

Similarly, Air Defence Missile was launched at Makran coast to reaffirm Pakistan Navy's air defence capabilities

Two houses of parliament convened on 24-hour notice

The government said the decision had been taken to take the legislature into confidence over recent important developments including amendment in Pakistan Army act accordance with the decision to extend the tenure of Gen Bajwa as COAS.

UAE extends \$200m aid to Pakistan for economic projects

At the conclusion of the visit, according to the UAE state news agency, WAM, Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed instructed the Khalifa Fund for Enterprise Development to allocate \$200 million to support the Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) projects in Pakistan.

Afghanistan

US extends help with India on Chabahar Port

The United States has given a written assurance to India that will help facilitate global banks to fund the purchase of equipment worth \$85 million to be established at Chabahar Port in Iran.In November 2018, US granted a waiver to the port from the sanctions it has imposed on the Persian Gulf nation.

Taliban kill 23 Afghan soldiers in New Year attacks

At least 23 Afghan security forces were killed in a series of Taliban attacks across the country, despite winter snowfall that usually leads to a lull in violence. The assaults targeted vulnerable checkpoints in at least three northern provinces.

Another Pakistani consultant 'picked up' in Kabul: embassy

Bangladesh restores telecom services along India border

The Bangladesh government on January 01 reversed its decision to shut down mobile services along the border with India, two days after ordering telecom operators to do so citing security concerns. Officials had in a statement released late on December 31 said mobile network coverage was suspended for a one-kilometre-wide band along the border with India until further notice "for the sake of the country's security in the current circumstances".

Army to be modernised further: PM

Ten months after signing the Protocol on Implementing the Agreement on Transit and Transportation between Nepal and China, Beijing has officially notified Kathmandu that it has completed all domestic legal procedures which means that it would come into effect from February 1. The transit protocol allows Nepal access to seven Chinese sea and land ports for third-country trade. So far, all of Nepal's third-country trade takes place via India.

The Supreme Court has asked from the government the documents which authenticates Nepal's border, accurate and valid maps of the nation together with the exact area under Nepal's occupation after the signing of the Sugauli Treaty over the Kalapani border issue.

India's map accurately depicts territory, Nepal boundary not revised: MEA

Private Member's Bill to bring Defence Ministry under President

A Private Member's Bill to enable the President to hold the Ministry of Defence and any other ministries will be introduced to Parliament by MP Wijeyadasa Rajapakshe shortly. The 22nd Amendment to the Constitution has been published in the Gazette ahead of its presentation to the House. The Amendment is intended to give clarity to the allocation of ministries to the President, which has become a grey area under the 19th Amendment to the Constitution. The provision will come as an amendment to Article 43 of the Constitution and states, "The President shall hold the Ministry of Defence and any other ministries."

Iran calls for improved bilateral relations with Sri Lanka
