

US defence secretary Lloyd Austin on Sunday described the recent visit of Chief of Defence Staff General Bipin Rawat to the Pentagon as "historic" and said they have reaffirmed their enduring commitment to a free and open Indo Pacific.

Pakistan

Balochistan crisis deepens as three ministers, two advisers resign

Political crisis in Balochistan deepened when a group of disgruntled ministers, advisers and parliamentary secretaries submitted their resignations to the provincial governor after an embattled Jam Kamal Khan Alyani ignored the 24-hour deadline set by his opponents for him to step down as chief minister.

Pakistan wants broad, long-term and stable relations with US, Qureshi tells visiting American official

October 8, 2021, Dawn

Pakistan Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi said that Pakistan wants broad-ranging, long-term and stable relations with the United States to promote economic cooperation and establish peace in the region. He made the comments during a meeting with US Deputy Secretary of State Wendy Sherman who is on a two-day visit to Pakistan. The two sides discussed bilateral relations, Afghanistan and the regional situation during the meeting.

In military shuffle, Lt Gen Nadeem Anjum replaces Lt Gen Faiz Hameed as top spymaster

Lieutenant General Nadeem Ahmed Anjum has been appointed as the new director-general of Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI). Meanwhile, Lt Gen Faiz Hameed, formerly the ISI director general, has been posted as the Peshawar corps commander.

Govt debt goes up by 11.5pc to Rs39.7tr

The central government's total debt increased by 11.5 per cent in August this year from August 2020 while the external debt (in terms of rupees) increased by 8pc in the first two months of 2021-22. The State Bank of Pakistan's latest report on government's total debts showed the external debts also increased significantly by Rs1.3 trillion in a year's time mainly on account of appreciation of US dollar against local currency.

<u>High-powered cell formed to investigate offshore firm owners</u>

Prime Minister Imran Khan formed a high-powered cell to investigate if any irregularity had been committed by the 700 Pakistanis named in the Pandora

Papers including federal cabinet members, politicians, retired generals, owners of media houses and others in establishing offshore companies.

Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan fall sharply since Taliban takeover

October 3, 2021, Dawn

The flow of Afghan transit trade and Pakistan's exports to Afghanistan saw a deeper drop since the Taliban took control of Kabul in August. The flow of cargo fell by 16 per cent in August 2021 and a further decline of 73pc in September from last year, which many experts attributed to the uncertainty in the wake of the takeover of Afghanistan.

Five security personnel martyred in terrorist attack

Four Frontier Corps soldiers and a sub-inspector of Levies Force were martyred when terrorists targeted their vehicle in the Spinwam area of North Waziristan tribal district.

Govt offers pardon to TTP groups seeking patch-up

Prime Minister Imran Khan offered general pardon to the Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) provided the banned group laid down weapons, disclosing that the government was in talks with some groups of the outfit seeking reconciliation.

North Waziristan group declares 20-day truce

October 2, 2021, Dawn

A militant group active in North Waziristan tribal district announced a 20-day cessation of hostilities to pursue peace with the government. The Shura Mujahideen of North Waziristan, headed by commander Hafiz Gul Bahadur, announced the ceasefire following negotiations held with the government intermediaries some two weeks ago.

Saudi Arabia to provide \$3.6 bn facility for purchasing oil on deferred payments

October 2, 2021, The News

Federal Minister for Finance Shaukat Tarin said that Saudi Arabia will provide a \$3.6 billion facility for purchasing oil on deferred payments over a period of two years.

PM Imran Khan discusses Afghanistan with Tajik president

Prime Minister Imran Khan held telephonic conversation with President Emomali Rahmon of Tajikistan and thanked him for the warm hospitality extended to him and his delegation during the recent visit to Dushanbe on 16-17 September. According to the Prime Minister Office, the two leaders exchanged views on the follow-up to the talks held in Dushanbe last month.

Afghanistan

Afghanistan: Deadly attack hits Kunduz mosque during Friday prayers

A suicide bomb attack on a mosque in the Afghan city of Kunduz has killed at least 50 people, officials say, in the deadliest assault since US forces left. The Islamic State group said it was behind the attack. Sunni Muslim extremists have targeted Shias who they see as heretics.

Cash airlifts planned to bypass Taliban, help Afghans

October 8, 2021, Dawn

As desperate Afghans resort to selling their belongings to buy food, officials are preparing to fly in cash for the needy while avoiding financing the Taliban government. Planning for the cash airlifts is going ahead against the background of a rapidly collapsing economy where money is short, although diplomats are still debating whether Western powers can demand that the Taliban make concessions in return.

Afghanistan to start issuing passports again after months of delays

October 6, 2021, Dawn

Afghanistan will start issuing passports to its citizens again, a senior official said, following months of delays that hampered attempts by those trying to flee the country after the Taliban seized control in August.

Deadly blast rocks Kabul after Taliban hold victory rally

October 4, 2021, Dawn

Taliban supporters and senior figures held their first mass rally near Kabul on October 3, but their show of strength was overshadowed by a deadly bomb blast near a mosque in the Afghan capital. No foreign government has yet recognised the former rebels' rule, though their hold on power within the country is becoming stronger, seven weeks after they took Kabul.

Taliban raid IS hideout north of Kabul

October 2, 2021, Dawn

Taliban fighters raided a hideout of the militant Islamic State (IS) group north of the Afghan capital, killing and arresting an unspecified number of militants, a Taliban spokesman said. Since the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan in mid-August, there has been an increase in attacks by IS militants targeting Taliban members.

British envoy visits Kabul, holds talks with Taliban

October 6, 2021, The News

Taliban officials tweeted pictures of the first meeting between Simon Gass, Britain's special representative for Afghanistan, and deputy prime ministers Abdul Ghani Baradar and Abdul Salam Hanafi. The two sides discussed how Britain can help Afghanistan battle terrorism and a deepening humanitarian crisis -- and provide safe passage for those who want to leave the country, a UK government spokesperson said.

Russia to invite Taliban to international talks on October 20

October 8, 2021, The News

Russia will invite the Taliban to international talks on Afghanistan scheduled for October 20 in Moscow, the Kremlin's envoy to Afghanistan, Zamir Kabulov said. The talks will follow a G20 summit on Afghanistan on October 12 that will seek to help the country avoid a humanitarian catastrophe in the wake of the Taliban takeover.

Probe reveals mass trafficking of women from Bangladesh

Nepal on Thursday signed a memorandum of understanding with India in New Delhi to prepare a detailed project report for a proposed \$3.15 billion railway linking Kathmandu with the Indian border town of Raxaul in the south.

Kenyatta named in 'Pandora Papers' finance investigation

The report, billed as the largest investigation in journalism history, involves more than 600 journalists from 150 news outlets around the world, according to the International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ). It is based on two years' worth of careful scrutiny of leaked records from 14 firms that handle offshore financial dealings.

Google commits \$1 billion in new funding to Africa's digital future

Google announced a US\$1 billion commitment to the continent's digital transformation during the company's first-ever Google for Africa livestream event. The investment, planned across the next five years, will support several initiatives. They include completion of Equiano, an undersea cable meant to improve Internet speeds and drive down the costs of connectivity for Africans.

Former enemies, Ethiopia and Eritrea are fighting on the same side in Tigray war
