Saudi Arabia, UAE retain \$2b financial support

This appeared to be a major development after the kingdom had already withdrawn \$2 billion out of \$3 billion loans that the oil-rich Gulf nation had extended in late 2018 to help Islamabad avoid default on international debt repayments.

#### Coal miners in Balochistan reluctant to work after Hazara killings

#### Afghanistan

Pakistan OKs release of funds for projects in Afghanistan

Pakistan has announced according approval to the release Rs 549 million for two development projects in neighbouring Afghanistan. The approval was given as part of the government's Afghanistan Reconstruction and Rehabilitation Programme. Out of the total grant, the government has approved the release of Rs61 million for the feasibility study for a new railway link from Peshawar to Jalalabad.

U.S. should delay complete troop pullout in Afghanistan - report to Congress

The United States should extend the May 1 deadline for pulling all its troops from Afghanistan, and make force cuts contingent on progress in peace talks as well as by the Taliban in reducing violence and containing al Qaeda, according to the bipartisan report submitted to the US Congress.

Pentagon: No Decision on 'Force Posture' in Afghanistan

The Pentagon reiterated that any withdrawal from Afghanistan will be conditions-based. Pentagon's spokesman John Kirby in a question about a possible increase in the number of US forces in Afghanistan said that the US Defense Secretary is assessing all options, but said that the best solution to the conflict in Afghanistan is a political settlement of the conflict.

Afghan drug smugglers arrested at Indian airport

The Indian Customs Department arrested two Afghan citizens and seized drugs worth \$1.5 million from them at the Indira Gandhi International (IGI) airport. Two Afghan citizens, flying from Dubai, were arrested after they landed at the IGI airport. The Afghans were held with 208 capsules and 163 kilograms of heroin. The drugs are worth 114 million INR –equivalent to \$1.5 million.

Japan Pledges \$122.2M in Aid for Afghanistan

Japan will provide \$122.2 million in aid to Afghanistan to support humanitarian and development programs in the country, Japan's Embassy in Kabul said in a statement.

Pak-Army shellings on Kunar draw Karzai's ire

Kunar Provincial governor, Mohammad Iqbal Saeed told the media that Pakistani forces had fired 50 rockets at Suno village and Alamzo Dupe areas of the Shilton district since last night, causing heavy financial losses to the residents in the region. Meanwhile, the former Afghan president, Hamid Karzai reacted to the rocket attacks by Pakistani troops on Kunar, saying that Pakistan should immediately stop their bombardment and instead of attacking Afghans, they have to work for a better bilateral relationship.

#### Bangladesh

Aero India 2021: IAF Chief Holds Talks With Counterparts From Tajikistan, Bangladesh

The decision was taken during the Foreign Office Consultation (FOC) between the two countries which took place in Delhi.

Why is gas exploration stalled in Bangladesh?

Over the last 20 years, Bangladesh consumed about 13 trillion cubic feet (TCF) of gas. During the same period, only less than two TCF of new gas reserve was discovered. The number of exploration wells drilled during this time was merely 22, implying an average of about one well drilled per year. This is a prime example, by any standard, of a very underexplored country which has seen major gas discoveries in the past and has been rated highly for further gas prospects.
