

India rejects China's objection to Shah's Arunachal visit

<u>Cabinet Committee on Security clears procurement of 24 US multi-role</u> <u>helicopters for Indian Navy</u>

The Cabinet Committee on Security headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi cleared the procurement of 24 MH-60R Seahawk multi-role helicopters worth \$2.6 billion for the Indian Navy. The 24 Lockheed Martin helicopters will be procured through the foreign military sales (FMS) route from the US government.

India becomes 5th largest economy, overtakes UK, France: Report

Indian defence to work under theatre commands just like US and China

Foreign Minister Gyawali leaves for Bangladesh

The two foreign ministers will review overall aspects of the bilateral relations and exchange views on various matters of mutual interest such as energy, trade, transit, connectivity, tourism and cooperation on regional and multilateral issues.

PM Sheikh Hasina offers airport, seaport facilities to Nepal

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina offered Bangladesh's airport and seaport facilities to Nepal as part of Dhaka's commitment for regional connectivity for shared prosperity as Nepal's visiting Foreign Minister Pradip Kumar Gyawali called on her at the Prime Minister's Office. Sheikh Hasina, told Gyawali that her government was updating Syedpur Airport as an international aviation facility expecting it to be an important centre for regional connectivity, While Nepal and Bhutan could use Syedpur Airport; Chattogram and Mongla seaports for the mutual benefits.

Bangladesh to sign Free Trade Agreement with Nepal

Bangladesh and Nepal have agreed to sign a Free Trade Agreement to enhance trade between the two countries. Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka, Bangladesh agreed to IMF to provide debt relief for Somalia

Sri Lanka and Bangladesh have reportedly agreed to provide debt relief for Somalia under the Heavily Indebted Poor Countries (HIPC) Initiative of the International Monetary fund (IMF). The Central Bank of Sri Lanka and the Ministry of Foreign Relations have expressed their concurrence to provide Sri Lanka's contribution and the cabinet has approved to transfer a sum equivalent to 163 million rupees as Sri Lanka's total contribution to the Somaliya Administered Account.

U.S. Bars Sri Lankan Army Chief Accused of War Crimes

The United States has imposed an entry bar on Sri Lanka's army chief, Lt. Gen. Shavendra Silva, citing his alleged involvement in war crimes during the final stages of the country's civil war. The travel restriction on the general is the first significant international penalty to be imposed on a Sri Lankan official over atrocities committed during the country's 26-year civil war with Tamil Tiger militants, which ground to a halt in 2009.

Sri Lanka warns US of consequences following ban on Silva

Sri Lanka has warned the United States of the consequences following a ban on Lt. Gen. Shavendra Silva, Commander of the Army and Acting Chief of Defence Staff, as well as his immediate family. Sri Lanka decides to withdraw from UN consensus resolutions - report

The Sri Lankan government has decided to immediately withdraw from the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) resolutions 30/1 and 40/1 cosponsored by the good governance government in 2015 and 2019 respectively. The move was taken as implementing the resolutions under the current political climate is inconsistent with the current government's political policy.

India, Sri Lanka to ink MoU to develop Palaly airport in Jaffna

The decision comes a day after the Sri Lankan Cabinet approved a proposal for the MoU with India for the project, which would include terminal modification, electricity supplies, utility services and transit facilities to be improved. "India has already agreed to provide Sri Lanka with a grant of 300 million Sri Lankan rupees (Rs 11.83 cr) for the development of the airport which started its international flights last year," the statement said.

Japan firm lands massive Sri Lanka airport contract

A Japanese firm was chosen by Colombo today to build a new US\$570 million (RM2.3 billion) terminal for Sri Lanka's main airport, as Tokyo re-emerges as a key infrastructure backer amid a raft of Chinese projects. The cabinet announced the Taisei Corporation was picked to develop the Japanese-funded project, with the

new terminal expected to double capacity at Bandaranaike International airport to around 20 million passengers a year.

Turkey seeks to work with Sri Lanka to combat extremism

DernetSekeroioglu said that at a time when Turkey is confronting terrorism within and outside her borders, lessons from Sri Lanka's very own experiences against the LTTE would be of much value.
