



Pakistan

Pakistan's Ambassador to Afghanistan Mansoor Ahmad Khan said that he was "deeply saddened" at the casualties reported.

Afghanistan

Nearly \$19 billion of US money was lost in more than a decade of war in Afghanistan to fraud, waste and abuse, Special Inspector General for Afghanistan Reconstruction's (SIGAR) said in a new report. As of Dec 2019, the US Congress appropriated nearly \$134 billion since Fiscal Year 2002 for Afghanistan reconstruction. Of that amount, SIGAR reviewed approx. \$63

billion and found that nearly \$19 billion of amount reviewed was lost to waste, fraud, and abuse, the report said.
