

India

PM targets \$5 billion defence exports over the next five years

February 6, 2020, Live Mint

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday set a target of \$5 billion in defence exports in next five years for India as he invited private businesses to invest in the country, which he said would realize the twin objectives of handsome returns on investment and making Asia's third largest economy self reliant in defence manufacturing.

Cabinet Waives Rule For Alliance Air's Operations On India-Sri Lanka Route

The Cabinet approved an ex post facto (with retrospective force) dispensation to Air India's subsidiary Alliance Air to conduct flight operations between India and Sri Lanka, waiving the rule that an airline needs to have minimum 20 aircraft to operate internationally.

<u>DefExpo 2020: US wants security partner India to purchase its arms</u>

The US ambassador to India, Kenneth Juster, has pitched strongly for India buying American military equipment because, as security partners, it would be useful for the country's weaponry and command and communications networks to be interoperable with those of the United States'. The US envoy was interacting with the media on the eve of DefExpo 2020. He minced no words in urging India to buy American weaponry. "US firms at this exhibition... have supplied modern landand sea-based fighter aircraft, ballistic missile defence systems, the most advanced, networked avionics equipment, and secure communications equipment for the United States and our partners. They are poised to offer the same to India," he stated.

Defence Procurement from India Falls 10.8% In FY19; Lowest In 5 years

After a continuous increase in defence spending in the country, leveraging Made in India products, the procurement from Indian vendors fell to its lowest level of five years in 2019. The details tabled by ShripadNaik, Minister of State for Defence in the Lok Sabha on February 05 showed that over the last five years, while the

procurement from Indian vendors had increased, in 2018-19, this fell by 10.8% on a Y-o-Y basis.

HAL in tripartite pact for UAVs

Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL), Israel Aerospace Industries Limited (IAI) and Dynamatic Technologies Ltd (DTL) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for marketing, manufacturing and selling IAI's unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) to potential Indian customers such as the Defence Forces, Paramilitary Forces and Central Armed Police Forces, at DefExpo 2020 in Lucknow.

French defence company Thales to ramp up India operations

French defence and engineering giant Thales says that it looking at significantly ramping up its Indian operations and will be hiring "thousands of engineers" here in the near future as it focuses on emerging technologies like artificial intelligence (AI). The company, which has a major work share in French military platforms including the Rafale fighter jets that have been ordered by India, currently has 1,600 employees in India that work on cutting-edge technologies.

India, U.K. to sign pact on jet engine development

Britain working on govt.-to-govt. framework for defence deals in future given New Delhi's preference for route

India and the U.K. are exploring various options for collaboration on joint defence projects and are close to signing a government-to-government agreement on jet engine technology development, U.K. Minister for Defence Procurement James Heappey said.

Speaking at 'India-Israel Opportunities in Defence Cooperation: Future Vectors of the Digital Battlefield', organised by FICCI, in collaboration with SIBAT (Israel Ministry of Defence) and Indian Ministry of Defence (MoD) at DefExpo 2020, Apurva Chandra, Director General (Acquisition) and Additional Secretary, Department of Defence, Govt of India, said that Israel is the largest contributor to India's preparedness of any adversaries and has been always forthcoming to share

high-end technology. He expressed his confidence on a continued partnership with Israel as all the MoD contracts so far have been concluded on time and the overall experience with Israel has been highly satisfying.

New weapons purchases suffer under India's latest defense budget

India's defense budget for 2020-2021 will be \$73.65 billion, but officials and analysts are warning the amount is unlikely to meet new demands for weapons purchases and military modernization, as India is set to spend about 90 percent if its defense funds on existing obligations. Of the total budget, \$18.52 billion is for weapons purchases; \$32.7 billion is for maintenance of the military's weapons inventory, pay and allowances, infrastructure, and recurring expenses; and \$21.91 billion is for defense pensions.

Pakistan

PM regrets missing KL Summit over others' misconception 'it would divide ummah'

Prime Minister Imran Khan expressed his regret on being unable to attend the Kuala Lumpur Summit, held in Malaysia in December of last year, adding that there was a misconception among some countries that the conference would divide the ummah. Addressing a joint press conference following talks with Malaysian Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad in Putrajaya, Prime Minister Imran said: "I want to say how sad I was that I couldn't attend the conference in Kuala Lumpur in the middle of December.

'Stable outlook' for Pakistan's banks over the next 12-18 months: Moody's

Moody's Investors Services announced a "stable outlook" for Pakistan's banking system over the next 12-18 months underpinned by "robust funding and liquidity and close links with the sovereign".

Three TTP terrorists arrested from Faisalabad

Three terrorists of banned Tehreek Taliban Pakistan (TTP) were arrested by CTD in an intelligence based operation (IBO) conducted in Faisalabad. A CTD team recovered explosives and arms from the terrorists.

Saudi Arabia unwilling to back OIC ministers' meeting on Kashmir

As the Senior Officials Meeting of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation starts in Jeddah on Feb 9 to make preparations for the OIC's Council of Foreign Ministers, a diplomatic source said that Saudi Arabia has shown reluctance to accept Pakistan's request for an immediate meeting of the CFM on Kashmir.

'Africa likely to use Gwadar Port, CPEC to have access to CARs, China'

Africa countries have positively indicated to using CPEC (China-Pakistan Economic Corridor) and Gwadar Port to ensure access for its products to the markets of Central Asian Republics (CARs) and China. And more importantly Africa has also shown its willingness to start negotiations with Pakistan on Early Harvest that will stimulate the growth of Pak-African trade volume up to \$8 billion in the next five years' time. Kenya's central bank has also agreed to allow Pakistani banks to open up their branches to facilitate the country's exporters in Africa.

Foreign investment in govt debt touches \$2.915 billion

Foreign investment in government securities has reached \$2.915 billion in the current fiscal year of 2019/20. The country received a net \$2.879 billion foreign investment in short term treasury bills from July 1, 2019 to January 30, 2020. Pakistan Investment Bonds attracted \$36 million foreign investment in the period under review.

Afghanistan

American contractor kidnapped in Afghanistan by Taliban-linked terror group: report

A U.S. contractor from Illinois was kidnapped by Taliban-associated militants in Afghanistan last week, prompting a nationwide search involving the FBI and State Department, according to a report.Mark R. Frerichs, 55, of Lombard, Ill., was abducted on January 31 in the province of Khost. The southeastern province borders the Federally Administered Tribal Areas, an underdeveloped region between Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Afghanistan begins work on CASA-1000 power project

Afghanistan's President Ashraf Ghani officially inaugurated the work on the CASA-1000 hydro power project, one of the biggest power projects in the region, which will transfer 300 megawatts of electricity from Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan to Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Sources: 'US makes new terms for reduction in violence'

US and Taliban delegates in Qatar are working out the terms for a reduction in violence as part of ongoing peace talks, and sources familiar with the talks say the United States has recently made several new demands with the reduction in violence plan.

India allocates \$13.9 M for Chabahar Port

The Indian government has allocated \$13.9 million for the development of the strategic Chabahar Port in southeast Iran. India's decision to more than double the outlay for developing the strategic Chabahar port in Iran in fiscal year 2020-21 signals the "government's determination to push ahead" with the project after a "clear signal" from the US that it won't be affected by sanctions.

Coronavirus outbreak affects China-Afghan trade: officials

Afghan officials say the coronavirus outbreak in China has affected trade relations between the two countries. Air corridors are the most direct route for Afghan investors to send their exports to China, and statistics by the Chamber of Commerce and Investment reveal that more than 20 metric tons of Afghan dry fruit and saffron are sent to China every week by Turkish Airlines flights, but the flights have stopped since the coronavirus outbreak.

Bangladesh

<u>India-Bangladesh joint military exercise begins in Meghalaya</u>

As part of the ongoing Indo-Bangladesh defence cooperation, a joint military training exercise Sampriti-IX has been started in Meghalaya. The ninth edition

exercise is scheduled to be conducted at the state-of-the-art Joint Training Node at Umroi Cantonment, about 25 km from Shillong, and will conclude on February 16. The exercise Sampriti is an important bilateral defence cooperation endeavour between India and Bangladesh and will be the ninth edition of the exercise which is hosted alternately by both countries.

3 instruments likely to be inked during PM's Italy visit

Foreign minister Dr AK Abdul Momen has said three bilateral instruments between Bangladesh and Italy are likely to be signed during Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's visit to Rome starting on February 4. The prime minister is set to leave Dhaka for Rome on February 4, on a four-day bilateral official visit to Italy at the invitation of her Italian counterpart Giuseppe Conte. The proposed agreements are on cultural exchange, political consultations and cooperation in the diplomatic field, he added.

Army chief goes to Nepal today

Chief of army staff General Aziz Ahmed would begin a five-day tour of Nepal. The army chief would meet Nepal's to leaders and visit civil and military installations in the land-locked country, according to the Inter Services Public Relations directorate. The visit is aimed at strengthening mutual cooperation between the armies of Bangladesh and Nepal including exchange of training.

Bangladesh Navy to get new bank

The central bank of Bangladesh is planning to award a licence for a new commercial bank, called Maritime Bank Ltd, amid plenty of banks buffeted by dull business in a sagging investment regime. The bank was proposed by the Bangladesh Navy, the naval warfare branch of Bangladesh Armed Forces.

Bhutan

Bhutan makes Indians pay 'sustainable development fee'

Bhutan's lower house of parliament passed legislation meaning that visitors from India, Bangladesh, and the Maldives have to pay a fee of 1,200 ngultrums (USD 16.85) per day from JulyBhutan is introducing a "sustainable development fee" for

regional tourists following a spike in Indian visitors that has sparked worries for the unique Himalayan kingdom's cherished ecology.

Bhutan Stock Index launched

The Royal Securities Exchange of Bhutan launched the Bhutan Stock Index (BSI) in Thimphu. The stock index shows the direction of security price movements and reflects market sentiments. There are 22 listed companies in RSEBL.

Nepal

BHEL bags second hydroelectric project order in Nepal

State-run engineering firm BHEL said it has bagged an order for electromechanical works for 40 MW Rahughat Hydroelectric Project in Nepal. This is the second consecutive success for BHEL in the hydro power sector of Nepal. Last year, it had won an order for the largest hydropower project in Nepal, 900 MW Arun-3 HEP, which is presently under construction.

SJVN ties up finance for 900 MW power project in Nepal

Power producer SJVN has tied up finance for its 900 MW hydropower project, which will cost around Rs 11,000 crore Nepalese rupees (INR 6,880 crore), a release said. Representatives of SJVN Ltd signed agreements with banks during a ceremony. The SJVN Arun–3 Power Development Company (SAPDC) will invest NPR 11,000 crore in the next five years.

Sri Lanka

Mahinda Rajapaksa's visit could relaunch India-Lanka-Maldives NSA dialogue

Sri Lankan PM Mahinda Rajapaksa visit from February 7-11 will seek to revive India-Sri Lanka-Maldives NSA level dialogue and trilateral maritime security coop in Indian Ocean Region amid growing Chinese interests. A pact to establish air link could also be established between Sanchi in MP and Sri Lanka for Buddhist pilgrims from the island nation.

<u>During Mahinda Rajapaksa's India visit, New Delhi likely to raise Sri Lankan Hindu</u> Tamil's issues

Sri Lankan Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa's official visit to India, that begins on Friday, is taking place a few months after he assumed office and his brother Gotabaya Rajapaksa was sworn in as president. The two were voted to office on a Sinhala nationalist wave, a sentiment that isn't primarily anti-Tamil this time, but a fallout of the Easter attacks on Christian shrines, including the Saint Anthony's shrine, in April last year.

Rajapaksa to finalize contours of \$450 mn funding during visit

India and Sri Lanka will work out the details of projects to be taken up under a \$450 million line of credit during Sri Lankan Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa's visit to India from 7 to 11 February. Pakistan's Air Chief to visit Sri Lanka

During his stay in Sri Lanka, Air Chief will meet Commanders of the Air Force, Navy and State Minister for Defence. He will also call on Hon. Prime Minister of Sri Lanka.

Russian Commander-in-Chief of Land Forces arrives in Sri Lanka

Russian Commander-in-Chief of Land Forces, General of the Army, OlegSalyukov of the Ministry of Defence of the Russian Federation arrived in Sri Lanka on a five-day goodwill tour at the invitation of his Sri Lankan counterpart, Lieutenant General Shavendra Silva. During his stay, he is scheduled to call on the President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, Prime Minister, acting Chief of Defence Staff and Commander of the Army, Commander of the Navy, and Commander of the Air Force.

Gopal Baglay appointed new Indian High Commissioner to Sri Lanka

Senior diplomat Shri Gopal Baglay has been appointed High Commissioner of India to Sri Lanka, the country's Ministry of External Affairs said. Mr. Baglay, currently serves at the Prime Minister's Office and has held many key positions including spokesperson of the MEA and Deputy High Commissioner of India to Pakistan.
