

Pakistan

Imran, Putin agree to coordinate positions on Afghanistan

The two sides underscored this during a conversation between Prime Minister Imran Khan and Russian President Vladimir Putin. The second call from President Putin to Mr Khan within three weeks came in the backdrop of the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation summit in Dushanbe on September 17.

Pakistan says no recognition till Taliban fulfil promises

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken has told Congress that Washington wants Pakistan not to offer 'any legitimacy' to Afghanistan's new Taliban rulers until they fulfil their promises to fight terrorism and protect human rights.

Islamic Trade Finance Corporation to give \$600m for commodity financing

The International Islamic Trade Finance Corporation (ITFC) — a subsidiary of the Islamic Development Bank — would make available this month about \$600 million of syndicated loan for commodity financing. This is part of the \$4.5bn new framework agreement signed by the two sides in June this year to finance oil, LNG and fertiliser imports over the next three years (2021-23).

PIA runs first flight to Kabul after Taliban takeover

In its first passenger flight to Kabul since the Taliban reclaimed power last month, Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) took journalists to Afghanistan before bringing back those belonging to World Bank and international news agencies to Islamabad.

Talks with IMF for sixth tranche to start by month-end

Pakistan will start staff-level discussions with the International Monetary Fund by end of the current month for the release of sixth tranche under the \$6 billion Extended Fund Facility (EFF).

Pakistan to attend 'Three Brothers' military drills

Azerbaijan, Turkey and Pakistan holding joint military drills from Sept 12 to 20 in Baku, Azerbaijan; the first such drills between the three countries.

Pakistan hosts meeting of regional states' spymasters

September 12, 2021, Dawn

Pakistan hosted a meeting of spymasters of some countries in the region on the situation in Afghanistan. There was no official statement on the meeting, but an intelligence source privately confirmed that the session had taken place. The meeting was attended by the intelligence heads from Russia, China, Iran and some Central Asian states.

Slow pace of work on CPEC irks Chinese companies

A Senate panel expressed concern over the slow pace of development on the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) and dissatisfaction being expressed by the Chinese companies over the negligible progress over the past three years.

SCO leaders caution against abandoning Afghanistan

Prime Minister Imran Khan, who is in Dushanbe, Tajikistan, on a two-day visit for attending the SCO summit, met the presidents of Belarus, Uzbekistan, Iran and Kazakhstan on the side lines of the event on the first day of his trip.

Pakistan extends olive branch to TTP members

Holding out an olive branch to members of the banned Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP), Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi has said if they promise not to get involved in terrorist activities and submit to the Constitution, the government will be 'open to giving' a pardon to them.

Seven soldiers martyred in S. Waziristan gunfight with terrorists

Seven soldiers were martyred and five terrorists killed during an intense exchange of fire in the Asman Manza area of South Waziristan tribal district. Security forces conducted an intelligence-based operation in Asman Manza area after reports were received that terrorists were present there.

Tribesmen demand reversal of Fata-KP merger

Hundreds of people from tribal districts left for Islamabad to stage a protest seeking reversal of the merger of the former Federally Administered Tribal Areas (Fata) with Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Chanting slogans against the merger, the tribal people boarded vehicles to hold a jirga in the federal capital.

Journalists picket Parliament House to protest PMDA, curbs

Journalists staged a sit-in outside the Parliament House against the Pakistan Media Development Authority and the media restrictions. The sit-in was staged on the call of Pakistan Federal Union of Journalists and Rawalpindi Islamabad Union of Journalists.

Taliban issue new rules for female university students

Women in Afghanistan will be allowed to study in universities as the country seeks to rebuild after decades of war but gender segregation and Islamic dress code will be mandatory, the Taliban's minister for higher education said.

Donors pledge \$1.1bn for 'collapsing' Afghanistan

Donors have pledged more than \$1.1 billion to help Afghanistan, where poverty and hunger have spiralled since the Taliban took power, and foreign aid has dried up, raising the spectre of a mass exodus.

Afghan interim govt not inclusive, says Iran

Uzbek Foreign Ministry's spokesman Yusup Kobuljonov said that the deportation of the Afghan nationals -- hundreds of people who flew to Uzbekistan aboard Afghan military aircraft -- was carried out in the last two days.

Tajikistan Accepts Around 100 Afghans Fleeing The Taliban, But Sends 100 Back

Tajik authorities say they have accepted around 100 Afghan nationals from a group of more than 200 people, including many women and children, who crossed the border overnight to flee Afghanistan because of the Taliban's takeover of the country.

Air Defence Boost: Indian Air Force Gets First Indo-Israeli Missile

Egyptian, Indian Naval Forces Conduct Drills in the Mediterranean Sea
