

He declared that if the TLP activists decided to march on Islamabad with injured and dead bodies then his party would join them in protest.

Four drivers die of starvation in Makran

Four drivers died after their condition deteriorated due to non-availability of food and water while they, along with hundreds of others, were stranded in border areas of Makran division. Hundreds of pick-ups and other vehicles loaded with Iranian petrol and diesel were stuck up in the border areas when authorities stopped them from moving ahead after they crossed into Pakistan from Iran. The Pak-Iran border was closed at three points and the drivers of these vehicles had no other source to get food and water.

FO hails rollover of \$2bn loan by UAE

China's Fishing Fleet, the World's Largest, Drives Beijing's Global Ambitions

In Beijing's push to become a maritime superpower, China's fishing fleet has grown to become the world's largest by far—and it has turned more aggressive, provoking tensions around the globe. The Chinese fleet is helping the country stake out a bigger presence at sea, including by building a world-wide network of ports. The vessels, rigged with winches and booms and pulling giant nets, can be twice as large as a naval patrol boat, at an average of almost 200 feet long. Fishing crews have helped establish island settlements in waters subject to territorial disputes with neighbors.

China's Xi Lays Out Vision for a World Without a Single Dominant Power

Cosmonauts Sergei Ryzhikov and Sergei Kud-Sverchkov and astronaut Kathleen Rubins touched down as scheduled in the early morning hours of April 17, according to a live broadcast on the television channel of Russia's Roscosmos space agency.

Facebook Removes Kyrgyz President's Post Promoting Toxic Root To Fight COVID

Facebook has removed Kyrgyz President Sadyr Japarov's controversial post promoting a toxic root for treatment of COVID-19, calling it "misinformation." <u>Outspoken Critic Of Turkmen Government Says She Is Under Pressure In</u> <u>Turkey</u>

Uzbekistan receives first batch of Sputnik V vaccine

Tajikistan: Imam detained on extremism charges after speech at funeral

An imam at a Dushanbe mosque has been detained on extremism charges after he called a late Islamic cleric "one of great leaders of the country". State media outlets reported on April 22 that 44-year-old Imam-hatib Abdulhaq Obidov (aka Makhsumi Abdulhaq) from a mosque in Dushanbe's Shohmansur district had been detained on suspicion of being a follower of the Salafi branch of Islam, which has been labeled as extremist and banned in the Central Asian country.

Kazakhstan to apply homegrown COVID vaccine next week

Kazakhstan will begin to administer its homegrown coronavirus vaccine to residents next week, according to a statement by its Prime Ministry. The first 50,000 doses of the QazVak vaccine were produced by the Scientific Research Institute for Biological Safety Problems in Kazakhstan's southern Jambyl province, said the statement.

India, Kyrgyzstan special forces start two-week counter-terror drills

The special forces of India and Kyrgyzstan have started a two-week military exercise in Bishkek with a focus on counter-terror drills. Indian External Affairs Minister Jaishankar Meets Sheikh Abdullah; Discusses <u>Covid, Bilateral Cooperation</u>

UAE is Mediating between India and Pakistan, Says Senior Emirati Diplomat
