

Political references ruffle military's feathers

In its quarterly report on Foreign Economic Assistance (FEA) for July-December 2021, the MEA said the total external loan inflows during the first half of the year amounted to \$8.972bn against loan outflows of \$4.2bn, thus making a net addition of \$4.772bn.

TTP extends truce to hold peace talks with Pakistan

"The ADB indicated the additional support of \$2.5 billion for the next fiscal year, from which \$1.5 billion to \$2 billion can be available in the ongoing calendar year", according to a statement issued by the Ministry of Finance.

However, local Taliban leaders in Panjshir refuted the claims, claiming that only three had been wounded.
