

Pakistan plans to raise \$1.5bn in Eurobonds, officials say

Pakistan plans to raise \$1.5 billion through Eurobonds to bridge a balance of payments gap for the financial year beginning July 1. With the country's fiscal deficit likely to rise as high as 9.4 per cent and a shortfall in revenues due to Covid-19 economic losses, Pakistan desperately needs funds to stave off balance of payment pressure caused by dwindling foreign reserves and a current account deficit.

Two High Commission officials expelled by India

In particular, the report noted that the Taliban continues to operate with ally and guerrilla insurgent group – the Haqqani network.
