

Russia warns: India-China faceoff may be misused

In what is being seen as a veiled reference to the US, Russia said that any escalation in the border tension between India and China amid global turbulence and unpredictability would further trigger regional instability in Eurasia, and the friction can be "misused by other players in their geopolitical purpose".

Cohesive, responsive ASEAN must for security, growth in region: PM Modi

Against the backdrop of aggressive moves by China in the region, including the Ladakh standoff, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday placed the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) at the centre of India's Act East policy and said that a "cohesive and responsive ASEAN" is essential for "security and growth for all in the region". "The Strategic Partnership between India and ASEAN is based on our shared historical, geographical and cultural heritage. Since the beginning, the ASEAN Group has been at the centre of our Act East policy," Modi said in his opening remarks at the virtual summit between India and the 10-nation ASEAN as its co-chair.

Pakistan

Pakistan engaged in talks to settle Reko Dig dispute: official

Pakistan is actively engaged in negotiations with parties involved in a dispute over the \$5.97 billion award against the country in the Reko Diq litigation. The World Bank's International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes committee issued the order on Oct 30, saying Pakistan had not obtained an irrevocable bank guarantee or letter of credit for 25pc of the award a condition laid out by the committee in September for keeping the stay of enforcement in place.

Iran to open another border point for trade

Iran announced the opening of a border crossing point with Pakistan for facilitating trade. The announcement was made by Iranian Foreign Minister Dr Javad Zarif during his meetings in Islamabad. He was on a two-day visit to Pakistan, leading a senior delegation comprising political and economic experts.

Three JuD activists convicted of terror financing

An anti-terrorism court (ATC) judge convicted three leaders of the Jamatud Dawa of terror financing in two more cases registered by the Counter Terrorism Department. Many leaders of the JuD have already been convicted in many FIRs of terror financing while trial proceedings in several others are pending adjudication. JuD chief Hafiz Saeed has already been sentenced to jail terms in two of the FIRs.

Army chief reaffirms support to Iran in matters of regional security

Chief of Army Staff General Qamar Javed Bajwa reaffirmed Pakistan's support towards Iran in matters of mutual interest and regional security. During a meeting held with Iran's Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif at the army's General Headquarters, the army chief and the foreign minister discussed matters of mutual interest, including Afghan reconciliation process and Pakistan-Iran border management and border markets.

No CPEC Authority Chairman at present, NA panel told

The Pakistan government told a parliamentary panel that there was no chairman of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) Authority at present as members of the National Assembly had challenged the legal status of the defunct agency and the functioning of its top management.

Pakistan may not get \$2 bn rollover from Saudi Arabia

Saudi Arabia has indicated that it might refuse a rollover of \$2 billion to Pakistan. Islamabad has already started exploring options to manage the amount from other avenues to avert the dwindling foreign currency reserves. On the issue of \$2 billion loan deposits from the UAE, there is no new development so far, as its maturity will become due after a couple of months.

ADB to lend \$300m to Pakistan

November 10, 2020, The Express Tribune

The Asian Development Bank will lend \$300 million to support Pakistan's fragile foreign exchange reserves after Islamabad met almost all the conditions related mainly to lowering barriers to imports. The \$300 million is part of the \$800 million budgetary support programme and the regional lender has already disbursed the first tranche in August last year.

Afghanistan

Australia appoints Afghanistan war crimes prosecutor

Australia announced the appointment of a special prosecutor to investigate alleged war crimes by Australian special forces in Afghanistan after media uncovered evidence of civilians and prisoners being killed. Prime Minister Scott Morrison, citing allegations of "serious and possibly criminal misconduct", appointed the prosecutor to deal with the issue domestically and forestall any move by the International Criminal Court.

Al Qaeda bomb-maker killed in Afghanistan

November 11, 2020, Dawn

A bomb-maker who trained Taliban militants before switching allegiance to Al Qaeda has been killed in western Afghanistan. The National Directorate of Security said Mohammad Hanif was a close aide to Asim Omar, who headed Al Qaeda in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS) and was killed in a joint US-Afghan operation in 2019. Hanif, originally from Karachi, had "close relations" with the Taliban and helped train militants in making car bombs and improvised explosive devices.

Delegates Offer New Solutions to Resume Talks

The Afghan republic negotiating team has offered four new alternatives to the Taliban to end the delay in the start of direct peace negotiations between the two sides in Doha. The Taliban has been insisting on the US-Taliban agreement to be the basis for the talks and Hanafi jurisdiction as religious basis for the negotiations. The two key points have delayed the start of peace negotiations in Doha. One of the four solutions offered by the negotiating team of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan is the inclusion of the Afghan government in the US-Taliban agreement if the Taliban insists to put it as the basis for the talks.

Trump's new Pentagon sets up clash over Afghanistan pullout

President Donald Trump's decapitation strike on the Pentagon this week is raising fears that the U.S. will accelerate the withdrawal of troops from Afghanistan, putting newly installed leaders on a collision course with top generals and others who are urging a more deliberate drawdown.

Taliban Calls on U.S. President-Elect Biden To Stick To Doha Peace Deal

The Taliban has called on U.S. President-elect Joe Biden to stick to a February peace agreement between the militant group and the United States, describing its implementation as the "the most reasonable and effective tool" for ending the war in Afghanistan. The Taliban itself remains committed to the deal's implementation, the militant group said in a statement on November 10, a day after Afghan Vice President Sarwar Danesh blamed the insurgents for a lack of process in the ongoing intra-Afghan peace negotiations in the Qatari capital, Doha.

Deadly Kabul Attacks Expose Possible Divisions Within the Taliban

Major Afghan cities have been largely spared from the deadly militant attacks that once struck them regularly. The Taliban agreed to stop bombing urban centers under a landmark peace deal signed with the United States in February. The militant group largely complied, shifting its focus to the vast countryside, where it has wreaked havoc for months. But a spate of deadly militant attacks in Kabul has shattered the relative calm in the heavily fortified capital, prompting accusations by Afghan officials that the Taliban had broken its pledge.

IMF extends \$320m credit facility to Afghanistan

The International Monetary Fund approved the extension of \$320 million in credit to Afghanistan to help the country navigate the health crisis caused by the Covid-19 pandemic and a post-pandemic economic recovery. The 42-month arrangement will help the Central Asian country "anchor economic reforms and catalyse donor financing", the fund said in a statement.

Bangladesh

Indian Army Gifts 20 Trained Military Horses, 10 Mine-Detection Dogs to Bangladesh

The Indian Army gifted 20 fully-trained military horses and 10 mine-detection dogs to Bangladesh as part of the country's efforts to further strengthen bilateral ties.

The exercise demonstrates the U.S.'s continuing commitment to work with the Bangladesh military to address shared maritime security concerns in the region and strengthen partnerships to ensure a free and open Indo-Pacific region.

Nepal

India-Nepal launch construction of 3rd integrated check post to boost trade

India and Nepal launched the construction of a Rs 147.12-crore integrated check post (ICP) at Nepalgunj to streamline and boost cross-border trade, weeks ahead of a visit to Kathmandu by foreign secretary Harsh Shringla to take forward bilateral ties.

Sri Lanka has repaid USD 4.2 billion in foreign debt and avoided sovereign default, Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa said while presenting the 2020 budget in Parliament. Rajapaksa, who is also the Finance Minister, said the government had been able to stabilise the rupee against depreciation. "We were able to stabilise the exchange rate, which was steadily depreciating then at around the Rs 185 (to the US dollar) and to service the foreign debt of 4,200 million dollars, averting the country being classified into a debt default status, he said.
