

India

US approves sale of anti-ship missiles, torpedoes worth USD 155 million to India

The Trump administration has notified the Congress of its determination to sell Harpoon air-launched anti-ship missiles and Mark 54 lightweight torpedoes worth USD 155 million to India to enhance its deterrent capabilities against "regional threats" and to bolster its homeland defence.

The Asian Development Bank (ADB) has agreed to lend \$800 million to Pakistan to help the country combat challenges posed by the novel coronavirus, after the lender tripled its pandemic response size in the region to \$20 billion.

Pakistan urges China to soften terms for power deals

Pakistan has requested China for ease in payment obligations of over \$30 billion worth of about 12,000-megawatt power projects under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) to minimise its financial and economic difficulties.

IMF sees negative 1.5pc growth in Pakistan this year

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) projected economic recession for Pakistan following the coronavirus-related 'The Great Lockdown' that would sharply contract the global economy this year. The fund projected Pakistan's economy to shrink by 1.5pc during this fiscal year, compared to 3.3pc growth in 2018-19. These estimates are generally comparable with 1.3pc decline in the country's economic output forecast by the World Bank.

Lockdown eased, extended for two weeks

Pakistan wins \$1.4b IMF emergency loan

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) approved an emergency loan of \$1.4 billion for Pakistan, as Islamabad is also expected to get around \$1.5 billion relief in the shape of delay in repayment of loans to bilateral creditors.

Taliban free 20 Afghan prisoners

Taliban Denies 'Charter' Document

NATO Committed to ANDSF Despite Planned Troop Decrease
