

China's Unrestricted War on India

China Rewrites Hong Kong Election Rules to Keep Opponents Out

China's top lawmaking body rewrote electoral rules for Hong Kong to give Beijing decisive control over how the city chooses its leader and legislators, putting pro-establishment politicians firmly in charge of the former British colony. The changes, approved Tuesday, will curtail democratic representation in Hong Kong by slashing the share of directly elected seats in the local legislature, while giving unelected political bodies more influence over the city's governance. Local national-security officials will also get effective veto power over election candidates, allowing authorities to bar opposition figures from elected office.

The Wuhan Whitewash

An Alliance of Autocracies? China Wants to Lead a New World Order

The protesters rallied against China's increasing influence and economic power in the former Soviet republic. Activists also denounced the mass incarceration of members of indigenous Turkic-speaking communities in China's Xinjiang region.

<u>Turkmenistan's Authoritarian Leader Wins Senate Seat With '100 Percent' Of Vote</u>

Turkmenistan's authoritarian leader Gurbanguly Berdymukhammedov has been elected as a member of a newly established senate, in a vote in which there was no opposition and only indirect suffrage. State media in the tightly controlled and isolated state reported Berdymukhammedov received "100 percent" of the vote in the election, giving him a new position as a lawmaker in the upper chamber.

<u>Uzbekistan tightens rules for media as president braces for re-election</u>

The criminal code in Uzbekistan has been amended to make insulting the president an offense punishable by up to five years in prison. Under the provision approved by President Shavkat Mirziyoyev on March 30, the sanction is envisioned for people committing the offense through the internet or other forms of telecommunication.

Russia sends humanitarian aid to Turkmenistan
