

Pakistan

Gas-buying clause abolished for three LNG power plants

Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Limited's board of directors allowed a waiver of the minimum 66 per cent take-or-pay clause for three government-owned liquefied natural gas (LNG) power plants in Punjab in a bid to reduce the burden of capacity payments and increase the interest of both local and foreign investors in the government's plan of privatising these projects.

Ghastly murder of Lankan man in Sialkot shames nation

Furious workers of a garment factory in Sialkot tortured their Sri Lankan general manager to death over allegations of blasphemy and set the body on fire. The brutal killing drew widespread condemnation from government officials and human rights bodies.

Military court convicts rights activist of espionage

Rights and political activist Idris Khattak has been convicted of espionage and sentenced to 14 years rigorous imprisonment. The verdict was pronounced this week after the trial concluded in Jhelum. The source said he was tried under Pakistan Army Act and Official Secrets Act, 1923. He was accused of providing sensitive information to a foreign intelligence agency.

Pakistan to host OIC's extraordinary session on 19th

Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi says Pakistan is set to host an extraordinary session of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) to avert a humanitarian crisis which is rearing its head in Afghanistan following US withdrawal.

Saudi Arabia deposits \$3 billion in Pakistan's central bank

Pakistan received a \$3 billion deposit from Saudi Arabia which will help shore up the country's foreign currency reserves and stabilise the local currency. The Saudi money comes when Pakistan is facing deterioration in the balance of payments position amid depleting foreign exchange reserves and weak inflows. High current account deficit weighed down by the soaring import bill continues to put pressure on the rupee.

Religious scholars to oversee syllabus taught in educational institutions: Shahbaz Gill

Special Assistant to the Pakistan Prime Minister on Political Communication Shahbaz Gill has said that syllabus of educational institutions must nurture students' mindset in line with the Islamic code of life and ethics.

Public debt rises 4pc to Rs40.3trln by end October

Pakistan's public debt increased by 4 percent at the end of October 2021. Analysts said rising interest rates is likely to drive debt servicing cost higher in months ahead. The public debt amounted to Rs40.3 trillion by the end of October. It came at Rs38.7 trillion in June. The debt surged 13.44 percent year on year. It stood at Rs35.5 trillion at the end of October 2020.

Blasphemy convict acquitted after 11 years

Women shouldn't be forced into marriage, says Taliban decree

Afghanistan's Taliban regime released a decree on women's rights which said women should not be considered "property" and must consent to marriage, but failed to mention female access to education or work outside the home.

Pakistan permitted use of Afghan trucks for transporting Indian humanitarian aid to Afghanistan.

Afghan currency slides on bank collapse fears

US, West blast Taliban over 'summary killings' of former Afghan security forces

France, Europeans working to open mission in Afghanistan: Macron

Japan's support for U.S. forces to top ¥1 trillion over five years

Japan is planning to provide over ¥1 trillion in total under its Host Nation Support program for U.S. forces in Japan through the five years from fiscal 2022, multiple Japanese government sources have said. The amount will mark an increase from around ¥980 billion shouldered by the Japanese government to host the U.S. bases and troops in Japan between fiscal 2016 and fiscal 2020.

Japan's ruling coalition to seek fairer capital gains tax

Japan's ruling coalition sees a need to review financial capital gains taxes to ensure fairness, but wants to avoid putting off ordinary investors, according to a copy of the party's fiscal 2022 tax plan seen by Bloomberg. The ruling parties said in the document there was a need to consider rectifying a situation in which people with higher incomes sometimes pay lower rates of tax.

In parliamentary debut, new CDP leader tries policy-focused approach

Constitutional Democratic Party President Kenta Izumi made his parliamentary debut as party leader Wednesday, questioning Prime Minister Fumio Kishida over issues ranging from the government's coronavirus response to constitutional revision. It was the first time since Izumi, 47, was

elected CDP president last month that the leaders of the government and the largest opposition party had faced off against each other, and the exchange was remarkably cordial and free of rhetorical fireworks.

Faltering capital spending saps Japan's economic growth

Many Japanese companies have been shying away from investing in domestic plants and equipment as they fret about potential overcapacity locally and turn overseas for expansion, keeping the country's capital spending in the doldrums and dragging on growth in the world's No. 3 economy. The nation's productive capital stock -- or total value of all production facilities and equipment held by private companies assessed by using an age-efficiency profile and retirement pattern -- has increased less than 10% over the past two decades, according to OECD, way behind a rise of 50% in the U.S. and 60% in the U.K.

Abe throws full support behind Kishida at Tokyo fund-raiser

Former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe is back on the front line of Japanese politics, this time as head of the largest faction of the ruling Liberal Democratic Party, a move described as "the starting shot of his comeback." Addressing his first fund-raising party since taking command of the faction, Abe on Dec. 6 pledged to continue to support the new Kishida administration where senior members of his faction fill crucial posts. "I vow that all 95 members of our faction will unite and firmly support the Kishida administration," he said.

In speech, Kishida lays out bold plans for health, economic and defense policies

Prime Minister Fumio Kishida went on the offensive Monday to lay out a blueprint for containing the omicron variant, invigorating the weakening Japanese economy and reinforcing the country's defense programs even at the risk of upsetting the ruling party's coalition partner. In his second policy speech as prime minister, Kishida introduced an array of policy specifics, vowing to administer coronavirus booster shots earlier, expand tax credits for firms that raise wages and complete national security strategy updates within a year.

Korea

South Korea, Japan to be united by 1st free trade pact in February

South Korea is now set to put the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership into force on Feb. 1, an arrangement that will give it its first free

trade deal with neighbouring Japan. RCEP will take effect Jan. 1 for 10 parties that completed the ratification process by Nov. 2, when the necessary conditions were met: China, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam, Brunei, Cambodia and Laos.

Moon encourages corporate efforts for carbon neutrality goal

South Korean President Moon Jae-in lauded the efforts made by companies to cut carbon emissions, and reiterated that the goal to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050 is "must" for the country. In celebration of the first anniversary of the declaration of the country's 2050 carbon neutral vision, Moon invited company leaders and economic organizations to check on the year's progress and renew their determination, according to the presidential office.

At Biden's summit, Moon bills Korea as 'exemplary testament' to democracy

President Moon Jae-in said that South Korea is an "exemplary testament" to the value of democracy, citing the Korean people's struggle against authoritarianism and move for peaceful revolutions. Moon made the remarks at a virtual democracy summit of leaders of more than 110 countries hosted by the U.S. President Joe Biden.

Yoon leads Lee by 8.2 percentage points in presidential race: survey

Yoon Suk-yeol, the presidential nominee of the main opposition People Power Party, is leading his rival Lee Jae-myung of the ruling Democratic Party by 8.2 percentage points in a hypothetical multicandidate race, a survey showed. Yoon earned 45.3 percent support against Lee's 37.1 percent in the survey of 1,036 adults conducted Monday and Tuesday by Realmeter.
