

Foreign loans surge by 45pc in five months of fiscal

Mr Ahluwalia has been appointed as the next Ambassador of India to the People's Democratic Republic of Algeria.

Pak, China air exercise Shaheen IX underway

Pakistan-China Joint Air Exercise 'Shaheen-IX' is underway at a PAF's operational base since December 8th. The contingents of People's Liberation Army Air Force (PLAAF) and Pakistan Air Force (PAF) comprising various aerial platforms, combat pilots, air defence controllers and technical ground crews are participating in the exercise. The joint exercise started a week after Chinese State Councilor and defence Minister Wei Fenghe met with President Dr Arif Alvi and Prime Minister Imran Khan during his visit to the country. The 'Shaheen-IX,' would last until the end of December.

MNA Ali Wazir arrested in Peshawar at Sindh police request

Police arrested MNA Ali Wazir here in connection with a case registered against him and several leaders of the Pashtun Tahafuz Movement (PTM) in Karachi after a recent public meeting. Afghanistan

Top US general meets Taliban in Qatar, calls for reduced violence

The top US general met Taliban representatives in Qatar, urging them to reduce the level of violence and move more swiftly towards a political solution in Afghanistan. The meeting in Doha with the US Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, General Mark Milley, comes as negotiators representing the Afghan government and the Taliban take a break until Jan 5 when they will continue to work on an agenda.

Mullah Baradar Meets Pakistani Foreign Minister in Islamabad

Afghan Exporters Claim '\$450M' Loss Due to Detained Shipments

Turkey Provides \$13M Worth Funds for Afghan Forces

The Afghan and Turkey government signed Military-Financial Cooperation Agreement and the International Protocol of Financial Assistance in Ankara, providing a five-year financial aid to Afghan forces. The financial aid that sums up around \$13 million, will furnish Afghan National defence and Security Forces (ANDSF) with military equipment for at least five upcoming years, according to the statement posted by the Afghanistan Embassy in Turkey.

Scores killed after Taliban attacks on military checkpoints in Kandahar

Dozens of Taliban fighters were killed in fierce overnight fighting between Afghan forces and militants who attacked multiple checkpoints in the insurgent bastion of Kandahar on December 12. Taliban militants attacked checkpoints in five districts surrounding the city of Kandahar, which Afghan forces countered with heavy air and ground assaults.

World Bank Approves \$85M Grant to Afghanistan

The World Bank Board of Executive Directors approved two grants totalling nearly \$85 million from the International Development Association (IDA), as

part of a \$393 million financial package to help Afghanistan alleviate COVID-19 impacts and improve access to clean water, sanitation, and public services. The \$85 million IDA grants are part of two financial packages that include additional support from the Afghanistan Reconstruction Trust Fund (ARTF), a multi-donor fund managed by the World Bank on behalf of 34 donors.

Bangladesh

India, Bangladesh to reopen 55-year-old Haldibari-Chilahati rail line

U.S. Blacklists China's Top Chip Maker, Escalating Tech Fight

The Trump administration is adding China's largest manufacturer of computing chips to an export blacklist, restricting the company's access to high-end technology over its alleged links it to the Chinese military. Semiconductor Manufacturing International Corp., or SMIC, will be added alongside more than 60 other Chinese institutions to the entity list, the Commerce Department said. The designation restricts companies from exporting U.S.-origin technology to the listed firms without a license, with a provision that effectively prohibits SMIC from acquiring technology to build chips with 10-nanometer circuits and smaller, the industry's top class of chips.

The European Union's public-procurement market is among the world's largest, valued by EU officials at roughly 2 trillion euros, equivalent to \$2.44 trillion, annually.

China Charges Hong Kong Activists Caught Fleeing to Taiwan

Ten Hong Kong activists who were captured at sea while trying to flee to Taiwan in August were charged in mainland China with illegal boundarycrossing offenses that could put some of them behind bars for years. The case has become a focal point for Hong Kong's pro-democracy opposition, which, after months of intense protests last year, has been checked by a wide-ranging crackdown and the imposition of a tough national security law on the semiautonomous Chinese territory.

Taiwan on Track to Apply to Join Trans-Pacific Trade Pact

Taiwan will submit an application to join the revamped version of the Trans-Pacific Partnership once it has finished informal consultations with its existing 11 members, talks which are ongoing, the island's foreign ministry said. While a member of the World Trade Organization, many countries are wary of signing trade deals with Taiwan fearing objections from China, which claims the democratic island as its own territory, and Taiwan has sought greater access to multilateral deals.

Japan

Japan, China to seek early setup of defence hotline
