India

India moves toward IEA membership with 'strategic partnership'

The members of the International Energy Agency have agreed to establish a "strategic partnership" with India that would serve as a pathway for the South Asian country's eventual membership, the IEA said in a statement at the weekend.

<u>Citizenship Amendment Bill continues long tradition of welcoming persecuted</u> <u>minorities</u>

The Citizenship Amendment Bill (CAB) is not about excluding anybody; it is about including some. It is an effort to grant citizenship to those minorities from erstwhile Pakistan that now includes Pakistan and Bangladesh and Afghanistan, who have come to India seeking refuge from religious persecution or the fear of it. The first time such refugees were included was immediately after Partition in the first census, which was also regarded as the National Register of Citizens.

US Commission has no locus standi: India on Citizenship Bill remarks

Hours after the US Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF) suggested the Donald Trump-led government to consider imposing sanctions against Home Minister Amit Shah over the Citizenship Amendment Bill, India termed the reaction as "neither accurate nor warranted".

China at sea: For Delhi, Shiyan incident is a reminder to invest more in maritime scientific research

Recent reports that the Indian Navy "chased out" a Chinese vessel — Shiyan 1 from the Andaman Sea should draw Delhi's attention to Beijing's growing maritime scientific capability and its ambitious research agenda for distant waters. Shiyan 1 is operated by the Chinese Academy of Sciences and is part of Beijing's growing marine research fleet that now stands at about 50 vessels.

Defence & Foreign Secretaries of India & Australia hold third 2+2 Dialogue

Russian navy ships arrive in India for joint exercise INDRA 2019

Three Russian navy ships arrived in Goa to participate in the second edition of a tri-services exercise between the armed forces of India and Russia. The aim of exercise INDRA 2019 is to enhance interoperability and develop understanding in order to effectively tackle common security challenges.

Indian Army gets new American assault rifles in Kashmir Valley against terrorists, Pakistan Army on LoC

In a major boost in fight against terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir and Pakistan Army on the Line of Control (LoC), the Indian Army has started inducting its newly acquired American SiG Sauer assault rifles in operations. In addition, the Indian Army has also started getting supplies of ammunition for its sniper rifles as more than 21 lakh rounds have been ordered from vendors. The first lot of 10,000 SiG 716 assault rifles has arrived in India and has been sent to the Northern Command.

PSLV-C48/RISAT-2BR1: ISRO successfully launches Indian Defence Satellite RISAT-2BR1, 9 commercial payloads to orbit

Russia to develop stakes in Pak economy in big way

Russia has decided to develop its stakes in Pakistan's economy in a big way and to this effect a 64-member delegation headed by Minister for Trade and Industries for the Russian Federation Denis V Manturov visited Pakistan from December 8 to 11 to attend an Inter-Governmental Commission.

ADB approves \$1.3 bn loans for Pakistan

The Asian Development Bank approved two loans totalling \$1.3 billion to provide Pakistan's budgetary support and policy-based lending for the energy sector.

Inflation touches highest point in 15 years

Inflationary pressures for Pakistani consumers in the last five months have witnessed the highest ever hike in prices on monthly basis over the last 10 to 15 years. During July-November period of the current fiscal year 2019-20, the CPI based inflation peaked at 12.67 percent in November 2019, thus surpassing all regional countries on the rate of increasing prices.

Pak-China free trade pact Phase-II comes into force on Dec 1

Phase-II of the China-Pakistan Free Trade Agreement has come into force with effect from December 1, 2019, according to an announcement made by the Ministry of Commerce.

IHC grants bail to Zardari on health grounds

An anti-terrorism court indicted Jamaatud Dawa chief Hafiz Mohammad Saeed and its leader Prof Zafar Iqbal in one of the cases registered by the Counter Terrorism Department on charges of terror financing.

Moscow promises talks on supply of aircraft to PIA

At the conclusion of the sixth session of the Pakistan-Russia Inter Governmental Commission on trade, economic and scientific and technical cooperation, the Russian side also promised to start negotiations on supply and after-sales service of 6-16 Sukhoi SuperJet-100 aircraft to Pakistan International Airlines in the first quarter of 2020.

ADB plans to pour \$2b in Pakistan's energy sector

The Asian Development Bank has planned to invest \$2 billion in the energy sector of Pakistan over a period of three years, said a delegation of the bank.

According to the news report The US reprimanded the Pakistan Air Force chief in August for misusing F-16 fighter jets by undermining their shared security platforms and infrastructures. Andrea Thompson, the then-undersecretary of State for Arms Control and International Security Affairs, wrote a letter to Pakistani Air Force Chief Air Chief Marshal Mujahid Anwar Khan in August over the matter.

PM's visit to Saudi Arabia aims to assuage Riyadh's reservations

Prime Minister Imran Khan will visit Saudi Arabia on December 14 to reassure the kingdom's leadership that ties between Pakistan and Saudi Arabia remain firm despite Islamabad's engagement with other Muslim countries. The visit, an Arab source disclosed, has been recently planned after signals from Riyadh that it was not happy with Prime Minister Imran Khan's decision to attend Kuala Lumpur summit being held in Malaysia from Dec 18-20.

Afghanistan

Deadly Clashes Erupt in Volatile Northern Afghan Province

New clashes between government security forces and the Taliban in northern Afghanistan are said to have killed around 20 combatants on both sides.

US restarts peace talks with Afghan Taliban in Qatar

The Taliban resumed formal peace talks with the U.S. in the Qatari capital, Doha, the group confirmed in a statement. Suhail Shaheen, the insurgents' Qatar office spokesman, said on social media that Mualla Baradar Akhund, the group's deputy head, led the Taliban delegation. Shaheen added that a draft agreement was discussed, and talks would continue. Anas Haqqani, a recently freed Haqqani Network leader affiliate of the Taliban, also took part in the talks, he added.

US Aims to 'Reallocate' forces to Indo-Pacific: Esper

Defense Secretary Mark Esper at the Reagan National Defense Forum said that he wants to prioritize the deployment of US forces to the Asia-Pacific region from other areas, including Afghanistan. He called the Indo-Pacific Command his "priority theater." Esper said: "I'm not just looking at Afghanistan" but "all these places where I can free up troops" to bring them home or "compete with the Chinese, to reassure our allies and to conduct exercises and training."

Everyone Knew We Were Losing in Afghanistan

Based on a tranche of thousands of documents obtained by the Post in litigation, as well as some previously released memos, the report shows that for nearly two decades, America's leaders—Democrat and Republican; civilian and military; elected, appointed, and career civil servant—have lied to us about how the war in Afghanistan is going.

The U.S. special envoy to Afghanistan said he was outraged by a Taliban attack near Bagram airfield this week, and "we're taking a brief pause," apparently in reference to peace talks that had recently resumed with the militant group.

Bangladesh

Bangladesh Navy Chief receives guard of honour in Delhi

Bangladesh Navy Chief Admiral Aurangzeb Chowdhury received guard of honour in Delhi on Dec 08. He met Indian Navy Chief Admiral Karambir Singh. He is on a five-day visit to India. He will also visit Naval institutions outside Delhi including the Southern Naval Command in Kochi where he will see the training methods of the Indian Navy. Admiral Chowdhury will also visit the Eastern Naval Command in Vishakhapatnam where he will visit warships.

Dhaka to receive \$500m from New Delhi for defence procurement

New Delhi has provided a \$500 million line of credit to Bangladesh to enable Dhaka to buy military equipment from India. Bangladesh is seeking to diversify its military arsenal given that more than 90 per cent of its equipment is of Chinese origin. The current strategy is based on fears of being trapped in a full-blown conflict with Myanmar, which enjoys China's backing over the Rohingya issue.

ADB maintains robust growth outlook for Bangladesh

Nepal to vie for UNSC non-permanent seat

The government will soon file its candidacy at the United Nations seeking nonpermanent seat in the 15-member United Nations Security Council for 2037-38. Countries needed 10-15 years to run their campaign to win, said the spokesperson for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Nepal has been a non-permanent member of the UNSC in 1969-70 and 1988-89.

Nepal govt, ADB sign deal to execute four development projects in Nepal
