

Pentagon Worries About Chinese Buildup Near India

December 15, 2021, Foreign Policy

The U.S. Defense Department is newly concerned about China's further military buildup near the demarcation line across its Himalayan border with India, a senior defense official told Foreign Policy, after Beijing deployed long-range strategic bombers to the area last month in another apparent warning to New Delhi.

Standing Committee on Defence recommends three aircraft carriers for Navy

Making a strong recommendation that the Navy should have three aircraft carriers, the standing committee on defence has suggested that future acquisition plans need to take into consideration the requirement to enhance combat capabilities. The committee also went into the details of winter clothing for troops posted on the northern borders and bulletproof jackets for soldiers but the replies of the government have been deemed as classified and were redacted from the reports.

India Seeks Its Own Solar Industry to Counter China

Until recently, one of India's largest renewable energy developers was focused on building massive solar farms using cheap panels imported from China. Now, in an abrupt turn, ReNew Energy Global PLC and its compatriots are planning to make the panels and components themselves, part of an all-out campaign by India to break China's lock on the solar supply chain.

India votes against UN bid to 'securitise' climate action

India late on Monday evening voted against a UN Security Council (UNSC) draft resolution on climate change and security co-authored by Ireland and Niger that sought to link climate change and security. According to reports, the draft resolution was also vetoed by Russia. New Delhi argued that the draft resolution sought to put the responsibility on combating climate change on the UNSC when commitments already exists under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), adding that the motive was so that "decisions can be taken without involvement of most developing countries without recognising consensus" and that "a few states will have a free hand in deciding on all climate-related issues".

The growth of India's defence exports

How much have the defence sales from India increased in the past five years? What are the factors which contributed to the growth?

The story so far: India's defence exports have increased from ₹1,521 crore in 2016-17 to ₹8,434.84 crore in 2020-21. The figure stood at ₹10,745 crore in 2018-19. The Government has set an ambitious target to achieve exports of about ₹35,000 crore (\$5 billion) in aerospace and defence goods and services by 2025.

<u>India Must Immediately Develop Hypersonic Cruise Missiles: Defence Minister Rajnath Singh</u>

SSGC to suspend gas supply to non-export industries from 11th

The Sui Southern Gas Company (SSGC) announced that the gas supply to the non-export industries of Sindh and Balochistan will be suspended from December 11 to ensure supply to domestic consumers. A statement issued by the SSGC spokesperson said that the decision has been made in line with the gas load management plan approved by the Ministry of Energy (Petroleum Division).

Pakistan sets up Afghanistan Relief Fund

Pakistan has established "Afghanistan Relief Fund" for receiving donations from both domestic and international donors to help the war-ravaged country in a bid to avert a humanitarian crisis.

Sialkot lynching case: Court remands 18 more in police custody for 15 days

An anti-terrorism court (ATC) in Gujranwala granted 15-day physical remand of 18 more accused in Sri Lankan citizens Priyantha Kumara killing case. The Punjab government decided to hold trials of all the suspects named in the case inside the prison and asked its administration to make the necessary arrangements for it.

Pak-Saudi military exercise Al-Kassah-III begins

December 14, 2021. The News

The opening ceremony of exercise "Al-Kassah-III Joint Military Counter IED" was held at the King Khalid Military City Hafar Al-Batin, Saudi Arabia. The Royal Land Saudi Forces and Pakistan Army troops practiced various drills, including counter IED operations, searching of routes, compound clearance, vehicle clearance, explosive handling and Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD). This is the third joint military exercise of the Al-Kassah series between the two countries for enhancing EOD skills in the counter IED domain adopting best practices.

Gwadar sit-in ends as govt accepts demands

After over a month of protests from the people of Gwadar who were demanding their fundamental rights, Maulana Hidayat-ur-Rehman, the leader of the sit-in, has decided to call off the protest after negotiations with the government.

Pakistan reaches out to US after skipping Democracy Summit

Pakistan has reached out to the United States with a message that skipping the Democracy Summit does not mean the country has joined any bloc or has no interest in the bilateral relationship with Washington. Days after Pakistan declined invitation for the democracy summit, Foreign Minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi spoke to US Deputy Secretary of State Wendy Sherman and explained Pakistan's position regarding its decision not to attend the summit.

Deadlines for 5 projects extended

Pakistan has extended project completion deadlines of five Chinese power plants having a generation capacity of 3,600 megawatts amid slow progress on other issues hindering new Chinese investment under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

OIC-CFM: Over 24 FMs, P5 envoys confirm participation

More than two-dozen countries of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) have confirmed their participation at the foreign ministerial level in the upcoming extraordinary session on the current Afghan situation. Senior diplomats from the permanent members of the UN Security Council, including the US, will also join the crucial meeting of the OIC Council of Foreign Ministers (CFM) in Islamabad on December 19.

Afghanistan

World Bank says donors approve release of \$280 million for Afghanistan

Donors agreed to transfer \$280 million from a frozen, trust fund to the World Food Program (WFP) and UNICEF to support nutrition and health in Afghanistan, the World Bank said as it seeks to help a country facing famine and economic freefall. The World Bank-administered Afghan Reconstruction Trust Fund will this year give \$180 million to WFP to scale up food security and nutrition operations and \$100 million to UNICEF to provide essential health services, the bank said in a statement.

Taliban seek world's 'mercy and compassion' to help Afghans

Afghanistan's new Taliban rulers are committed in principle to education and jobs for girls and women, a marked departure from their previous time in

power, and they seek the world's "mercy and compassion" to help millions of Afghans in desperate need, a top Taliban leader said in a rare interview.

US sets up commission on Afghanistan failures

The US Congress voted to set up a commission to assess the failures of the 20-year war in Afghanistan following the Taliban's victory. The commission was part of a \$768 billion annual defense package passed by the Senate 89-10 after similarly overwhelming approval last week by the House of Representatives.

Afghan Taliban reject TTP's claim it's part of IEA

The Afghan Taliban have rejected the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) claim that it is a 'branch' of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA), the regime in charge in Kabul, asserting that the two organisations do not share the same objectives.

Taliban behind 72 extrajudicial killings, says UN

The UN said there were "credible allegations" of more than 100 extrajudicial killings in Afghanistan since the Taliban took power in August, with most carried out by the country's new rulers. United Nations deputy rights chief Nada Al-Nashif said she was deeply alarmed by continuing reports of such killings, despite a general amnesty announced by the Taliban after their August 15 takeover.

Evacuation of Indians and Afghans under 'Operation Devi Shakti' and shipment of humanitarian assistance for the people of Afghanistan

A special flight from Kabul to New Delhi, chartered by the Government of India, arrived at the IGI airport at New Delhi on December 10. The flight brought 10 Indians and 94 Afghans, including members of Afghan minority community. The minority community members carried with them 2 Swaroops of Guru Granth Sahib and some ancient Hindu manuscripts.

In view of the challenging humanitarian situation in Afghanistan, the Government of India has dispatched humanitarian assistance consisting of medical supplies on the return flight. These medicines handed over to the representatives of the World Health Organisation (WHO) in Kabul.

Japan's Foreign Ministry to create senior post for Taiwan-related issues

The ministry revealed the plan at a meeting of the ruling Liberal Democratic Party's Foreign Affairs Division, according to Masahisa Sato, a House of Councillors lawmaker.

Kishida maiden visit to U.S. to be delayed to 2022

The Japanese government looks to have failed in securing Prime Minister Fumio Kishida's first visit in office to Washington within the year and will now explore opportunities in January or beyond. Most of Japan's new leaders have received invitations to the White House within weeks of assuming office, and Tokyo had hoped to squeeze in a visit after the extraordinary Diet session here ends on Dec. 21.

Japan's foreign minister should visit China: Taro Kono

"If the foreign ministers can't talk, that is definitely not an ideal situation."

Kishida reverses government's position on cash handout

Prime Minister Fumio Kishida formally acknowledged on Monday that the administration will permit municipalities to distribute ¥100,000 handouts fully in cash by the end of the year, reversing their original plan that would allocate only half in cash within this year and the other half in coupons next spring for eligible households with children up to 18 years old.

<u>U.S.-Japan alliance needs stronger deterrence, top diplomats say</u>

South Korean media consumption top reason for execution in North Korea: Report

The plurality of public executions in North Korea under Kim Jong Un have been a consequence of watching or distributing South Korean videos, according to a new research report published on Wednesday. The investigation by the Seoul-based Transnational Justice Working Group (TJWG) aims to map public execution sites over the past 10 years, and it follows new laws introduced in North Korea in 2020 that increase penalties for consuming or sharing South Korean media.

South Korea deploys 30mm wheeled anti-aircraft gun

South Korea's military has started deploying a homegrown 30 mm-caliber wheeled antiaircraft gun for field operations under a project to replace decades-old Vulcan cannons, the state arms procurement agency. Developed in 2019, the new gun will supplant the 20mm cannons that the country's Army, Air Force and Marine Corps have operated for over 40 years, the Defense Acquisition Program Administration (DAPA) said.

Korea, Uzbekistan promise stronger ties for raw material trade, energy infrastructure

President Moon Jae-in and his Uzbek counterpart Shavkat Mirziyoyev pledged to strengthen their two countries' cooperation in rare metal trading and energy infrastructure, as part of Moon's bid to improve the industrial stability of Korea, which has few raw materials and is thus vulnerable to impacts on global supply chains.

Seoul has 'much more to offer' in the global chip supply chain: US diplomat

S. Korea's ICT exports hit a new monthly high in Nov.
