National Security policy places economy front and centre

Amid spiralling inflation and a significant rise in the cost of living for nearly all Pakistanis, it is perhaps fitting that the country's first-ever National Security Policy acknowledges economic stability as a key component of national security. Approved by the federal cabinet last week, a public version of the policy was unveiled by Prime Minister Imran Khan on January 14.

Pakistan keen to work on gas project, PM Imran assures Putin

Prime Minister Imran Khan reassured Russian President Vladimir Putin of Pakistan's commitment to collaborate with Russia on the Pakistan Stream Gas Pipeline Project as the two leaders discussed the expansion of bilateral economic and energy cooperation. PM Khan and President Putin spoke by phone about the progress in relations between the two countries.

ECP declassifies key documents in PTI foreign funding case

The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) ordered the declassification of all critical documents linked to the foreign funding case against the ruling Pakistan Tehreek-i-Insaf (PTI). The documents were part of the ECP scrutiny

committee report, released a couple of weeks ago, which had been kept secret and were not released alongside the report when it was made public.

Bomb blast in Lahore market leaves three dead

January 21, 2022, Dawn

In what appears to be a re-emergence of terrorism in the provincial capital, a powerful blast ripped through the crowded Anarkali market, killing three people and injuring 33 others on January 19. Police and other law enforcement agencies initially declared it a gas cylinder explosion, but later investigations confirmed it was a bomb blast.

<u>'Work on Dasu dam site back on track'</u>

January 21, 2022, Dawn

Chinese Foreign Ministry Spokesperson Zhao Lijian brushed away media reports that suggest the Chinese contractor has demobilised from the Dasu dam project site. At his regular briefing at International Press Centre (IPC), Mr Zhao said he was unaware of any preconditions put forward by the contractor for resuming work on the dam site. "I'm not aware of the situation you mentioned. As far as I know, the Dasu hydropower project has resumed," he said. A terrorist attack on the dam site last July took the lives of 10 Chinese and four Pakistani nationals while injuring 28 others.

Indonesia offers coal to fire up CPEC projects

Indonesia's refined coal industry could provide fuel for the power projects under the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor and to Large Scale Manufacturing Industries in Pakistan, Ambassador of Indonesia to Pakistan Adam M Tugio said.

Rally held in favour of presidential form of govt in Pakistan

January 15, 2022, The Express Tribune

The Pakistan Awami League (PAL) organised a rally on Murree Road in Rawalpindi, demanding imposition of the presidential form of government in the country. The rally, led by PAL Chairman Chaudhry Nasir Mahmood, marched from Liaquat Bagh to Chandni Chowk and chanted slogans against the government and rising inflation.

#### Talks under way for Kazakhstan gas pipeline

January 16, 2022, The Express Tribune

Pakistan Energy Minister Hammad Azhar said discussions were under way with Russia to bring a gas pipeline from Kazakhstan, which will be cheaper than the imported LNG.

Gwadar rights leaders urge government to fulfil agreement

January 21, 2022, The Express Tribune

Protesters blocked the Ormara-Karachi Highway, cutting off the Coastal Highway route between Makran and certain areas of Sindh. The call for the protest was given by Maulana Hidayatur Rehman, the leader of Gwadar Rights Movement, who had led the month-long sit-in in the port city of Balochistan. Hidayat claimed that the agreement signed last month was yet to be implemented by the provincial government. He accused the authorities of using delaying tactics.

Islamabad on alert after terror incident

January 19, 2022, The News

Pakistan's federal capital was put on alert after incidents of terrorism and a warning issued by Interior Minister Sheikh Rashid Ahmad of more terrorism-related incidents. A policeman was shot dead and two others were injured at a checkpoint. On January 17 a gun battle took place in which two militants were shot dead, before two gunmen riding a motorcycle opened fire on a police checkpoint in the vicinity of the Karachi Company police station.

#### Afghanistan

Washington must listen to UN and release Afghan funds: Taliban

January 15, 2022, Dawn

The Taliban urged Washington to heed a call by the United Nations chief to unlock Afghan funds frozen in the United States, as a humanitarian crisis deepens.

26 killed in Afghan earthquake

January 18, 2022, Dawn

At least 26 people were killed after an earthquake hit western Afghanistan. The victims died when roofs of their houses collapsed in Qadis district in the western province of Badghis. The shallow quake was magnitude 5.3, according to the US Geological Survey.

#### Taliban fighters pepper spray women protesters

#### January 17, 2022, Dawn

Taliban forces fired pepper spray at a group of women protesters in Afghanistan's capital demanding rights to work and education. Since seizing control of the country in August, the Taliban authorities have imposed creeping restrictions on Afghans, especially on women.

Not possible to unite Afghanistan under one govt, says Biden

US President Joe Biden said that he withdrew his troops from Afghanistan because it's not possible to unify the war-torn country under one single government. At a White House news conference, Mr Biden also said that the United States was "spending a billion dollars a week in Afghanistan for 20 years" and could not afford to do so indefinitely.

Taliban erasing Afghan women from public life, say UN experts

Taliban leaders in Afghanistan are institutionalising large scale and systematic gender-based discrimination and violence against women and girls, says a UN report released this week.

#### Taliban collect \$1 bn in exports

Five months into their rule over Afghanistan, the Taliban have increased revenue, cracked down on corruption and collected a surprising \$1 billion in exports, the UN representative for the country said. At the same time, Deborah Lyons, head of the UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan, stressed the need for the Taliban to be inclusive and guarantee the rights of minorities and women.

Afghan Trade Increases With Central Asia, Drops With Pakistan

Numbers provided by the Afghanistan Chamber of Commerce and Investment (ACCI) indicate that the volume of trade between Afghanistan and three Central Asian republics – Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan -- has increased in the current year.

Over half a million lost jobs in Afghanistan since Taliban takeover: UN

More than half a million people have lost or been pushed out of their jobs in Afghanistan since the Taliban takeover, the UN International Labour Organization (ILO) said. In a warning that the economy has been "paralyzed"

since the de facto authorities took control last August, ILO said that there have been huge losses in jobs and working hours, the United Nation said in a statement.

Pak NSA cancels Afghan visit amid anti-Islamabad protests, says report

Pakistan's National Security Adviser Moeed Yusuf has cancelled his planned visit to Afghanistan in view of a planned anti-Pakistan protest in Kabul. Yusuf was scheduled to lead an inter-ministerial Pakistani delegation to Afghanistan on Jan 18 to discuss the issue of border-fencing and take stock of the humanitarian needs of the war-torn country with the Taliban regime.

# Nepal

# India's stance on Nepal boundary well known, consistent & unambiguous: Embassy

The statement of the Indian Embassy here came days after Nepal's main Opposition Communist Party of Nepal-Unified Marxist-Leninist (CPN-UML) urged Prime Minister Sher Bahadur Deuba to speak up on the boundary issue and make its position clear on Lipulekh.

India's position on border unambiguous, government tells Nepal

#### Road to Sri Lanka's economic recovery via India: Lankan envoy

#### China's Economic Downturn Gives Rise to a Winter of Discontent

China's economic future isn't looking all that bright and is starting to have political implications for President Xi Jinping. The Chinese Academy of Social Sciences expects annual growth to slow to 5.3% in 2022 from 8% in 2021. Realestate giant Evergrande, declared in default last month by ratings agencies, unleashed a wave of defaults in the country's property sector, which is worth about 29% of gross domestic product.

# Exports could be key driver for China's growth as Covid drags down spending, say analysts

Exports will continue to drive China's economy for the rest of the year as the domestic market remains sluggish, according to analysts. Chinese leaders have indicated for many years that they want to move away from exports as the main source of growth and toward domestic consumption for sustainable economic growth, said Mattie Bekink, China director at the Economist Intelligence Corporate Network.

We Are Taiwanese': China's Growing Menace Hardens Island's Identity

Well over 90 percent of Taiwan's people trace their roots to mainland China, but more than ever, they are embracing an identity that is distinct from that of their Communist-ruled neighbor. Beijing's strident authoritarianism — and its claim over Taiwan — has only solidified the island's identity, now central to a dispute that has turned the Taiwan Strait into one of Asia's biggest potential flash points.

<u>China, Germany pledge to deepen cooperation and refrain from 'microphone</u> <u>diplomacy'</u>

China and Germany have pledged to enhance mutual understanding and refrain from "microphone diplomacy" on the basis of mutual respect on Thursday when Chinese State Councilor and Foreign Minister Wang Yi held talks with German Foreign Minister Annalena Baerbock via video link.

#### PLA expels US warship trespassing Chinese territorial waters in S.China Sea

The Chinese People's Liberation Army (PLA) expelled a US warship that trespassed Chinese territorial waters in the South China Sea on Thursday, a move experts said displays the PLA's capability to safeguard national sovereignty and territorial integrity amid several other recent US muscleflexing moves in the region.

No 'countercurrents' can stop globalization trend: Xi

Chinese President Xi Jinping on Monday delivered his first major speech of the New Year at a global event at the World Economic Forum (WEF), where he issued stern warnings against acts of containment, confrontation and suppression as well as practices of hegemony and bullying, while calling on global efforts to seek peaceful coexistence and win-win results.

<u>Using 5G in Chinese aircraft will not affect wireless services, official said, after</u> <u>US airlines' chaos</u>

Xi Jinping promotes seven military, armed police officers to rank of general

Chinese President Xi Jinping, also chairman of the Central Military Commission (CMC), on Friday, presented seven military and armed police officers with certificates of order, promoting them to the rank of general, the highest for officers in active service in China.

Contact in 'transit' with Taiwan official opposed

China is always firmly opposed to official contact in any form between the United States and Taiwan, a Foreign Ministry spokesman said after reports that a senior member of the island's Democratic Progressive Party will transit via the US when visiting Honduras next week.

#### Japan

#### Biden and Kishida plan Quad summit in Japan in late spring

U.S. President Joe Biden and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida agreed to establish an economic "two-plus-two" framework to deepen cooperation on supply chains and tech development along with discussing in detail the allies' response to China in their first full-fledged summit Friday. During the 80minute virtual meeting, Kishida invited Biden to visit Japan in the first half of this year, with plans to hold a summit with the other leaders of the Quad alongside the trip. The security framework consists of the US, Japan, India and Australia.

#### Japan under pressure to observe U.N. nuke ban treaty meeting

Japan, the only country to have been attacked with an atomic bomb is facing growing calls to observe the first meeting of signatories to a treaty banning nuclear weapons. Japan, however, relies on the U.S. nuclear umbrella for its security and is not one of the treaty's 86 signatory countries and regions.

#### Japan's got the 2+2 bug, engaging with France, Germany and Indonesia

Japan held its seventh foreign and defense ministers' meeting in a year with France on Thursday, the most ever, as the format regains favour under a U.S. president who promotes a multilateral approach to countering China's rising influence. President Joe Biden values the unique opportunity these "two-plustwo" meetings offer for two nations to discuss foreign policy and defense issues. Within six months of Biden taking office in January 2021, Japan held "two-plus-two" talks with the U.K. the U.S., Indonesia, Germany and Australia.

Japan's December exports grew faster than expected

Japan's exports rose faster than expected in December to mark the 10th straight month of year-on-year growth, data showed on Thursday, as supply bottlenecks continued to ease toward the end of 2021. However, a persistent semiconductor shortage remains a headache for Japanese firms such as car maker Toyota, which on Tuesday slashed its near-term output target, in addition to uncertainties around the Omicron coronavirus variant.

#### U.S. and Japan to jointly stockpile munitions, including near Taiwan

January 16, 2022, Nikkei Asia

The U.S. and Japan are discussing stockpiling munitions in each other's defense facilities across Japan, including islands in Taiwan's vicinity, to prepare for contingencies. The issue of joint usage of facilities was discussed in last week's two-plus-two meeting of foreign and defense ministers. The ministers "committed to increase joint/shared use of U.S. and Japanese facilities, including efforts to strengthen Japan Self-Defense Forces' posture in areas including its southwestern islands," the sides said in a statement after the meeting.

## Korea

Presidential candidates hesitant to push for Jeonju financial center

Korea has often been criticized for a populist approach to policies in key industries. Previous administrations claimed the relocation of state-run institutions, once concentrated in Seoul, to across the country was a means to drive the growth of provincial areas. But this has led to questionable outcomes such as having the state pension fund moving to Jeonju, 240 kilometers south of Seoul, which has little related infrastructure. This in turn has resulted in a brain drain at the world's third-largest pension fund.

S. Korea not mulling lifting import ban on Japanese seafood to join CPTPP

South Korea is not considering lifting a ban on imports of Japanese seafood to win Japan's support for joining a mega free trade agreement in the Asia-Pacific region, Seoul's oceans minister has said. South Korea is working to join the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), which involves 11 nations, including Australia and Japan.

S. Korea, US discuss new economic framework, supply chains

The top trade officials of South Korea and the United States on Wednesday agreed to strengthen their strategic partnership to actively respond to supply chain issues, new technologies and other major trade issues, Seoul's industry ministry said. South Korean Trade Minister Yeo Han-koo and US Trade Representative (USTR) Katherine Tai held a teleconference earlier in the day ahead of Yeo's planned visit to the US next week.

#### 'Tactical guided missiles' now under production, N. Korea says

North Korea on Monday test-fired a pair of "tactical guided missiles" for the first time in around two years, Pyongyang's state media reported the following day, saying it did so to confirm the accuracy and efficiency of the weapon system "under production." The report suggested that North Korea test-fired KN-24 short-range ballistic missiles, which look similar to the US MGM-140 Army Tactical Missile System, or ATACMS.

Opposition party's presidential candidate vows tough response to unauthorized labor rallies

Main opposition presidential candidate Yoon Suk-yeol said Sunday he will deal sternly with illegal labor rallies if elected in March. In a Facebook post, Yoon of the conservative People Power Party slammed the Korean Confederation of Trade Unions, a major umbrella labour group, over its massive street rally in downtown Seoul, Saturday.

#### ASEAN challenge: Myanmar under Cambodia chair

Uzbekistan poised to produce its own military drones

U.S., Russia Agree to Keep Negotiating to Defuse Ukraine Crisis

Mr. Blinken, after meeting his Russian counterpart, Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov, said that the U.S. would also submit its own security proposals and that the two sides planned to meet again. In Washington later, White House spokeswoman Jen Psaki indicated the U.S. wouldn't concede to the Kremlin's key demand that Ukraine be forbidden to join the NATO alliance.

Democrats Push to Revive \$250 Billion Tech Investment Bill to Counter China

#### Supreme Court Permits Continued Enforcement of Texas Six-Week Abortion Ban
