

Afghan 'diplomats' take charge in Pakistan

Sardar Muhammad Shokaib has started working as the first secretary in the Afghan embassy in Islamabad. Hafiz Mohibullah, Mullah Ghulam Rasool and Mullah Muhammad Abbas have been assigned to the Peshawar, Quetta, and Karachi consulates of Afghanistan. Shokaib would effectively be the Afghan charge d'affaires in Islamabad.

Govt plans to borrow Rs6.75trln in Nov-Jan

Taliban shoot down two wedding guests for listening to music

Taliban fighters shot dead two wedding guests who were listening to music. A relative of the victims said Taliban fighters had opened fire while music was being played at a wedding in Sorkhrud, in Nangarhar province, killing two and wounding as many.

Taliban supreme leader makes first public appearance

Taliban supreme leader Haibatullah Akhundzada addressed supporters in the southern city of Kandahar, his first public appearance since taking control of the group in 2016. Akhundzada has been the spiritual chief of the movement since 2016 but has remained a reclusive figure, even after the Taliban seized power in Afghanistan.

TAPI Pipeline Project to resume in Afghanistan

Acting Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi at a press conference with Turkmenistan Foreign Minister Rashid Meredov has said the Turkmen delegation and Islamic Emirate held good talks on economic and political issues. Muttaqi said the Turkmenistan delegation included officials from various ministries who held talks with the Islamic Emirate officials. Muttaqi said during the two-day visit, both sides discussed issues around strengthening political relations and economic ties.

25 killed as blasts, gunfire hit Kabul hospital

At least 25 people were killed and more than 50 wounded when gunmen attacked Afghanistan's biggest military hospital after two heavy explosions at the site in central Kabul. The explosions hit the entrance of the 400-bed Sardar Mohammad Daud Khan hospital and were followed with an assault by gunmen

of the militant Islamic State (IS) group, all of whom were killed within 15 minutes, Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid said.

Taliban ban use of foreign currencies

The Taliban government announced a ban on the use of foreign currencies, threatening further disruption to an already ailing economy. Since the group took over Kabul in August, Afghanistan's currency has depreciated and the country's reserves are frozen abroad.

UNICEF to directly fund Afghan teachers
