#### India

South-South Cooperation: High-level defence delegation from Brazil to visit India in 2021

Production of ammunition under the joint venture between Companhia Brasileira de Cartuchos (CBC) Brazil, the world's second-largest ammunition manufacturer, and Stumpp Schuele & Somappa India (SSS defence) will take off in August 2021. Sharing this information, Fernando Saim, of CBC, said, "The SS-CBC India Ammunition project is set to start operations in August 2021, in Andhra Pradesh. The joint venture will focus on not only the Indian market but will also reach out to the region."

India's weapons procurement from US jumps to \$3.4 billion in 2020

India's weapons procurement from the United States jumped from a meagre USD 6.2 million to a whopping USD 3.4 billion in the final year of the Donald Trump's administration, according to official data.

India, US gear up to share maritime military intel

India and the US are gearing up to actively share maritime military intelligence through a recently concluded pact, even as New Delhi has also inked 'while shipping' agreements with 21 countries to enhance "situational awareness" in the Indian Ocean Region(IOR).

Maritime security, cyber-related crimes, terrorism main challenges for ASEAN: Rajnath Singh

#### Pakistan

Opposition MPs will submit resignations to party heads by 31st

December 9, 2020, Dawn

Hours after Prime Minister Imran Khan declared that he would go for byelections in the country if the opposition members resigned from the assemblies, the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) announced that all the national and provincial lawmakers belonging to its constituent parties will hand over their resignations individually to the heads of their parties by Dec 31.

Ministry asked to provide data on income, assets of senior military officers

December 9, 2020, Dawn

In a landmark move, the Pakistan Information Commission (PIC) has informed the defence ministry that information about income, income tax, assets, perks, privileges, post-retirement benefits and plots allotted to officers of the armed forces is public information and not sensitive information. The commission issued these guidelines to the defence ministry while deciding 34 appeals filed by Women's Action Forum (WAF) activists and some concerned citizens who had sought the afore-mentioned information from the defence ministry which refused to provide the data.

Pakistan, nine other countries placed on US religious freedom blacklist

December 9, 2020, The Express Tribune

The United States announced that Pakistan, along with nine other countries, has been categorised as "countries of particular concern" (CPC) under its International Religious Freedom Act. Iran, Saudi Arabia, China, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Nigeria, Myanmar, Eritrea and North Korea have also been designated as "countries of particular concern".

Russia to join drills with NATO member ships off Pakistan

December 10, 2020, The Express Tribune

Russia said that it would take part in drills involving more than 30 countries off the coast of Pakistan, in rare joint exercises with Russian and NATO member ships. The AMAN-2021 anti-piracy drills are set to be held in waters near Karachi in February 2021 and will involve British, US, Turkish, Chinese, Japanese and other forces, the Russian defence ministry said in a statement.

World Bank approves \$300m loan

The World Bank has approved a \$300 million loan to help Pakistan address issues of climate change, health emergency and manage solid waste to reduce

flooding chances in Karachi. The Washington-based lender approved \$200 million for the Sindh Resilience project and \$100 million for the Solid Waste Emergency and Efficiency project.

LNG spot market cold-shoulders Pakistan

December 11, 2020, Dawn

In a major setback to gas-starved consumers, Pakistan could not get even a single bid for three LNG (liquefied natural gas) cargoes meant for the first half of January and attracted the highest price for the second half of the month mainly because of delayed tenders amid rising international prices.

Pakistan LNG Limited (PLL) had issued tenders for six cargoes for delivery between Jan 8 and Feb 1. In response, no supplier or trader bid for the first three slots between Jan 8 and Jan 18. This is the first time that the country did not get a bid since it entered the spot market five years ago.

#### Afghanistan

Belgian troops to exit Afghanistan next year

Belgium says its contingent in Afghanistan would return home next year in coordination with allies and partners. defence Minister Ludivine Dedonder said in an interview on Saturday: "We are preparing our withdrawal from Afghanistan."

Taliban Expect Release of Their Prisoners by Mid-December: Wilson

December 6, 2020, Tolo News

US Chargé d'Affaires Ross Wilson in a chat with reporters said that the Taliban is expecting the release of thousands of their prisoners under their agreement with the United States by mid-December. "The specific provision relating to another 7,000 Taliban prisoners is contained in the US-Taliban agreement," Wilson said.

U.S. and Afghan forces target Al Qaeda in the south

December 8, 2020, Long War Journal

The U.S. military and Afghanistan's National Directorate of Security (NDS) have launched two raids against Al Qaeda's network in Helmand and Nimroz province over the past several days, killing at least eight operatives and capturing three more. The Taliban continues to maintain that Al Qaeda does not have a presence in Afghanistan, despite multiple raids against the terror group.

#### US-based group: Dramatic increase in Afghan gov't airstrikes

A U.S.-based institute warned that there has been a dramatic increase in airstrikes conducted by Afghan government forces from July to September this year, attacks that have led to a sharp rise in civilian casualties. According to the report 70 Afghan civilians have been killed in the third quarter of this year, compared to 86 killed in the first six months of 2020.

Fuel Quality Testing Project Faces Corruption Charges

A fuel quality testing project for the country's ports is facing corruption charges by lawmakers who say the Indian company that has the contact lacks the required capacity for the task. TSRC Corporation, the lawmakers said, was referred to the Attorney General's Office by President Ghani because of a lack of capacity and for forgery.

US House Passes Bill to Block Afghanistan Withdrawal

December 9, 2020, Tolo News

The Senate passed a \$741 billion defence policy bill that would take steps to slow or block US President Trump's planned drawdown of American troops from Germany and Afghanistan. The bill contains a provision that would require the Trump administration to submit a comprehensive, interagency report and certification prior to obligating or expending funds to draw down US military personnel in Afghanistan "below troop levels of 8,000 and 4,000."

COVID-19 Deaths Increase in Afghanistan: Ministry

The Ministry of Public Health raised alarms over the 46% increase of COVID-19 deaths this week compared to the previous week, saying that each day deaths have increased from 5-10 to 10-20. The ministry said that 1,678 people tested positive for the coronavirus in Afghanistan last week, which is higher than in previous weeks.

Afghanistan, Iran open first rail network

An Iranian goods train carrying tonnes of agricultural products chugged into a western Afghan province as the two countries marked the opening of their first shared railway network. The train route so far links the Iranian city of Khaf with the Afghan town of Rozanak about 150 kilometres away, but is scheduled to be expanded to reach Herat, Afghanistan's third largest city.

#### Bangladesh

Narendra Modi, Sheikh Hasina to virtually re-launch India-Bangladesh crossborder rail route after 55 years

The rail route between Haldibari in West Bengal and Chilahati in neighbouring Bangladesh is all set to reopen after a gap of 55 years on December 17 and prime ministers of the two countries will inaugurate the programme, an official of the Northeast Frontier Railway said

Bangladesh: Chinese defence Minister visit change raises eyebrows

The last-minute postponement of Chinese defence Minister Wei Fenghe's visit to Bangladesh, after going to Nepal, in November, has raised curiosity about the state of the relations between the two countries. Since no specific reason has been cited, a host of speculations have surfaced, with no tangible conclusion.

China Sticks with Tough Line on Hong Kong After U.S. Bolsters Sanctions

Hours after the U.S. move, Hong Kong police arrested eight activists, including opposition legislators and protest organizers, in dawn raids across the city, the latest in a series of arrests of prominent figures accused of crimes over their roles in last year's anti-government uprising.

China vaccine: impetuous immunisations

Belief is outweighing scepticism as nations rush to vaccinate. Indonesia has begun shipping in Chinese-produced shots that have not even completed phase 3 clinical trials. Haste is understandable. Infections, while hard to assess in a populous nation with little testing, appear to be spiralling. The shipment of up to 1.2m doses from an initial order of 40m is a coup for Sinovac. Its CoronaVac jab appears better-suited to hot, developing countries than some western alternatives. That could bolster Chinese influence, while helping to reinvigorate a troubled business.

China uses big data to select Muslims for arrest in Xinjiang: HRW

A big-data program in China's Xinjiang "arbitrarily selects" Muslims for detention, flagging behaviour such as wearing a veil, studying the Quran or going on the Hajj pilgrimage as reasons for arrest, according to Human Rights Watch (HRW). In a new report on Wednesday, the rights group said it analysed a leaked list of more than 2,000 detainees in Xinjiang's Aksu prefecture and found that the programme – known as the Integrated Joint Operations Platform (IJOP) – also flagged people for their relationships, their communications, their travel histories, or for being related to someone the authorities consider suspicious.
