

IMF sees Pakistan's \$1.9bln to fizzle out in 15 months

Pakistan's gross international reserves are likely to dip \$1.82 billion over the next 15 months as the pandemic is taking toll on the country's exports, remittances and foreign inflows, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said. IMF estimated gross international reserves for pre-COVID-19 scenario at around \$12.6 billion for the current fiscal year, but they are now estimated to decline to \$11.9 billion till June-end 2020, indicating a \$587 million drop.

Arif Wazir, a key leader of the Pashtun Tahaffuz Movement (PTM) who suffered serious injuries in a gun attack in South Waziristan tribal district, died in Islamabad's Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (Pims). His body was later sent to Wana, the district headquarters of South Waziristan.

Govt to end lockdown from 9th in phases

Prime Minister Imran Khan announced that the National Coordination Committee on Covid-19 had decided to end the coronavirus-induced lockdown imposed across the country for nearly one and a half months from May 9 (Saturday) in different phases as the tally of patients suffering from the infections surged past 24,500 and the death toll moved close to 600.

Afghanistan

Abdullah says 'tentative' agreement reached with Ghani

A bitter feud between Afghan President Ashraf Ghani and his rival Abdullah Abdullah appeared closer to resolution after Abdullah said the two men had moved forward in talks. "We have made progress in negotiations & reached tentative agreement on a range of principles. Work on details is underway to finalise the agreement," Abdullah said on Twitter.

At least five killed in attack on Afghan military centre

The Taliban claimed responsibility for a truck bomb in southern Helmand province that killed at least five Afghan security force members. The attack took place at a military centre where at least 150 members of the Afghan army and intelligence wing were stationed on May 3. Afghan government forces in the last two months have suffered heavy casualties across the country. The violence poses an immediate threat to a fragile peace deal between the United States and the Taliban, signed in February, as the military is forced to fight an emboldened Taliban with less US support.

US's Khalilzad Meets with Indian Officials on Afghan Peace

The US peace envoy for Afghanistan, Zalmay Khalilzad, on May 7met with Indian officials and discussed the US peace and reconciliation efforts in Afghanistan. Khalilzad was accompanied by the senior director in the US National Security Council, Lisa Curtis, and the US ambassador to India, Mr. Ken Juster.

933 Taliban Prisoners Freed by Afghan Govt, More Promised

The Afghan government released about 31 Taliban prisoners on May 6 from Pulie-Charkhi prison in Kabul, bringing the number of released Taliban prisoners to 933. The NSC said that with the release of 527 Taliban in the upcoming days the numbers will reach 1,500, and the "first round" of the prisoner release will be complete.

Afghan lawmakers say 45 migrants drowned after Iranian guards forced them into river

Iranian border guards killed 45 Afghan migrant workers trying to cross into Iran this month by forcing them into a raging mountain torrent at gunpoint, according to two Afghan lawmakers investigating the deaths. The incident has triggered a diplomatic crisis between the neighbours, who share trade, economic and cultural ties. Iran has denied that such an event took place on its soil.

U.S. Afghanistan envoy, Taliban leaders hold 'lengthy' meeting on Afghan peace

The U.S. special envoy to Afghanistan said he participated in a "lengthy" meeting with Taliban leaders as the militant group and Afghan government concerns mount that a peace deal could crumble amid ongoing violence and the coronavirus pandemic. Zalmay Khalilzad, who has led the U.S. negotiations, met with the representatives in Doha, Qatar, the State Department announced, as part of a regional trip in support of reducing violence and continuing intra-Afghan dialogue with the Taliban.

China Ramps Up Role In Afghanistan Ahead of U.S. Withdrawal

As the United States and its allies begin what looks like a final drawdown of their forces from Afghanistan, China appears to be expanding its role and influence in

the country. Beijing is actively enhancing contacts and possibly building robust relations with the Afghan government in Kabul and the Taliban, visibly pushing for a reconciliation between its longstanding ally Pakistan and Afghanistan. China is underpinning its diplomacy with the prospects of greater trade and investment in the impoverished country.

Bengal blocks goods at Bangladesh border, warned

The Centre has slammed the West Bengal Government for not allowing the movement of goods carriers through Indo-Bangladesh border, which, it said, is an "act of violation of the Constitution and will have international implications".

Traders said that trucks loaded with rice are stuck at the border, causing daily losses to the freight companies.
