

<u>India's Foreign Policy in 2020: Challenges from COVID-19, China and the neighbourhood</u>

In the world of diplomacy too, COVID-19 was the biggest story, heightening tensions among some nations, most notably evident in the deteriorating U.S.-China relationship, while emerging as an opportunity for others who have offered medical assistance and are now pledging support in the distribution of vaccines.

<u>Missiles, drones, defence shield — India has a series of military trials planned</u> for 2021

<u>India cannot accept any unilateral change of LAC: Rajnath on continuing border standoff with China in Ladakh</u>

# 'Chinese air force heavily deployed in Ladakh theatre in support of PLA': IAF chief

Indian Air Force Air Chief Marshal RKS Bhadauria said that China has heavily deployed the People's Liberation Army Air Force (PLAAF) to support its army in the Ladakh theatre along with a large number of radars and missiles, even as he listed out the possible Chinese objectives for its actions at the northern border.

# India-China military talks on standoff paused due to change of guard in PLA

The ninth round of military dialogue between India and China is expected to take place once the newly-appointed PLA Western Theatre Commander Gen Zhang Xudong completes his military familiarisation and troop deployments on the Indian border. Gen Zhang, who has never served on the Indian border or Tibet, took over from Tibet veteran Gen Zhao Zongqi on December 21. Gen Zhao was the principal implementer of Bejing aggression in Doklam in 2017 and in East Ladakh in May 2020.

# Govt amends AML, CFT laws to comply with FATF conditions

December 31, 2020, The News

In order to comply with the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) conditions, the Pakistan government has bound the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) and all branches of commercial banks by enforcing the amended Anti-Money Laundering (AML) and Counter Financing of Terrorist (CFT) laws. Earlier, these regulations were enforced on the National Savings Scheme (NSS) centers or branches only, but now the scope of regulations have been extended to the SBP and all commercial branches dealing with NSS instruments.

# China gives \$100m grant for road rehabilitation

China gave a \$100 million grant to Pakistan for rehabilitating a road that had been damaged by floods 10 years ago, indicating a shift in Beijing's policy of only extending loans to its strategic ally. The \$100 million grant was the highest amount given by China in recent years to Pakistan, announced Ministry of Economic Affairs.

#### Pakistan to get costliest LNG in February 2021

December 29, 2020, The Express Tribune

Pakistan LNG Limited (PLL) has received all-time highest bid at 32.48% of Brent to secure cargoes for the month of February. Pakistan has to purchase the costliest liquefied natural gas (LNG) in February 2021 at 32.48% of Brent with a 31-day gap between tender opening and advertisement.

# PM signs letter seeking \$4.8b for trilateral rail project

Prime Minister Imran Khan signed a "Joint Appeal Letter" seeking \$4.8 billion loan from various International Financial Institutions (IFIs) for a railway line project connecting Pakistan with Afghanistan, Uzbekistan and the Central Asian Republics. The premier signed the letter after Uzbekistan's Minister for Transport Makhkamov Ilkham called on him.

# Pakistan officially takes credit for facilitating Afghan peace

December 28, 2020, The Express Tribune

Pakistan has for the first time officially taken credit for facilitating not just the February 29 deal between the US and the Afghan Taliban but also talks between the Afghan government and the Taliban, as the intra-Afghan talks are set to resume next month in Doha after a 20-day break. Islamabad played a key role in the Afghan peace efforts but this is the first time that the Foreign Office (FO) in a statement explicitly mentioned how Pakistan facilitated the US-Taliban

deal as well as commencement of the intra-Afghan talks. The statement has been issued by the FO against the backdrop of some negative statements emanating from both official and private Afghan circles questioning Pakistan's role.

#### Seven soldiers martyred in Harnai attack

Seven soldiers of paramilitary Frontier Corps (FC) laid down their lives during an intense exchange of fire that ensued when heavily armed terrorists attacked their check-post located in the Sharig area of Harnai district in Balochistan. The terrorists opened fire on the checkpost from nearby hilltops using rockets and then automatic gunfire.

# Afghanistan

#### Afghan Intelligence Busts Chinese Spy Cell in Kabul: Report

December 26, 2020, Tolo News

Afghanistan's intelligence agency—the National Directorate of Security (NDS)—has busted a 10-member Chinese module operating a terror cell in the city of Kabul. The crackdown has come as a huge embarrassment for Beijing, which has been trying to persuade the Afghan government to keep the case secret. The Afghan security and intelligence agencies so far have not made an official comment about the report.

#### Qatar to host next round of Afghan gov't-Taliban talks: Official

The next round of negotiations between the Taliban and the Afghan government will be held in Qatar from next month, despite President Ashraf Ghani's recent calls for them to be moved home. Peace talks began on September 12 at a hotel in Doha, but negotiations are currently on a break until January 5.

Pakistan and Afghanistan have agreed to have further discussions and exchange views on the Afghanistan Pakistan Transit Trade Agreement (APTTA). The 8th meeting of Afghanistan Pakistan Transit Trade Coordination Authority (APTTCA) was held in Islamabad from 28th to 30th December, 2020.

# China offered Afghan militants bounties to attack US soldiers: reports

US intelligence officials briefed President Donald Trump on alleged findings that China has offered money to non-state actors in Afghanistan to attack US troops. The president was told about the Chinese bounty issue on December 17, and that officials were working to corroborate the claims.

# Bangladesh

Bangladesh, India consolidate bilateral ties in 2020 amidst challenges posed by COVID-19

Bangladesh navy ships shift 1,700 Rohingya refugees to isolated island

# Beijing Accelerates Campaign of Ethnic Assimilation

To realize the China of his dreams, Xi Jinping wants to meld the nation's dozens of ethnic groups into a singular national identity. The program of aggressive cultural assimilation—or "ethnic fusion," as it's called in government documents and speeches—has gone to extremes in the northwestern region of Xinjiang, home to the largest mass detention of a minority group since World War II. The campaign has begun to spread and intensify in other ethnically diverse areas. In Inner Mongolia, a plan to expand Mandarin-language education and mandate the use of national textbooks over local versions sparked protests and school boycotts among students and parents concerned that the Mongolian language was in danger of being erased.

# Xi's China Crafts Campaign to Boost Youth Patriotism

In the era of Mao Zedong, China used propaganda posters to urge young people to create a great socialist nation. After the Tiananmen Square protests in 1989, the Communist Party rewrote textbooks to deliver its version of history and to steer its young away from Western ideas. The message is more blatantly nationalistic than anything in recent decades, with President Xi Jinping's image often at the center. And it is far more sophisticated than anything Beijing has attempted in the past.

#### Apple's longtime supplier accused of using forced labor in China

One of the oldest and most well-known iPhone suppliers has been accused of using forced Muslim labor in its factories, according to documents uncovered by a human rights group, adding new scrutiny to Apple's human rights record

in China. The documents, discovered by the Tech Transparency Project and shared exclusively with The Washington Post, detail how thousands of Uighur workers from the predominantly Muslim region of Xinjiang were sent to work for Lens Technology. Lens also supplies Amazon and Tesla, according to its annual report.

Hong Kong's democracy movement was crushed in 2020. But the spirit of resistance survives

"Check out that security guard," Alex said, nodding to my left. Alex (not his real name) is a protester in his early 20s, and I was meeting him for coffee at the only "yellow" pro-democracy cafe in New Town Plaza, Hong Kong, a once quiet shopping mall in my home district that last year became a battleground in massive anti-government protests. I turned to look: sure enough, there was a guard standing to the side of the main square, staring out into the crowd. I hadn't noticed him before. Now I can't help but catch him in the corner of my eye every time I pass through.

# Pushback on Xi's Vision for China Spreads Beyond U.S.

In March 2019, Xi Jinping flew to Paris to meet French President Emmanuel Macron, German Chancellor Angela Merkel and the then-president of the European Commission, Jean-Claude Juncker. After toasting with flutes of Champagne, the Chinese president pressed the three leaders, according to an official present. A recent European Union policy paper had described China as a "systemic rival." Did the Europeans really mean it? Ms. Merkel demurred with a compliment for Mr. Xi, saying the language showed Europe recognized China's growing strength and influence, the official said. Mr. Juncker cut the tension with a joke about the EU's inability to agree on what China was. But Mr. Macron was blunt, the official recalled. It's true, the French president said. You are a rival.

#### Ministry tightens Chinese investment regulations

The Ministry of Economic Affairs yesterday said that it has tightened control on Chinese investments in Taiwan due to national security concerns, following in the steps of countries such as the US and Japan.
