

Pak. aside, Neighbourhood First policy for South Asia: Jaishankar

Australia to end bilateral aid to Pakistan

The Australian Government will cease all bilateral aid to Pakistan, which includes support for successful programmes helping poor women and girls, as funds for development assistance are diverted to the Pacific.

Pak exports up by 9.6% in Nov, imports cut by 17.53%

Pakistan's exports of goods during November 2019 have increased by 9.6 percent to \$2.02 billion while imports declined by 17.53 percent to \$3.815 billion over corresponding month of last year.

'Govt took \$10 bn loan from 24 countries, global lenders'

Inflation surges to nine-year high

Inflation rose to 12.7 per cent year-on-year, the highest level in nine years mainly driven by an increase in prices of food items in Pakistan. Inflation, measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), edged up by 1.3% over the previous month after the PBS revised its calculation methodology by setting the new base year 2015-16 instead of the previous 2007-08 financial year.

Iran asks Pakistan to help find missing soldiers

Iran has requested Pakistan for help in recovering three soldiers who were kidnapped near the Pak-Iran border this year during a meeting at Taftan. It also discussed the ongoing fencing on the border which commenced a few months ago.

Govt blames price hike on trade ban with India, weather

Pakistan Prime Minister's Adviser on Finance & Revenue Dr Abdul Hafeez Shaikh and Revenue Minister Hammad Azhar, attributed the prevailing price hike to suspension of trade with India, failure of provinces in keeping administrative

control over the middleman and seasonal factors. The government's economic team has forecast easing out of inflationary pressure in the next two months.

PTI govt secures \$1.3b budget support and crisis response loan from ADB

The Asian Development Bank approved \$1.3 billion budgetary support loan for Pakistan, including \$1 billion in crisis response facility to shore up low official foreign exchange reserves.

Afghanistan

Political solution needed in Afghanistan: NATO

NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg at a press briefing in London said: "We believe that we need a political negotiated solution in Afghanistan...We are committed to continue to support Afghanistan because we strongly believe that the best way NATO can support peace efforts is to train, assist and advise the Afghan security forces so that Taliban understand that they will never win on the battlefield," Stoltenberg said.

World Bank assesses needs of Afghanistan after peace settlement

According to a World Bank report, Afghanistan will need continued financial support from the international community following a potential political settlement. The World Bank concludes that Afghanistan will require \$6 billion to \$8 billion a year in international grants between 2020 and 2024 to fund basic services, support faster economic growth, and consolidate and sustain any potential reduction in violence following a political settlement with the Taliban.

Taliban and US resume Afghan peace talks
