

Pakistan settles Soviet-era trade dispute with Russia

Islamabad has finally decided to sign a deal with Moscow to settle a 39-year old exporters' claims case pending since the disintegration of the Soviet Union, paving the way for Russia to invest over \$8 billion in Pakistan. The Pakistani government has authorised its ambassador to Russia to sign the deal. Under the agreement, the Pakistani government will return \$93.5 million to Russia within 90 days of the signing and clear pending exporters' claims to the tune of \$23.8 million as per the settlement agreements reached on October 6, 2016 and December 27, 2017.

Bhutan

The EU and Bhutan confirm strong partnership

Delegations from Bhutan and the European Union (EU) reviewed the ongoing development cooperation under the multi-annual indicative programme for 2014-2020 during the eighth biennial consultation held in Paro on November 05. The EU confirmed that the bilateral allocation for the current cycle (2014-2020) has been revised to \leq 49.3 million from \leq 42 million. With additional assistance from other regional and thematic funding mechanisms in areas such as

education, climate change and trade, the EU's total support to Bhutan stands at €71 million, making it one of the major donors to Bhutan.

Nepal

Over 90 percent of total FDI to Nepal comes from China

Nepal received over 90% of its total foreign direct investment (FDI) commitment from China during the first quarter of the fiscal year 2019-20 that began in mid-July, according to Nepal's Department of Industry. China has been topping FDI pledges to Nepal for the last four fiscal years. Of total FDI pledges (95 million U.S. dollars), China alone pledged 88 million U.S. dollars during the first quarter. This represents nearly 93 percent of total foreign investments committed FDI, showing China's dominant position when it comes to FDI commitments in Nepal.

After China, Nepal objects to Kalapani's inclusion as part of India in new Indian maps

The Nepal government made a statement on November 06, 2019 that Kalapani area situated in the country's far-West lies within the Nepalese boundary, days after India issued new political maps reportedly showing the region as part of its territory. On November 02, India released fresh maps of the newly created Union Territories (UTs) of Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh and the map of India depicting these UTs.

Newly purchased Nepal Army plane lands at TIA

A medium fixed-wing airplane that the Nepal Army purchased from Indonesia has landed in the Tribhuvan International Airport on November 02. According to Nepal Army Spokesperson Bigyan Dev Pande, the cargo plane was purchased to supply disaster-related relief materials and for military training. The 51-seater plane with the call sign 235-200 cost the Army 300 million US dollars.

On the sidelines of INTERPOLITEX-2019, an agreement was signed on cooperation between the Ministry of Defence of Sri Lanka and the Ministry of Interior of the Russian Federation.

<u>President declares open new Army HQ</u>

Sri Lanka's new Army Headquarters was declared opened on November 08, 2019 under the patronage of President Maithripala Sirisena. The new Headquarters was constructed on 77 acres of land in AKuregoda, Pellawatte at a cost of Rs 53.3 billion. It is considered to be the largest construction project ever undertaken in Sri Lanka. The new Headquarters will house all branch offices of the Army which are currently spread out across the country.

IMF approves release of \$164 million tranche to Sri Lanka, says economy slowly recovering

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) approved the release of the sixth tranche of a \$1.5 billion loan programme for Sri Lanka, while urging authorities to show fiscal discipline as the island nation heads into a presidential poll later this month. The main candidates contesting the November 16 election have made campaign promises to voters, including tax cuts. Sri Lanka will receive \$164 million from the

sixth tranche, leaving \$190 million still to be disbursed under the terms of the loan programme signed in June 2016.

Bangladesh

Army chief meets Chinese top military leaders, defence minister

Bangladesh army chief General Aziz Ahmed was on his maiden visit to China since he assumed his office in June this year. State Department Official: US Seeks Closer Military Ties with Bangladesh
