

EAM Jaishankar holds 11 bilateral meetings with foreign counterparts in New York

The External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar has held 11 bilateral meetings with his foreign counterparts, including Iran, Bulgaria, Turkey, Netherlands, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, UAE and others. The Minister also met US special envoy on Afghan peace reconciliation, ZalmayKhalilzad, for the first time after peace talks broke down earlier this month between the United States and Taliban.

<u>US Congressman Ro Khanna Seeks NATO Equivalent Status for India in Defence</u> Ties

The presence of Afghan officials at the 24-hour Torkham Crossing ceremony has caused a controversy, because Torkham is on the Durand Line, which Pakistan claims as its border and Afghanistan does not.

South African Navy visited by Sri Lanka Defence Service Command and Staff College

China's ALIT rejects Sri Lanka leader's graft allegation

Sirisena made the allegation at the inauguration on Monday of the 356-meter Lotus Tower, which overlooks Beira Lake in Colombo, sparking a political row in the country, which has relied heavily on China for project finance. A parliamentary panel will investigate the allegation.

Elite Chinese investors explore business prospects in Sri Lanka
