

# Pakistan

Pakistan joins Saudi-led initiative for digital cooperation

Pakistan joined the Digital Cooperation Organisation (DCO), a Saudi-led initiative, aimed at promoting digital cooperation among member states. Besides Saudi Arabia and Pakistan, other members of the DCO are Bahrain, Egypt, Jordan, Kuwait and the UAE.

<u>Razak in talks with key players to finalise Preferential Trade Agreement with</u> <u>Kabul</u>

Pakistan has launched consultation with stakeholders to initiate formal negotiations with Afghanistan for reduction of duty and taxes under the proposed Preferential Trade Agreement (PTA). The proposed PTA is estimated to enhance volume of bilateral trade to nearly \$5 billion in the next five years from the current less than \$2bn. The negotiations are scheduled to be completed by end of January 2021.

Pakistanis join final trials for China-made vaccine

Thousands of volunteers are flocking to research hospitals across Pakistan as the country to join final-stage clinical trials of a Chinese-made vaccine for the coronavirus. It is the first time Pakistan has participated in such a trial. The vaccine is being developed by CanSinoBio and the Beijing Institute of Biotechnology China.

# Kashmir not on agenda of OIC foreign ministers' meeting

The Kashmir dispute has not been included in the agenda of the two-day meeting of foreign ministers of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) being held in Niger's capital Niamey from November 27. The OIC statements, both in English and Arabic, made no specific mention of Kashmir in the agenda announced in Riyadh.

Shuffle in top brass as six major generals promoted

Chief of the Army Staff Gen Qamar Javed Bajwa kept his core team intact as he reshuffled several key positions in the military bringing in new commanders for five of the 11 theater commands. Another reshuffle is expe-cted in coming days to fill the remaining vacancies.

UAE visa suspension for Pakistan, others due to security concerns: report

The United Arab Emirates has temporarily stopped issuing new visas to citizens of Pakistan, Afghanistan and several mostly Muslim majority countries over security concerns. Last week, the Foreign Office said the UAE had stopped processing new visas for Pakistani citizens and those of some other countries.

Riots in Gilgit-Baltistan over election results

The workers of Pakistan People's Party (PPP) and police clashed here, as the former protested against the unofficial results of Gilgit-Baltistan A-2, Gilgit-2 constituency. The PPP workers termed the results rigged and held a protest. Demonstrations were also staged in several areas of Gilgit-Baltistan, including Skardu and Chilas.

Three Daesh commanders killed in Bajaur

November 24, 2020, The News

The security forces spotted and killed Zubair, the operational commander of Daesh for Pakistan, in the Tangi area of Bajaur tribal district along with Azizur Rahman aka Fida, the commander for Karachi. Zubair, who was the right-hand man of Daud Mehsud, was stated to be the "wali" or governor of Daesh for Pakistan.

# PNS Zulfigar visits Agaba port of Jordan

Pakistan Navy ship Zulfiqar (with embarked helicopter) visited the Aqaba port, Jordan, as part of Pak Navy's overseas deployment to Mediterranean/Red Sea. Pakistan Navy ship after sailing from the Aqaba Port conducted passage exercise with RJNF fast attack craft Al Hassan (P 102), and two patrol crafts.

Pakistan balks at IMF demands over \$6 billion loan

November 22, 2020, The News

Talks between Pakistan and the IMF to restart a \$6b loan programme have stalled over Prime Minister Imran Khan's refusal to introduce unpopular measures. Formal discussions to release a tranche of funding have been pushed back over concerns from Islamabad that instituting the reforms tied to the loan would provoke a backlash from the hard-hit middle class.

US to launch regional funds for Pakistan, Afghanistan and Uzbekistan

November 21, 2020, Dawn

US special envoy Zalmay Khalilzad said that Washington will soon announce a high-level meeting of representatives from Afghanistan, Pakistan and Uzbekistan to encourage trade and development in that region. The United States, which will also participate in the meeting, is also launching a fund to encourage investments in the South and Central Asian region.

# Afghanistan

Pompeo Meets With Taliban, Afghan Negotiators To Press Cease-Fire

U. S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo called on Taliban leaders to swiftly negotiate a permanent cease-fire in Afghanistan after a meeting on November 21 in Qatar. Pompeo also called for a reduction in violence, a State Department spokesman said in a statement after Pompeo met Taliban deputy leader Mullah Abdul Ghani Baradar and other members of the group's negotiating team.

Japan pledges \$720 million for Afghan reconstruction

#### November 25, 2020, Japan Times

Japan pledged some \$720 million (¥75 billion) over the next four years for Afghan reconstruction at an international conference in Geneva that brought together some 100 countries and international organizations to help the wartorn country recover from years of violence. Foreign Minister Toshimitsu Motegi, in his statement, said, "Japan continues to stand with the Afghan government and its people. We will work on providing assistance from 2021 to 2024, maintaining the amount comparable to the past four years, which was \$180 million per year."

# Foreign aid to Afghanistan could reach \$12bn over four years, some with conditions

November 25, 2020, The National News

Foreign donors at a conference pledged a projected \$12 billion in civilian aid to Afghanistan over the next four years, but many made it conditional on protecting human rights and making progress on peace talks in a major shakeup for the country's economy. Ville Skinnari, Finland's minister for development co-operation and foreign trade whose government co-organised the conference, said donors had pledged \$3bn for next year, with annual commitments expected to continue at about the same level through to 2024. "This would amount to \$12 billion," he said.

Germany Starts Reducing Troops in Kunduz: Report

Germany is reducing its military presence in the northern province of Kunduz that was planned by NATO's mission in Kabul in late summer, Germany's military said. A spokesman for Germany's Joint Operations Command said the reduction is not a reaction to the United States' announcement last week that it will cut US forces in Afghanistan to 2,500 from 4,500 by mid-January. Germany started to redeploy its around 100 troops from the camp in Kunduz, which is located inside a larger Afghan base, about a week ago.

<u>13 Australia Soldiers Face Dismissal Over Afghan Killings</u>

Australia has told 13 special forces soldiers that they face dismissal in relation to a report on alleged unlawful killings in Afghanistan. A report published last week found that at least 39 unarmed Afghan civilians and prisoners were killed by 19 Australian soldiers in Afghanistan.

# Bangladesh

India, Bangladesh to hold virtual summit on December 17

In July, India provided 10 railway locomotives to Bangladesh, days after the first container train made its way to the Bangladeshi side and the first shipment of goods was sent from Kolkata to Tripura via Chattogram port. The two sides are

setting up a new mechanism to review progress on bilateral projects, with five such ventures.

Four MoUs likely between India, Bangladesh in December during Modi-Hasina summit

India and Bangladesh will sign four memorandum of understandings during the virtual summit between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Bangladeshi counterpart Sheikh Hasina in mid-December.

#### The Truth About Chinese Bonds

# U.S. Puts Tariffs on Chinese Twist-Ties
