist attack on a convoy of the Oil and Gas Development Company Limited (OGDCL) in Balochistan, hours after six army troops were martyred in an improvised explosive device (IED) explosion in Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa. The attack on the OGDCL convoy took place on the Coastal Highway, near Ormara, the Inter-Services Public Relations said. Earlier, the ISPR said that six troops, including an officer, were martyred in an IED blast in North Waziristan tribal district.

Major restructuring package for power sector planned

The Pakistan government is planning to announce a major restructuring package for the power sector envisaging a freeze on average consumer tariff coupled with incentive-based lower rates for industry and small and medium enterprises (SMEs), transfer of distribution companies (Discos) to the provinces and transfer of K-Electric's majority shares to Shanghai Electric under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

\$1,150m accord signed with WB for two KP power projects

Pakistan Prime Minister Imran Khan signed two financing agreements worth \$1,150 million with the World Bank. The Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) Hydropower and Renewable Energy Development Project of \$450m aims to increase renewable energy generation and strengthen the capacity of associated institutions in the province.

Stage set for PDM power show in Gujranwala

The recently-formed Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) which comprises 11 parties including the PML-N, PPP and JUI-F has vowed to turn the Gujranwala rally into a 'big power show', asking Information Minister Shibli Faraz to resign if the venue is jam-packed. Mr Faraz had thrown a challenge to the opposition to fill the Jinnah Park since the government had allowed it to hold a public gathering there.

IMF forecasts 1pc growth, rising unemployment

In its World Economic Outlook (WEO) 2020, the IMF projected Pakistan's growth rate at one per cent, average inflation rate at 8.8pc, current account

deficit at 2.5pc of GDP (gross domestic product) and unemployment rising by 0.6pc to 5.1pc during the current fiscal year. This is in sharp contrast with targets of 2.1pc GDP growth rate, 6.5pc inflation and 1.5pc current account deficit set by the government.

Asia-Pacific Group keeps Pakistan on enhanced follow-up list

The Asia-Pacific Group (APG) on Money Laundering has retained Pakistan on its "Enhanced Follow-Up" list for a meagre progress on technical recommendations of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) to fight money laundering and terror financing.

Under-fire SAPM quits after resignation accepted

Prime Minister Imran Khan finally allowed retired Lt Gen Asim Saleem Bajwa to relinquish the additional charge of Special Assistant to PM on information and broadcasting, accepting the latter's resignation he had submitted last month in the wake of allegations regarding his family's assets and offshore businesses. Mr Bajwa, however, will continue to work as chairman of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor Authority.

#### Afghanistan

Trump tweet gave Taliban upper hand in negotiations: Abdullah Abdullah

A tweet by President Donald Trump calling for US troops to be home by Christmas has given the insurgent Taliban the upper hand in negotiations said Abdullah Abdullah. Trump posted the tweet last week, hours after his national security adviser said Washington would reduce its forces in Afghanistan to 2,500 by early next year. The Taliban has welcomed the announcement.

US envoy says Taliban agree to reduce Afghan casualties

The Taliban have promised US forces to reduce casualties in Afghanistan after a wave of violence raised questions about peace talks, a US envoy said. "At present too many Afghans are dying. With the re-set, we expect that number to drop significantly," Zalmay Khalilzad, who negotiated a February 29 deal with the Taliban to pull out US forces, wrote on Twitter.

#### Copter collision leaves nine dead in Helmand

Two military helicopters evacuating wounded soldiers from fighting in southern Afghanistan collided killing nine people on board. The crash happened as the helicopters were taking off in restive Helmand province, where clashes have erupted between Afghan forces and the Taliban. Afghanistan's defence ministry said the collision was due to "technical issues".

US launches first air strikes against Taliban since accord

The United States launched air strikes against Taliban in Afghanistan's Helmand province, after a large-scale offensive saw insurgent take over military bases in the region and close in on a key provincial capital. The strikes, carried out, marked a rare military intervention by the United States since it signed an agreement on troop withdrawal with the Taliban in February.

US Drawdown Remains Conditions-Based: Milley

US Joint Chiefs of Staff Chairman Mark Milley in an interview with NPR, said that US drawdown plans are conditions-based. "We have a plan, a series of responsible drawdown options that has been briefed to the president. I'm not going to go into specific numbers for the future," he said.
