

Except two survivors, all 97 passengers and crewmembers of the Pakistan International Airlines plane that crashed into a densely-populated area near Karachi airport on May 22 were confirmed dead after their bodies were recovered during an operation.

### Govt considers resuming lockdown amid SOPs violations

With the number of coronavirus cases and deaths increasing and people having severely violated standard operating procedures for Covid-19 during the Eid holidays, Pakistan Government is considering resuming the lockdown across the country.

### Pakistan needs to import up to 200,000tns wheat every month

Pakistan needs to import 100,000 to 200,000 tons of wheat every month till April next year to check price hike in the domestic market as local production is not sufficient to stabilise grain supplies. An estimate says wheat production runs short of about one million tons and may be around 25.7 to 26 million tons this year. There is about 0.7 to 1.0 million tons less output in Punjab alone if compared with the provincial output target.

## Afghanistan

Afghanistan's Mass Release of Taliban Prisoners Revives Peace Process, But Seen As 'Big Gamble'

Afghanistan's flagging peace process was on the verge of collapse following weeks of devastating militant attacks, mounting public anger, and the halt of a major prisoner swap. But a brief cease-fire between the government and the Taliban has breathed new life into efforts to negotiate an end to the nearly 19-year war. The May 24-26 truce, which coincided with the Eid al-Fitr Islamic holiday, largely held across the country. In what it said was a "goodwill" gesture, the government freed 1,000 Taliban prisoners -- 900 of them in a single day -- the largest group so far. The developments have raised prospects of an extended cessation of hostilities

and the long-delayed launch of direct talks between the government and militants over a permanent cease-fire and a future power-sharing agreement.

#### Taliban Team in Kabul to Discuss Prisoner Release

A five-member delegation from the Taliban arrived in Kabul to discuss the issue of the Taliban's prisoners. According to the Taliban spokesperson Suhail Shaheen, the Taliban's technical team will certify the identity of the prisoners. Shaheen said that the group released 80 members of Afghan forces in Baghlan and Kunduz provinces on Thursday. The Afghan government has stated they will work together with the Taliban's team about the swap.

### US, Afghanistan, Uzbekistan Agree to Expand Cooperation

Senior officials from Afghanistan, the United States and Uzbekistan on May 27 held a virtual meeting on the situation in Afghanistan, and the three pledged to work together and address mutual issues of concern including political ties, security and economic and human development matters. The meeting was cochaired by American Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs David Hale, Afghanistan's acting Foreign Minister Mohammed Haneef Atmar, and Uzbekistan's Foreign Minister Abdulaziz Kamilov. Later on, the three countries issued a joint statement in which the three nations pledged to further expand their cooperation.

## UNSC will not lift sanctions from Taliban: Russian envoy

On May 29, the UN Security Council had been expected to vote on lifting sanctions from the Taliban in accordance with an agreement signed between the movement and the US in Doha on Feb. 29. But the issue will not be raised because some conditions stipulated by the deal have yet to be met, said Russia's presidential envoy for Afghanistan Zamir Kabulov. "This was supposed to be done by May 29 on condition that the inter-Afghan talks had to start by March 10, but they have not yet been launched," he said.
