

Economic shock and health crisis associated with Covid-19 will challenge Pakistan's ability to narrow the fiscal deficit to seven per cent in the FY21, said Fitch Ratings. The rating agency's commentary comes a week after the government announced the FY21 budget in which it projected a 28pc increase in tax revenues and expects to collect Rs4.963 trillion. The agency said it is skeptical of the government's ability to meet these targets due to the prevalent economic slowdown and absence of new taxes in the budget.

PPIB approves documents to execute hydropower projects under CPEC

\$10 bn TAPI gas pipeline project fails to achieve financial closure

The Turkmen Gas Company on the much touted trans-nations (Turkmenistan-Afghanistan-Pakistan-India) TAPI gas pipeline project of worth \$10 billion even after the lapse of 4 years has so far failed to achieve financial closure as earlier it was scheduled to be attained in December 2016. Now the authorities concerned in Pakistan are saying that Turkmenistan Gas Company is now tasked to complete the financial closure in next year 2021 which is why the project will come on stream in 2023 which was earlier due to be operational in 2020 under its original plan.

Govt to raise \$700m for National Space Programme

Pakistan government has decided to increase the use of Pakistani satellite services in the country by limiting foreign satellite services which will enable the country to raise the amount up to \$700 million to be used for the National Space Programme. To this effect, the federal cabinet accorded approval to the policy guidelines which, when implemented, will raise \$600-700 million for the National Space Programme till 2030.

Pakistan Remains 'Safe Haven' for 'Terrorist Groups': US Report

In an annual report released on June 24, the US State Department said Pakistan continued to serve as a "safe haven for certain regionally focused terrorist groups." "It allowed groups targeting Afghanistan, including the Afghan Taliban and affiliated HQN (Haqqani network), as well as groups targeting India, including LeT (Lashkar-e-Taiba) and its affiliated front organizations, and JeM (Jaish-e-Mohammed), to operate from its territory," it said.

New World Drug Report: Opium production in Afghanistan remained the same in 2019

According to the United Nations Drugs and Crime Office's (UNODC) World Drug Report, opium cultivation in Afghanistan decreased in 2019 following price falls after the bumper years in 2017 and 2018. However, in 2019 when weather conditions were optimal for growing poppy and plant disease absent, yields were high. Overall, that meant production figures were the same as in 2018. With almost no eradication and diminishing alternative livelihoods initiatives, government actions had almost no effect on illicit farming.
