

India

India, US to sign landmark defence pact to share high-end military technology, logistics today

India and the US will ink a landmark defence pact that will provide for sharing of high-end military technology, logistics and geospatial maps between their militaries, officials said after Defence Minister Rajnath Singh held wideranging talks with his US counterpart Mark T Esper.

Afghanistan

Claimed by IS, suicide attack kills 18 in Kabul

A suicide bom-ber struck near an education centre in the Afghan capital, killing at least 18 people in an attack claimed by the militant Islamic State (IS) group. Violence on the ground has spiked in recent weeks despite the Taliban and the Afghan government holding peace talks in Qatar to end the country's grinding war.

Key Al-Qaeda leaderAl-Masri killed in Afghanistan

Afghan forces have killed a top Al-Qaeda militant wanted by the United States, as the government accused the Taliban of still keeping close ties with the Islamist militant group. Abu Muhsin Al-Masri, an Egyptian national believed to be the group's number two in the Indian Sub-continent, was targeted in eastern Ghazni province, Afghanistan's intelligence agency said in a statement. The National Directorate of Security did not providefurther details about the operation or when it was carried out.

'We Backed US Forces' Presence in Afghanistan': Putin

Russia's President Vladimir Putin has said that the continued presence of US troops in Afghanistan is beneficial for overall security. "Initially, we backed US forces' presence in Afghanistan and earlier voted in favor of a respective UN Security Council resolution. I still believe that US presence in Afghanistan does not run counter to our external interests," Putin said in an interview.

US service member dies in Afghanistan chopper crash

A U.S. service member was killed in a helicopter crash in Afghanistan that left six other crew members injured, NATO said in a statement. The crash occurred in Afghanistan's eastern Logar province and "was not the result of enemy

action," according to the statement. A spokesperson for the Taliban had previously claimed responsibility for the crash.

Govt To Build Two More Dams on Harirod River

The Ministry of Energy and Water of Afghanistan is working on the procurement process for two dam projects which will be built on the Harirod River in Herat province – in the west of Afghanistan. The biggest plant on the Harirod River is the Salma Dam built by India. The budget for Teerpul and Kabgan power dams will be allocated for the Ministry of Energy and Water in the next fiscal year.

Pakistan

Pakistan to repay \$4.4bln on foreign commercial loans in FY2021

Pakistan has to repay \$4.4 billion on account of foreign commercial loans during the current fiscal year of 2020/21, indicating a pressure building up on forex reserves amid uncertainty over IMF's stalled program. The country has to make total external debt repayments to the tune of \$10.3 billion during this year. It just paid out \$798 million out of it. The remaining amount of over \$9.5 billion is to be paid in 10 months period. The total external debt repayment of \$10.3 billion constitutes \$8.5 billion as principle payment of loans and \$1.8 billion as interest repayment.

FATF keeps Pakistan on grey list till Feb 2021

The Financial Action Task Force (FATF) announced to keep Pakistan on the grey list till February 2021. The FATF took the stance that Pakistan would have to comply with the remaining six items out of 27 action plans to come out from the jurisdiction under increased monitoring.

Learning poverty in Pakistan may rise to 79pc due to Covid

A new World Bank report suggests that learning poverty in Pakistan will go up to 79 per cent as a result of school closure during the Covid-19 pandemic. Learning poverty means being unable to read and understand a simple text by age 10. Currently, 53pc of children in low- and middle-income countries cannot read and understand a simple story by the end of their primary school-level education.

Food imports grow amid wheat, sugar shortages

Increasing wheat imports along with those of tea, palm oil, spices and sugar caused a whopping jump of 56 per cent in the country's food import bill in the first quarter of 2020-21. It amounted to \$1.71 billion in the three-month period. In 2019-20, the food import bill plunged 4.31pc to \$5.42bn.

Pak-Afghan forum adopts 140 proposals to promote trade

Pakistan and Afghanistan adopted more than 140 recommendations to promote bilateral trade and investments. The two-day Pak-Afghan Trade and Investment conference which concluded on October 27 recommended the Pakistani government to allow five-year business and residence visa to all Afghans who are willing to start businesses in Pakistan.

55 suspects arrested over seminary bombing

The police arrested 55 suspects in Yakatoot area here over the seminary bombing, which killed eight people and injured 120. A statement issued here said the arrests came during a major crackdown, which was launched by the Rapid Response Force, Ladies Police and Bomb Disposal Unit in Dir Colony, where the bomb blast had occurred, and adjoining areas.

ExxonMobil scraps LNG terminal plan

US energy giant ExxonMobil has scrapped a plan to establish a liquefied natural gas (LNG) terminal in Pakistan. It had partnered with a consortium of Energas Terminal (Pvt) Limited that was setting up the LNG terminal in the country.

Fifth plenary session proves China's endurance, stamina: Global Times editorial

The communiqué outlines the main objectives of the 14th Five-Year Plan - to seek new achievements in six areas - and the long-term vision to realize socialist modernization by 2035. The plenary session has continued the overall plan of the 19th National Congress of the CPC, and maintained the strategic pace and spiritual outlook of China's advancement, which shows China's strong endurance and stamina amid changes.

New economic strategy for next five years

The Fifth Plenary Session of the 19th Communist Party of China Central Committee that concluded laid out a comprehensive guideline for the 14th Five-Year Plan (2021-25), which covers virtually every aspect of China's socioeconomic life. Among them, several are targeted at advancing new developments. As is being widely discussed, the plenum proposed the "dual circulation" development pattern as one of the key components of a new development framework. Also, new strategies for urbanization, cleaner production, and a more equitable distribution of public services have been laid out. The common thread in the guideline is to strengthen the domestic economy (or "internal circulation").

US driven by geopolitical opportunism in the Maldives

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesman Zhao Lijian said Monday that Beijing has decided to impose sanctions on Lockheed Martin Corp. ,Boeing Co. 's defense division and Raytheon Technologies Corp. , as well as other U.S. entities involved in the planned \$1.8 billion weapons package.

If China's economy is so strong, why isn't its currency stronger?

China, as its leaders like to observe, has fared better than any other big country this year. It has all but halted the covid-19 pandemic, got its economy back on track and, to top it off, reaped a cash windfall from abroad. The last has stemmed from a surge in its trade surplus, thanks in part to its factories running at full tilt, and a rush of money into its bonds, thanks in part to its growth outlook. The yuan's recent appreciation against the dollar has merely kept it in line with the yen and the euro. This raises the question, sure to rankle with officials in Beijing, of whether China is again manipulating its currency.

Large Covid Outbreak in China linked to Xinjiang Forced Labour

China's largest coronavirus outbreak in months appears to have emerged in a factory in Xinjiang linked to forced labour and the government's controversial policies towards Uighur residents. More than 180 cases of Covid-19 documented in the past week in Shufu county, in southern Xinjiang, can be traced back to a factory that was built in 2018 as part of government "poverty alleviation" efforts, a campaign that researchers and rights advocates describe as coercive.

Hong Kong Police Arrest Activist Said to Seek U.S. Asylum

The Hong Kong police on Tuesday arrested a 19-year-old activist outside the United States consulate just as he was about to seek asylum, according to an advocacy group. The activist, Tony Chung, had previously been arrested in July under a national security law imposed on the city by Beijing earlier this year. He was accused of posting a message on social media about a new political party that called for Hong Kong's independence from China. Mr. Chung has denied writing it.

Stopping Beijing's fishing boat militia

China's English-language propaganda newspaper the Global Times on Wednesday reported that the Taiwanese coast guard on Thursday last week "inhumanely and savagely" drove away Chinese fishing boats that were seeking shelter from the northeast monsoon close to Penghu County's Siji Islet (西吉嶼). However, there is more to the affair than meets the eye.

Japan

Suga and Asia

The twin visits need to be seen from the perspective of geostrategy and geo-economics in the evolving scenario in the Indo-Pacific region.
