#### India

As summer sets in, military reviews situation on LAC

With the onset of summer amidst no signs of de-escalation in the 22 month old troop confrontation in eastern Ladakh, top Army and IAF commanders kicked off a comprehensive review of the operational situation, military preparedness and wargaming strategies along the northern borders with China.

Indian Navy's second P-8I squadron INAS 316 'Condors'

The Navy has commissioned its second P-8I aircraft squadron – Indian Naval Air Squadron 316. INAS 316 has been christened 'Condors' after one of the largest flying land birds with a massive wingspan.

Adani Vizhinjam port: Strategic boost to India's maritime credentials

The ₹7,525-crore deep-water, multipurpose, international seaport and container transhipment terminal at Vizhinjam, near Thiruvananthapuram — being constructed by Adani Vizhinjam Ports Pvt Ltd (AVPPL) — will go to entrench India's position in the maritime world.

#### Pakistan

Singapore-based Guvnor backs out from 4 LNG term deliveries

Singapore-based Guvnor has decided not to honour its contract to deliver four LNG term cargoes to Pakistan, which would force the dollar-starved country to purchase costly LNG from the spot market to fulfill its energy needs.

Rupee plunges after SBP reserves fall by \$2.9bn

April 1, 2022, Dawn

The rupee plunged to a historic low of Rs183.70 against the US dollar in the interbank market after the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) reported a massive outflow of \$2.9 billion.

#### Threatening letter came from US: PM Imran Khan

Prime Minister Imran Khan lifted the lid on the threatening letter and said it 'came from the US.' In his address to the nation at a time when he has lost majority in the National Assembly, Prime Minister Imran Khan started off with his political ideology and reason for his joining the political arena.

No truth to allegations: White House

The White House has strongly rejected PM Imran Khan's assertion of the US government's involvement in a plot to remove him. Responding to media questions regarding the issue, the White House spokesperson said, "there is absolutely no truth to the allegation."

Pakistan lodges protest with US over 'threatening memo'

Pakistan lodged a formal protest with the US over a threatening letter that warned of dire consequences if the opposition's no-confidence motion against Prime Minister Imran Khan failed.

Country faces power outages amid 3,000MW shortage

#### March 31, 2022, Dawn

Homes experienced nationwide power outages amid a power shortage of over 3,000 megawatts in Pakistan. Sources in the National Transmission and Despatch Company said K-2 and K-3 nuclear power plants near Jamshoro — with a generation capacity of 1,200 MW each — were suspended due to a fault in the plants, resulting in a power shortage of 2,400 MW in the country.

Ties with China termed cornerstone of Pakistan's foreign policy

Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi and Chinese State Councilor and Foreign Minister Wang Yi exchanged views on bilateral strategic, economic and security cooperation, Covid-19 pandemic, peace, stability and development in Afghanistan and regional and international issues of mutual interest. Mr Qureshi is visiting China to attend the third meeting of foreign ministers of Afghanistan's neighbouring countries. Mr Qureshi also held separate meetings with his Russian, Iranian and Afghan counterparts Sergey Lavrov, Dr Hossein Amir Abdollahian and Amir Khan Muttaqi.

#### Female seminary teacher killed by her students

#### March 30, 2022, Dawn

A woman teacher at a girls' seminary was killed after she was allegedly stabbed in the neck by three female students. The students accused of carrying out the fatal attack have been arrested. The assailants thought the slain teacher, Safoora Bibi, 21, had committed blasphemy, said Imtiaz Janjua, a spokesperson for the district police.

China agrees to fresh rollover of \$2.5bn commercial loans

March 31, 2022, Dawn

Out of the approximately \$21 billion in outstanding official loans, including commercial, bilateral and safe deposits, China has agreed in principle for granting a fresh rollover of \$2.5 billion in commercial loans to Pakistan for one year.

Six Pakistanis martyred as UN chopper shot down in DR Congo

Six Pakistani peacekeepers were martyred in the Democratic Republic of Congo when rebels shot down a United Nations helicopter. One Russian and one Serbian peacekeepers also died in the crash.

Islamabad needs to curtail imports, says Chinese envoy

China's Consul General Li Bijian said Pakistan should reduce imports from the largest Asian economy as the bilateral trade is highly skewed against Islamabad. At a ceremony to mark the beginning of the local assembling of Chinese home appliances brand Midea, Mr Li said the "heavy imbalance" in the bilateral trade is a "problem" that Islamabad should resolve through import substitution.

Saudi firm to help Pakistan assess Reko Diq gold, copper quantity

March 27, 2022, Dawn

Balochistan Chief Minister Mir Abdul Qudoos Bizenjo, while defending a recently signed agreement on the Reko Diq copper and gold mining project with a Canadian company, has disclosed that a Saudi Arabian firm would set up a refinery in Gwadar to assess the quantity of minerals extracted from the site.

CERN team reviewing Pakistan's associate membership

March 26, 2022, Dawn

A task force of the European Organisation for Nuclear Research (CERN) is reviewing to extend the associate membership of Pakistan for another five years. The task force comprising five experts is holding meetings with different entities in Pakistan to review the associate membership.

8 personnel martyred in Tank, South Waziristan clashes

March 31, 2022, Dawn

Eight security personnel, including an army captain, were martyred and seven terrorists were killed in clashes between security forces and members of the proscribed Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Tank district and adjacent South Waziristan tribal district.

#### Afghanistan

#### World Bank freezes Afghan projects

March 31, 2022, Dawn

The World Bank has put four projects in Afghanistan worth \$600 million on hold amid concerns over a decision by the Taliban regime to ban girls from returning to public high schools, the bank said.

Taliban bar govt employees without beards from work

March 29, 2022, Dawn

Afghanistan's Taliban has instructed all government employees to wear a beard and adhere to a dress code or risk being fired, three sources said, the latest of several new restrictions imposed by the hardline Islamist administration.

Afghan embassy, consulates in US shut their doors

March 27, 2022, Dawn

The Afghan embassy and their consulates in the United States have ceased operations and transferred custodial responsibility of their properties to the US State Department. Afghan diplomatic missions in the United States faced serious financial issues after the US government froze Afghan assets in the US banking system. The sanctions caused many diplomats and staff members to go unpaid for months.

Taliban 'block unaccompanied women from flights'

#### March 27, 2022, Dawn

Afghanistan's Taliban rulers refused to allow dozens of women to board several flights, including some overseas, because they were traveling without a male guardian, whereas dozens of girls demonstrated in the Afghan capital demanding the right to go to school.

#### UN donor conference falls billions short of \$4.4bn target to help Afghanistan

The world's donor drought, and growing global divisions over Afghanistan's political direction, have been laid bare when a UN appeal for \$4.4bn (£3.35bn) to help Afghanistan fell massively short, the second UN donor conference in a month to do so.

Taliban decides to ban international media from airing in Afghanistan

The Taliban-led government in Afghanistan has decided to ban the broadcasts of international media outlets being telecasted via local media. The BBC became the first to stop broadcasts night, reports Khaama Press. In a statement, the BBC has asked the Taliban to reverse its decision, saying it would affect more than six million viewers of Persian, Pashto and Uzbek language service programmes.

China holds multinational meetings to discuss Afghanistan

China is holding two multinational meetings in the ancient town of Tunxi to discuss the economic and humanitarian crisis facing Afghanistan, as Beijing makes a diplomatic push for the country's stability and development under the Taliban. Afghan acting foreign minister Amir Khan Muttaqi is attending the two-day meeting to be attended by foreign ministers of Afghanistan's immediate neighbours – Russia, Pakistan, Iran, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan.

#### Bangladesh

Bangladesh signs deal with Adani group for Indian Economic Zone

The Bangladesh Economic Zones Authority (BEZA) signed an agreement with the Indian company Adani Ports and SEZ Limited to set up an Indian Economic Zone at the Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Shilpa Nagar (BSMSN) in Mirsarai of Chattogram. The Indian Economic Zone will provide facilities for Indian investors in Bangladesh.

5 Bangladeshis, who strayed into India, sent back

#### Indian export to Bangladesh rises 64.5%

#### 67% approve of Kishida's handling of Ukraine war: Nikkei poll

Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida's cabinet drew support from 67% of respondents for its handling of the Ukraine war in the latest Nikkei-TV Tokyo survey. The cabinet's overall approval rating reached 61%, up 6 percentage points from the February poll and marking the first gain since December.

Kishida tells ministers to craft economic package as prices soar

Prime Minister Fumio Kishida on Tuesday instructed ministers to begin work on developing a new stimulus package by late April to soften the blow from rising energy, commodity and grain prices to households following Russia's invasion of Ukraine. The package is also aimed at helping Japan's economy recover from the COVID-19 pandemic and will focus on four areas -- higher crude oil prices, stable food supplies, funding support for small and midsized companies and assistance to people in need -- according to Kishida, who delivered his directive at a Cabinet meeting.

Japan aims to hold '2-plus-2' talks with Philippines, India in April

Japan is laying the groundwork for its first joint meeting of top diplomats and defense officials with the Philippines here next month, as well as its latest round of these "two-plus-two" talks with India, Nikkei has learned. Philippine Foreign Affairs Secretary Teodoro Locsin and National Defense Secretary Delfin Lorenzana would visit in early April for the meeting with Japanese counterparts Yoshimasa Hayashi and Nobuo Kishi.

#### Japan will not abandon Sakhalin-2 LNG stake, Kishida says

Japan will not abandon its stake in the Sakhalin-2 liquefied natural gas (LNG) project in Russia as it is essential to energy security, Prime Minister Fumio Kishida said on Thursday, his clearest comments yet on Tokyo's plans for the development. The Ukraine crisis has put Japan's involvement in the Sakhalin-2 project and similar ones in Russia in sharp focus since Western oil majors have said they would pull out in light of the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Russia calls its actions there a "special military operation."

U.S. and Japan to ask ASEAN to help avert next chip crisis

The U.S. and Japan will ask ASEAN nations to participate in a new supply chain framework designed to prevent the shortage of semiconductors and other strategic goods as they seek to reduce economic reliance on China, Nikkei has learned. Washington is set to come out this year with a new Indo-Pacific Economic Framework, which seeks to build a new economic sphere around trusted partners with shared values such as freedom and democracy. Details of the plan have yet to be released.

#### Korea

S.Korea, US approve directive to rewrite war plan, begin process in earnest

Seoul and Washington have agreed on a planning directive to develop a new operational war plan to address North Korea's mounting threats and a changing security environment, allowing their militaries to begin the process in earnest. Chairman of South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff Gen. Won In-choul and his US counterpart Gen. Mark Milley made the decision during their inperson bilateral meeting held on Wednesday afternoon (local time) at the US Indo-Pacific Command Headquarters, Camp H.M. Smith in Hawaii.

S.Korea test-fires first indigenous solid-fuel rocket, pushes to launch spy satellites

#### March 30, 2022, The Korea Herald

South Korea "successfully" test-launched a homegrown solid-fuel space rocket for the first time, taking one significant step to further develop and launch microsatellites for military surveillance and reconnaissance. The state-run Agency for Defense Development said it conducted the test-firing to "verify the performance" of the solid-propellant carrier rocket developed with indigenous technologies on Wednesday at its own testing site in Taean, South Chungcheong Province. South Korean Defense Minister Suh Wook and other senior military officials were present.

#### S. Korea, Bangladesh seek closer ties on ICT, infrastructure

#### April 1, 2022, The Korea Herald

Senior diplomats of South Korea and Bangladesh held policy consultations on strengthening cooperation in technology, infrastructure and other fields said Seoul's foreign ministry. First Vice Foreign Minister Choi Jong-kun met with his Bangladesh counterpart, Masud Bin Momen, in the Bangladesh capital of Dhaka on Thursday (local time) to discuss ways to expand substantive economic cooperation between the two nations, according to the ministry.

#### China's role complicates North Korean denuclearization process

#### April 1, 2022, The Korea Times

Pyongyang's series of provocations this year signal that addressing the neighbour to the North will be one of the greatest challenges for President-elect Yoon Suk-yeol, who has pledged to take a hardline stance toward the reclusive state compared to his predecessor, Moon Jae-in. Yoon is scheduled to take office in May and has outlined the direction of his administration's foreign policy — which is to strengthen Seoul's alliance with Washington, while relying less on Beijing. This would be a shift from Moon's policy towards China, given that South Korea depends largely on the Asian neighbour, not only for trade but also in regards to progress in relations with North Korea.

#### 55% expect Yoon to do good job: survey

#### April 1, 2022, The Korea Times

Fifty-five percent of South Koreans expect President-elect Yoon Suk-yeol to do a good job after taking office, a survey showed Friday. On the other hand, the Gallup Korea survey of 1,001 adults conducted between Tuesday and Thursday also showed that 41 percent do not expect Yoon to do well on state affairs. The survey had a margin of error of plus or minus 3.1 percentage points at the 95 percent confidence level.

#### Time to kick out Myanmar's junta from Asean: Jakarta Post

The paper says ASEAN leaders should have the courage to suspend Myanmar's membership until it fulfils its promises to put pressure on the nation's junta.

Indonesia backs Pakistan's ASEAN full dialogue partner status

Ambassador of Indonesia to Pakistan, Adam Mulawarman Tugio, on Saturday said that Indonesia fully supports Pakistan to obtain Full Dialogue Partner status with the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), which will provide huge economic opportunities for Pakistan with 623 million of potential trade market of the region.

With invite to Myanmar FM, BIMSTEC steps out of shadows, out of line with ASEAN

It is better to engage Myanmar rather than "isolate" the country, said Sri Lanka's Foreign Secretary Admiral Jayanath Colombage (retired), explaining Colombo's decision to invite Myanmar military administration's Foreign Minister to the fifth Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC) summit this week.

US, Japan to offer ASEAN countries new supply chain of semiconductors

The US and Japan will ask the members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) to join a new supply chain framework for semiconductors and other strategic components to prevent their shortage and reduce reliance on Chile.

Ukraine exposes ASEAN's credibility gap

Kazakh Court Rejects Opposition Figure's Appeal Against Pretrial Detention

Noted opposition figure Zhanbolat Mamai has been remanded in custody by a court in Kazakhstan on charges of insulting law enforcement officers and distributing "false information," accusations he and his supporters call politically motivated.

Kazakhstan braces for oil output drop amid CPC terminal trouble

Kazakhstan is poised to cut back oil production by around one-fifth in April while repairs are carried out on a loading terminal at a damaged Black Sea port in Russia. The Energy Ministry said on March 29 that daily oil output will be pegged back by 320,000 barrels, equivalent to around 50,000 tons.

Kazakhstan cools on eGov project with Russia

Kazakhstan is walking back a controversial agreement that would have given the Russian government direct access to the personal records of all Kazakh citizens.

Days After Publicly Supporting Ukraine's Sovereignty, Uzbek Foreign Minister Leaves Country With Illness

Two days after publicly supporting Ukraine's territorial integrity, Uzbek Foreign Minister Abdulaziz Komilov is reported to have fallen "ill" and is being treated abroad. The Foreign Ministry said that Komilov was being treated for an unspecified "chronic illness" in Tashkent, but was then taken to an unspecified foreign country for further treatment.

Turkmen Authorities Make Moves To Ensure Berdymukhammedov Cult Continues

Authorities in Turkmenistan are forcing private taxi drivers to have a portrait of recently elected President Serdar Berdymukhammedov in the windshields of their vehicles. Traffic police in the southeastern region of Mary told taxi drivers that the portrait requirement was just as mandatory as having a driver's license and car registration documents.

#### Tajiks rush to offload dollars

There is another currency panic happening in Tajikistan. This time, it is dollars that people are trying desperately to offload. Such is the volume of dollars flooding the market, that banks are declining to buy them, citing shortages of the national currency, the somoni.

HRW Calls On Kyrgyz Authorities To Stop 'Harassing' Independent Media

#### U.S. March Jobs Report Shows Strong Hiring Momentum

The U.S. labour market strengthened last month as the pandemic's grip receded and more workers jumped back into the labour force. Employers added 431,000 jobs in March, as restaurants, manufacturers and retailers snatched up workers, and hiring in January and February was stronger than previously reported, the Labour Department said Friday. The report marked the 11th straight month of job gains above 400,000, the longest such stretch of growth in records dating back to 1939.

U.S. Trade Chief Outlines Policy Shift, Citing Ukraine War and Pandemic

U.S. Trade Representative Katherine Tai said Wednesday that the U.S. must shift the focus of its trade policy to rebuilding its domestic manufacturing industries, and lessening ties to unfriendly economies. Sarah Palin to Run for Alaska House Seat in Bid to Re-Enter Politics

"As I've watched the far left destroy the country, I knew I had to step up and join the fight." She cited inflation, immigration and energy security as central issues in her campaign.
