

India, China agreed that next round of military talks should be held soon: MEA

India and China have agreed that the next round of military talks should be held soon for working towards an "early and complete" disengagement of troops along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in eastern Ladakh in accordance with the existing bilateral agreements and protocols, the ministry of external affairs said.

For total disengagement, India wants military commanders' meet with China at 'early date'

Govt arranges 12 LNG cargoes for January

The ministry of energy's spokesperson said the country will be moving 30 percent more LNG this January compared to January 2019 at the cheapest ever price of \$6.34 / million metric British thermal unit for a peak winter month.

UAE tells Pakistan visa ban 'temporary'

Two Chinese firms to invest in RRUDP

Two Chinese companies signed a memorandum of understanding for investment of billions of dollars in the Ravi Riverfront Urban Development Project (RRUDP). China Road and Bridging Company (CRBC), a member of the 4C conglomerate, and Gezhouba Group Company Limited (CGGC), had signed the MoUs. Delegations of both companies visited the RUDA headquarters to sign the agreements.

China seeks additional guarantees for \$6b new loan

China has sought additional guarantees before sanctioning \$6 billion loan for Main Line-1 (ML-1) project due to weakening financial position of Pakistan and also proposed a mix of commercial and concessional loan against Islamabad's desire to secure the cheapest lending. The issue of additional guarantees was raised during the third joint ML-1 financing committee meeting. The Chinese authorities asked for additional guarantee mechanism after Islamabad sought debt relief from G-20 countries, which was only meant for poorest nations of the world.

Foreign exchange: SBP reserves fall \$83m to \$13.2b

The foreign exchange reserves held by the central bank declined 0.62% on a weekly basis. On December 18, the foreign currency reserves held by the SBP were recorded at \$13,216.2 million, down \$83 million compared with \$13,298.8 million in the previous week.

Pakistan faces another setback in Reko Diq case

Pakistan is facing another setback on the international legal front as the British Virgin Islands high court has passed an order to attach some of its assets due to Pakistan's failure to provide bank guarantee to an international arbitrator in the Reko Diq case. The high court of the British Virgin Islands passed an ex parte order on December 16 regarding the attachment of Pakistani assets. In view of that order, Pakistan cannot sell the assets managed by offshore companies registered in this small overseas territory of the United Kingdom.
