

Pakistan

Court Extends Pre-Arrest Bail For Former Pakistani Prime Minister

A court in Pakistan has extended by one week the pre-arrest bail set for former Prime Minister Imran Khan over terrorism charges that have ignited political tensions in the country. The court's move on August 25 prolongs the measure until September 1. Khan, a former international cricket star turned politician, was present at the hearing in Islamabad. The terrorism charge, laid on August 22, followed a speech made by Khan in Islamabad during which he vowed to sue police officers and a judge and alleged that a close aide had been tortured after his arrest.

Pakistani City's Decision To Close Women's Park Following Islamist Protests Sparks Uproar

The Jinnah Family Park was a rare recreational area reserved for women and girls in Pakistan's conservative northwestern city of Bannu. But following protests by Islamists and religious leaders, who alleged the park was "spreading obscenity and vulgarity," authorities in the city of around 1 million people have closed off the area.

Pakistan's political turmoil echoes in US, UN corridors

The political turmoil in Pakistan echoed far away in the United States as well, where the UN chief urged Islamabad to keep the legal process impartial while the State Department underlined the need to follow "democratic, constitutional and legal" principles. The controversy that followed PTI chief Imran Khan's controversial remarks against a female judge and the Islamabad police also drew the attention of the US media and Washington's think tanks, where experts urged ruling and opposition forces in Pakistan not to rock the boat.

Pakistan seeks world aid to cope with flood emergency

As massive floods across Pakistan have so far claimed at least 830 lives since July, the government decided to launch an international appeal seeking funds for relief and rehabilitation of flood-hit people and restoration of damaged infrastructure.

FM puts off Europe visit due to floods

Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari has postponed his visit to four European countries in the wake of calamities triggered by ongoing heavy monsoon rains and flooding and subsequent casualties in the country.

In major boost, PTI wins Karachi by-election

August 22, 2022, Dawn

Marred by low turnout amid least interest of voters, the Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf (PTI) won the by-election of Karachi's NA-245 and retained its mandate from the constituency in a major boost to the party a week before the local bodies' elections in the city giving setback to the key contestant Muttahida Qaumi Movement Pakistan (MQM-P) which was enjoying the support of the ruling parties at the Centre.

Visas to truck drivers will boost trade with Kabul

Pakistan and Afghanistan have reached an agreement to give six-month visas to truck drivers on a reciprocal basis to facilitate the cross-border movement of goods between the two countries.

Doha declares intent to invest \$3bn in Pakistan

August 25, 2022, Dawn

The state-owned investment fund of Qatar is going to invest \$3 billion in Pakistan. The Emiri Diwan, the administrative office of the emir, released the statement as Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif held official talks with Qatari Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad al-Thani in Doha following a meeting with the sovereign fund officials a day ago.

Pakistan declares emergency in the face of calamitous floods

Calling the incessant monsoon rains a "climate-inducted humanitarian crisis of epic proportions", the Pakistan government officially declared a 'national emergency' in light of the rain-induced floods which have so far killed 937 people, including 343 children, and left at least 30 million without shelter. As per the latest data compiled by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), Sindh reported the highest number of deaths as 306 people lost their lives due to floods and rain-related incidents from June 14 to date.

Army top brass hints at tougher approach against TTP

The army top brass hinted at a tougher approach against the outlawed Tehreeki-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) as it emphasised continuation of counter-terrorism operations in Khyber-Pakhtunkhawa and Balochistan.

Riyadh confirms \$1bn investment in Pakistan

August 26, 2022, Dawn

The Saudi king has directed his government to invest \$1 billion in Pakistan "in confirmation of the kingdom's support of the Pakistani economy" and its people, a report from the Saudi Press Agency (SPA) said. The investment commitment was conveyed to Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari during a phone call with his Saudi counterpart Prince Faisal bin Farhan.

Pakistan, Qatar on course to improving economic ties: PM Shehbaz

Upon the conclusion of his two-day official visit to Qatar, Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said the two countries had a clear vision of future with new opportunities and greater awareness to improve bilateral ties and economic cooperation.

Floods to cause \$4b loss to economy

The unusual heavy monsoon rains and flash floods are initially estimated to cost Pakistan's economy over \$4 billion in the current fiscal year as the calamity has badly hurt agricultural activities in Sindh and Balochistan. While it is early to assess the actual impact, Pakistan, where agriculture has a 23% share in gross domestic product (GDP), can remain highly vulnerable in the aftermath of the floods.

Pakistan to negotiate transit deal

August 20, 2022, The Express Tribune

In a bid to diversify export markets, Pakistan is negotiating a transit trade agreement with Kazakhstan and Tajikistan. Pakistan has traditionally depended on the export markets of the Middle East, United States and European Union (EU). However, Central Asian states offer a big potential for exports, which remains an untapped market for Pakistan.

China announces emergency aid for flood victims of Pakistan

A spokesman of the Chinese government said the emergency humanitarian aid, including 25,000 tents and relief materials, is being dispatched forthwith while 4,000 tents, 50,000 blankets, 50,000 tarpaulins and other reserves provided by China under the framework of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor's (CPEC) social and people's livelihood cooperation have been put into the frontline for relief.

Power sector circular debt rises to Rs2.6 trillion: PAC told

The Public Accounts Committee was informed that the circular debt of the power sector had risen to Rs2.6 trillion, increasing by Rs1.6 trillion in one year. It was also revealed in the Public Accounts Committee meeting that no progress had been made on the investment of 8 billion dollars from Saudi Arabia in Pakistan due to the absence of the oil refinery policy. It may be mentioned here that Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman during his visit to Pakistan had announced to invest in oil refinery in Pakistan.

Pak Army to assist Qatar on FIFA World Cup security

The Pakistan Army will assist Qatar with security in the upcoming FIFA World Cup 2022 being held in the Middle Eastern country. The approval was given by the federal cabinet to the Pakistan Army-Qatar agreement on providing assistance during the mega football event. The world cup will be played from November 20 to December 18 in Qatar. The Gulf country will be hosting the extravaganza for the very first time.

Afghanistan

<u>Senior Clerics Caught In The Crossfire Of The Taliban's Intensifying War With</u> <u>IS-K</u>

As the Taliban intensifies its war against Islamic State-Khorasan (IS-K), religious clerics associated with the rival militant groups are being caught in the crossfire. IS-K militants have been blamed for the assassination of several pro-Taliban clerics in Afghanistan in recent weeks. The Taliban has also been accused of killing religious figures with alleged links to IS-K.

Iran welcomes increased investment in Chabahar Port

Iranian First Vice-President Mohammad Mokhber said that Tehran welcomes increased investment in Chabahar Port in southeastern country. Speaking during a meeting in Tehran with India's Union Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways Sarbananda Sonowal, Mokhber said that the development of Chabahar Port is an exceptional chance for Iran, India and the entire region. He said that the completion and development of Chabahar Port will help facilitate trade transit via International North-South Transit corridor (INSTC).

Taliban in Talks with Russia to Import 1 Million Metric Tons of Oil

Afghanistan's Taliban say they are in talks with Russia to import 1 million metric tons of petroleum products, possibly in exchange for raisins, raw material for medicines and minerals.

A Taliban delegation currently is in Moscow holding meetings with Russian officials and private businesses to boost mutual trade ties and encourage investment in the war-torn South Asian nation.

Indian embassy in Afghanistan resumes operations after a year of suspension

After a year of suspension of diplomatic ties with Afghanistan and the Indian Embassy shutting down operations in August 2021, the embassy in Kabul resumed its functionality on August 15. The Indian Embassy had adjourned its offices while functionaries had left Kabul after the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan which led to the collapse of the civic government and then President Ashraf Ghani fleeing Afghan land.

Afghanistan is Key to Preserving Peace and Security in SCO Region, Say Secretaries of SCO Security Councils in Tashkent

The secretaries of the Security Councils of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) focused on addressing security and stability issues in the SCO region during their 17th meeting in Tashkent. The sides discussed the development of cooperation in such areas as countering terrorism, separatism and extremism, illicit trafficking of weapons and drugs, transnational organized crimes and ensuring international information security.

India Delivers Its 10th Consignment of Medical Aid to Afghanistan

As part of its continued humanitarian assistance to Afghanistan, India provided 32 tons of essential medical aid in 10 batches; the tenth batch, according to a press statement from the Indian Ministry of External Affairs, arrived in Afghanistan. According to the statement, the medical assistance consigned by the Indian government was delivered to the UN's World Health Organization (WHO) and the Indira Gandhi Children's Hospital in Kabul, the Afghan capital.

Afghanistan floods kill more than 180, Taliban say

Flooding in Afghanistan this month has killed more than 180 people as torrential rains wrought widespread devastation in central and eastern Afghan provinces. Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid said at a news conference that 182 people had been killed and 250 injured. More than 3,100 houses were destroyed and thousands of livestock were killed, exacerbating the country's economic and humanitarian crisis.

<u>United Nations helps cash-strapped Pakistan, Afghanistan deal with heavy</u> <u>flooding</u>

The United Nations said it is helping Pakistan and Afghanistan deal with recent heavy flooding that has caused severe casualties and material damage in both countries. "The UN team in Pakistan is boosting support to authorities in the most-affected provinces of Balochistan and Sindh. Till date, the UN team has mobilised USD 7 million to respond to the floods and has provided 1,100 metric ton of food rations, therapeutic feed and nutritional supplements," said Stephane Dujarric, spokesperson for UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres.

Taliban Ban Crypto in Afghanistan, Arrest Dealers of Tokens

Afghanistan's central bank imposed a nationwide ban on cryptocurrencies this month and the Taliban regime has arrested several dealers who defied orders to stop trading digital tokens, according to a senior police official. The crackdown comes after some Afghans turned to cryptocurrencies to preserve their wealth and keep it out of the Taliban's reach. Crypto has become a popular way of moving money in and out of the country, which is shut off from the global banking system due to sanctions leveled on the militant group.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's programme also includes launching of "Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Student Scholarship" for 200 descendants of Indian Armed Forces personnel martyred and critically injured during the Liberation War of Bangladesh in 1971. She also addressed a business event, jointly organized by Indian and Bangladesh business communities on 7 September 2022.
